# WHOLESALE TRADE

Increase in Sales Over 1247 Steady at $3 \%$
Dollar volume of wholesale sales in Canada during March, 1948 was 3\& above that for March, 1947, and 10\% in excess of the volume recorded for February, 1948. These 11 cures are based on statements submitted by 399 wholesalers representing nine ines of trade. Cumulative sales for the first three months of 1948 were 36 higher than in the corresponding period a year ago. The generst unadjusted index (on the bee, average for 1935-1939m100) stood at 263.6 for March, 1948, 256.7 for March, 1947, and 240.0 for February, 1947.

With the exception of the Prairie Provinces, Increases in dollar sales in the various regions of the country were fairly uniform, ranging between 4.36 and 6.4\%. Sales in the Prairie Provinces were $5 \%$ below the dollar volume for March, 1947.

Tobacco and confectionery increase leads sales increases
Sales of tobacco and confectionery wholesalers, with a gain of $19 \%$, registered the largest increase in dollar volume of sales over March a year ago. This increase was partly a result of Easter falling in Karch this year. Drug wholesalers sales were 9\% in excess of those in liarch, 1947, with cumulative sales for the first quarter of 1948 being $11 \%$ higher than in the corresponding period last year.

Dollar volume in the wholesale clothing trade showed an increase over the same month a year ago for the first time in several months. Despite the March increase of $7 \%$ the cumulative sales for the year to date were $2 \%$ below last year's level.

Hardware and dry goods wholesalers, whose sales have been maintained at a fairly high volume compared with a yeur ago, reported a falling off of the marein of incrcase in March. Hardware wholesalerg' sales were $5 \%$ in excess of those in harch, 1947, bringing the cumulative increase for the year to date to $8 \%$. Sales of dry goods wholesalers showed practically no increase in volume compared with March a year ago, with sales for the year to date 10,6 above the volume for the first three months of 1947. Grocery wholesalers' sales were 4\% higher than in March last year compared with a cumlative gain for the year to date of $2 \%$.

March Sales in Several Trades below 1947 levels
Sales of pootwear, automotive equipment and fruits and vegetables wholesalers continued below last year's volume although in the first two trades, the trend varied accordint to regions. Sales of footwear wholesulers were down $16 \%$ in the Maritimes and Quebec combined and up $13 \%$ in Ontario and the western Provinces combined, bringine the Canada sales to less than one per cent below last year's volume. Wholesalers of automotive equipment in Canadu had sales $7 \%$ below March, 1947. Ontario registered a gain of $12 \%$, while a decrease of $8 \%$ was recorded for the Naritimes and quebec combined and a drop of $19 \%$ for the Western Frovinces. Dealers in fruits and vegetables continued to report sales well below the 1947 level, with a decrease in March of $14 \%$. A drop in sules for this trede was recorded in all regions.

Inventories penerally above March, 1947
Wholesalers' inventories generally were valued substantially higher at the end of march, 1948 than at the same date a year ago averaging an increase of 14,0 for the nine trades included in the survey. Increases in value of stocks held by wholesalers of automotive equipment dry goods, hardware and clothing ranged between $25 \%$ and $19 \%$. An increase of $13 \%$ was reported by wholesalers of tobacco and confectionery, footwear, and drugs, while grocers registered a enin of only $1 \%$. Stocks held by wholesalers of fruits and vegetables were $13 \%$ lower in dollar value than those on hand at the same date last year.
