## WHOLESALE TRADE

December, 1947
December Increase 13\%, Close to 12\% Increase for 1947/1946
December, 1947 sales of 365 wholesalers in nine lines of trade were $13 \%$ above the dollar volume of December, 1946 but dropped $15 \%$ from the November, 1947 volume. The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939=100) stood at 251. © for December, 1947, 222.2 for December, 1946 , and 295.0 for November, 1947. Total sales for the year 1947 exceeded the 1946 volume by $12 \%$ 。

According to regions, British Columbia with an increase of $18 \%$ and Ontaric with sales up $17 \%$ had the greatest gains in dollar volume of business when compared with December, 1946. Queboc sales were up $13 \%$; those in the Marjitimes, $10 \%$, and in the Prairie Provinces, $8 \%$.

Largest Gains in Wholesule Hardware--29\%, Automotive Equipment--20\%
Sales by hardware wholesalers were $29 \%$ higher than in December, 1946, a considerably larger increase than the $17 \%$ registered for the twelve months of 1947 corpared with 1946. Wholesalers of automotive equipment also reported a ereater increase in December sales compared with the same month of 1946 ( $20 \%$ ) than the increase recorded for the year 1947 compared with $1946(10 \%)$.

The dry goods and groceries trades, while reporting substantial increases in sales in December, 1947 over the same month of 1946 of $18 \%$ and $14 \%$ respectively, did not maintain the increase recorded in earlier months. The cumulative increase for the twelve months of 1947 over 1946 for dry poods amounted to $24 \%$, while that for groceries was $17 \%$.

Tobacco and confectionery, footwear, and drug wholesalers had December, 1947 sales ranging from $14 \%$ to $18 \%$ higher than December, 1946 . These increases exceeded by a considerable margin the gains for the year as a whole. Percentape increases for these trades in December compared with the same month a year ago, with the cumulative twelve-month percentage increases in brackets, are as follows tobacco and confectionery, $18 \%(7 \%)$; footwear, $17 \%(8 \%)$; and drugs, $14 \%(4 \%)$. Clothire wholesalers' sales were $13 \%$ in excess of those for Decernber, 1946 , while sales in the year 1947 were $10 \%$ higher than in 1946 .

## 12\% Decline in Fruit and Vemetable Sales in December

Fruits and vegetable dealers' sales, which have continued lower than in 1946 throuphout 1947 recording a drop of $6 \%$ for the year, were $12 \%$ lower in December, 1347 than in December a year aro. This is the greatest decrease refistered for any month of 1947 compared with corresponding month of 1946 .

December Inventories Show Smullest Gains in 1947
Stocks in the hands of wholesalers at December 31, 1947 were valued $20 \%$ higher than at the same date in 1946 . This gain is less than those recorded in all earlicr months of 1947. The drop in increases in value of stocks compared with 1946 was apparent in all trades with the exception of tobacco and confectionery where inventories at the end of December were valued $32 \%$ higher than at December 31,1946 . Stocks held by fruit and vepetable dealers were $10 \%$ below the value at the end of December a year ago. The dry goods and automotive equipment trades continued to record the largest increases in stocks on hand with gains of $45 \%$ and $38 \%$ respectively. Footwear wholesalers' stocks were up by $33 \%$ while other increases were as follows; hardware, $20 \%$; groceries, $16 \%$; clothing, $8 \%$; and drugs, $6 \%$.
