## Gain Over 1947 Greater in August

Dollar sales of wholesalers in August, 1948 were $9 \%$ in excess of the ales volume in August, 1947 and $5 \%$ higher than the July, 1948 figure according to statements submitted by 378 wholesalers representing nine ines of trade. The August gain was greater than that for the year to date, bales for the first eight months of 1948 being $4 \%$ higher than sales in the corresponding period of 1947. The general unadjusted Index (on the base, average for 1935-1939 = 100) stood at 296.7 for August, $1948,272.2$ for August, 1947 , and 283.5 for July, 1945.

All regions recorded increases in wholesalers' ales over August, 1947. Sales $1 n$ British Columbia were up 13\%, fallowed by the Maritime Province with a gain of $12 \%$. Ontario wholesalers reported an increase of $10 \%$ while those in the Prairie Provinces and Quebec recorded gains of of and $5 \%$ respectively.

Sales Up in Dry Goods and Apnarel Trades
Increases in sales of all trades except tobacco and confectionery in August, 1948 compared with huguist, 1947 exceeded the gains recorded for the year to date over the corresponding period of last year. Sales of wholesalers of dry goods, footwear and clothing recovered from the July slurn to register increases of $18,0,9,2$ and 3,6 respectively over August last year. The substantial increases over July in these trades follow the normal seasonal patterns for this powies.

Grocer's' sales were $17 \%$ int oxadss of those in fugunt a year ago, the greatest gain regtstered over last year in any month to date, while increases of 15,0 and 14,0 were reported by wholesulers of drugs and hardware. Sales of tobacco and confoctioncry wholesalers were $12 \%$ in excess of the August, 1947 volume although 10, below July, 1918.

Two Trades Show Dron in Salos
A slicht drop of less than one per cent was reported for aumust this yoar compared with last by wholesalers of automotive equirment. Fruit and vegetable dealers' sales continued 18; below the 1947 level.

Stocks Up 12, Over 1947
Stocks in the hands of wholesalers in the nine lines of trade covered by this survey were valued $12 \%$ higher at the end of August this year than at the same date a year ago but were $2 \%$ lower than at July 3lst this year.

Wholesalers of tobacco and confectionery, dry goods, and hardware again registered the largest increases in value of inventories compared with a year ago. Value of stocks of drug, automotive equipment and grocery wholesalers also showed increases ranging between $8 \%$ and $11 \%$, Footwear wholesalers' inventories were valued 9,6 below last year, while decreases of $22 \%$ and $25 \%$ respectively were reported by clothing and fruit and vegetable wholesalers.
