## OCTOBER 1948

## General Sales Index Drops

Dollar soles of wholesalers in october fell 1\% below the volume for October, 1947 cns were 28 less than the September sales according to statements submitted by 375 wholesalers in nine lines of trade. Cumulative sales for the 10 months of 1948 were 46 in excess of the dollar sales for the corresponding period of 1947. The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 322.6 for October, 1948, 325.5 for October, 1047, and 327.6 for September, 1948.

The Prairie Provinces, with a gain of 8 over October, 1947, was the only region to record an increase in dollar sales. In Quebec, the volume of sales vas unchanged from a year ago while a decline of 24 was recorded for British Columbia, $6 \%$ for Ontario, end $7 \%$ for the Maritime Provines.

Three trades were respansible for the general sales index registering a decline. Sales of footwear wholesalers were $9 \%$ below last year's level, while grocery wholesalers' sales dropped below those for Octcber, 1947 by $10 \%$. Fruit and vegetable dealers' sales were $17 \%$ below last year's level.

On the other hand, sales of automotive equipment wholesalers rose $20 \%$ above October a year ago. reaching the highest lollar sales volume on record for any month. A gain of $15 \%$ over 1947 was registered by dry goods wholesalers, while increases of $9 \%, 6 \%$ and $5 \%$ occurred respectively in the hardware, clothing, and tobacco and confectionery trades. Drug wholesalers reported sales $2 \%$ above last October.

Stosks Valued I2" Above 1947

Stocks in the hancls of wholesalers at October 31, 1948 were valued $12 \%$ higher than at the same date last year, with 8 ix of the nine trades surveyed contributing to the gain. Grocery, hardware, tobacco and confectionery, and dry goods wholesalers reported substantial increases in value of inventories ranging between $16 \%$ anc 18\%. Automotivo equipment deslers inventories increased $7 \%$ in value and drug wholesalers., $4 \%$.

Footwear, clothing, and fruit and vegetable wholesalers, continuing the trend of the past several months, showed inventories valued below 1947 by $8 \%$, 20\% and $21 \%$ respectively.
