Small Margin of Increase Over February, 1947
Dollar sales of wholesalers in Canada during February, 1948 were $3.5 \%$ higher than in February, 1947 and 2\% below January, 1948, according to statements received from 397 wholesalers representing nine lines of trade. The peneral unadjusted index (on the base, querage for $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 239.5 for February, 1948, 231.4 for February, 1947, and 244.5 for Jenuary, 1948.

Quebec and British Columbia were the only provinces to register substantial increases. Slicht gaing of about $1 \%$ were registered in Onterio and the Maritime Provinces, while in the Prairie Provinces, doilar volume of wholesulers' sales dropped 1.5\% below February, 1947.

Dry Goods Tholesalers Show Greatest, Gain Over 1947
Largest increases in dollar sales over February, 1947, were recorded by the dry goods and drugs trades. Increases in these trades amounted to $17 \%$ and $14 \%$ respectively compared with gains over a year ago of $14 \%$ and $11 \%$ recorded in January. Sales of wholesalers of tobncco and confectionery and of hardware were $9 \%$ and $7 \%$ above the volume for February last year, while wholesale grocers' sales were practically unchanged in dollar volume.

Four Trades Continue Below 1947
As in January, dollar sales of four of the nine trades ware lower in Pebruary than in the corresponding month of 1947. Footwear wholesalers, with a drop of $10 \%$, and friits and vegetables dealers, with sales down $7 \%$, registered the largest percentage decrease in doller sales. Clothing wholesalers' sales were down $5 \%$, while the automotive equipment trade, which had registered a decline of $7 \%$ in January, reported sales in February only $1 \%$ below February a year ago.
3tocks Up 17\%
Stocks held by wholesalers at the end of February, 1948 were valued $17 \%$ hirgher than at the same date a year ago. All trades except fruits and vegetables and drues reported a smaller increase over last year than was recorded in Jamary when the overall gain was $19 \%$. Increases were reported as follows: dry goods, $35 \%$; automotive equipnent, $31 \%$; slothing, $29 \%$; hardware, $22 \%$; footwear, $22 \%$ tobacco and confectionery, $16 \%$; drugs, $8 \%$; and groceries, $4 \%$. Fruits and vegotable dealers' inventories were valued $4 \%$ lower than at the end of February, 1947.
