WHOLESALE TRADE<br>APRIL, 1953

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939=100) stood at 366.6 for April 1953 compered with 361.9 for April a year ago and 349.1 for March 1953.


## Seles Trends by Trades

Wholesale sales were only fractionally higher in April 1953 than in the same month last year, according to figures submitted by wholesalers in the nine trades covered in this survey. Sales of auto parts and equipment again recorded the greatest gain ( $14 \%$ ), followed by footwear with an increase of $11 \%$, drugs and hardware 5\%, dry goods 3\%, clothing and groceries less than $1 \%$. Wholesalers of fruits and vegetables recorded a decline in sales of $10 \%$ while wholessiers of tobacco and confectionery reported sales 58 lower than in April last year.

## Inyentories

Stocks held by wholesslers were 7 higher at the ond of April 1953 than at the same date last year. Substantial gains in month-end inventories were reported by wholesalers of tobacco and confectionery, dry goods, and auto parts and equipment, $24 \%$, $19 \%$ and $15 \%$ respectively. Smaller gains of $9 \%, 5 \%$, and $4 \%$ were reported by wholesalers of footwear, grocerles, and hardware. Stocks of clothing declined $9 \%$ from a year ago while stocks of fruits and vegetables were $7 \%$ lower and drugs $5 \%$.
