
WHOLESALE TRADE

Continen

AUGUST, 1953

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939=100)stood at 370.0 for August 1953 compared with 366.9 for August a year ago and 379.5 for July 1953.



Sales Trends by Trades

Wholesale sales continued fractionally higher in August 1953 than in the same month a year ago, according to figures submitted by wholesalers in the nine trades covered in this survey. All trades, with the exception of tobacco and confectionery and fruits and vegetables reported increased sales. Wholesalers of clothing reported sales 9% above August last year, sales of dry goods increased 4% while sales of both drugs and auto parts and equipment were 3% higher. Wholesalers of footwear and groceries reported fractional increases. Sales of tobacco and confectionery and fruits and vegetables declined 2% and 1% respectively.

Inventories

Stocks held by wholesalers were valued 4% higher at the end of August 1953 than at the same date last year. Month end inventories of clothing and dry goods increased 32% and 19% respectively. Stocks of footwear were 12% higher, inventories of auto parts and equipment and fruits and vegetables increased 9% and 8% respectively, while a smaller increase of 1% in stocks was reported by wholesalers of groceries and hardware. Tobacco and confectionery stocks declined 2%, while stocks of drugs were 3% lower than at the end of August 1952.
