WHOLESALE TRADE
January, 1948
General Sales Index 3\% Above January, 1947
Dollar volume of wholesale sales in Canada during the month of January, 1948 was $3 \%$ in excess of the volume for January, 1947 and $2 \%$ below the December, 1947 level. This drop between December and January is a normal seasonal trend which has not been in evidence since January, 1944. Figures are based on returns from 374 wholesalers in nine lines of trade. The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939=100) stood at 245.5 for January, 1948, 237.7 for January, 1947, and 251.3 for December, 1947.

Considerable variation in trends existed between the various regions. British Columbia had the largest increase over the previous year with a gain of $16 \%$. Sales in Quebec and Ontario were up $7 \%$ and $3 \%$ respectively. Wholesalers in the Prairies roported sales $2 \%$ below January, 1947 , while a drop of $7 \%$ was registered in the Maritime Provinces.

Increases Smaller than in Previous Months
Only the drug trade, with sales up $11 \%$, reported an increase over january, 1947 larger than has occurred in preceding months. Tobacco and confectionery sales were up $6 \%$. The other three trades showing an increase, viz. dry goods, hardware, and groceries, recorded considerably smaller gains than have been experienced for some months. Dry goods wholesalers' sales were $14 \%$ above january, 1947 , hardware sales were up $13 \%$, while grocers registered an increase of only $2 \%$.

Sales Drop in Four Trados
Sales of wholesalers of clothing, automotive equipment, footwear, and fruits and vegetables were smaller in January, 1948 than in the same month last year. Decreases in these trades were as follows clothing. $6 \%$; automotive equipment, $7 \%$; footwear, $10 \%$; fruits and vegetables, $11 \%$.

Inventories Valued $19 \%$ Higher
Largest increases in value of inventories at january 31, 1948 compared with January 31,1947 were registered in the dry goods trade (42\%); clothing ( $38 \%$ ), automotive equipment ( $33 \%$ ), and hardware ( $26 \%$ ). Tobacco and confectionery and footwear wholesalers' stocks incressed $17 \%$ and $16 \%$ respectively, while lesser gains of $8 \%$ and $5 \%$ were recorded by grocery and drug wholesalers. Stocks of fruits and vegetables were valued $8 \%$ lower.
