## PERCENTAGE CHANGES IN SALES AND INVENTORIES

 OCTOBER 1949

The largest percentage increase in dollar sales over October, 1948, was reported by fruit and vegetable wholesalers whose sales in October this year were $7 \%$ higher than in the same month last year. Automotive equipment and hardware wholesalers' sales were $4 \%$ in excess of October a year ago while tobacco and confectionery wholesalers and drug wholesalers reported gains of $2 \%$ and $1 \%$ respectively.

October gains over last year were generally lower than the gains for the year to date compared with the corresponding poriod of 1948.

Dry Goods and Apparel and Grocery Sales Drop
Declines from 1948 were again reported for the three dry goods and apparel trades. Sales of clothing wholesalers were down $4 \%$, footwear wholesalers' sales, $5 \%$, while a drop of $11 \%$ was recorded in the dollar seles volume of dry goods viholesalers. Wholesale grocert' sales were $6 \%$ below the October, 1948, volume.

5\% Increase in Value of Stocks
Wholesalers inventories in the nine trades included in this survey were valued $5 \%$ higher in dollax volume at October 31, 1949, than the inventories at the same date in 1948 and $1 \%$ above the value at September 30, 1949.

Substantial increases of $17 \%$ and $12 \%$ ware recorded in value of stocks on hand by automotive equipment wholesalers and hardware wholesalers respectively. Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers' stocks showed an increase of $11 \%$ in value while dry goods, drug, and footwear wholesalers reported gains of $8 \%, 5 \%$, and $1 \%$ respectively. Clothing wholesalers' stocks registered no change in value from the corresponding date in 1948.

Declines in value of stocks on hand were recorded in the food trades. A decrease of $4 \%$ in value of stocks on hand was reported by fruit and vegetable dealers while orocery wholesalers reported an $8 \%$ drop in value of inventory compared with a year ago.

Stock-Sales Ratio in the Grooery Irade
Stocks held by wholesalers at tha beginning of October are normally $17 \%$ in excess of sales for that month (based on the average for 1936 - 1942). Stocks at the beginning of October this year were valued $2 \%$ higher than sales in that month.
