
Wholesale Sales 1% Above Last Year

Wholesale sales in July, 1949 were 1% above the volume for July, 1948 and 8% below June, 1949 according to statements submitted by 364 wholesalers representing nine lines of trade. Cumulative sales for the first seven months of 1949 were 4% in excess of sales in the corresponding period of 1948. The general unadjusted index (on the base, average for 1935-1939=100) stood at 285.2 for July, 1949, 283.5 for July, 1948, and 310.6 for June, 1949.

Only two of the five regions of the country showed increases in the composite sales for the nine trades. In the Prairie Provinces, a gain of 4% was recorded, while sales in Ontario were 2% above July, 1948. A decrease of 4% was registered for British Columbia and 7% for the Maritime Provinces, with Quebec sales remaining practically unchanged from July last year.

Only 4 of 9 Trades Show Increases in Sales

Fruit and vegetable wholesalers, with sales 21% higher than in July, 1948, was the only trade to register a marked increase in dollar volume of sales over July a year ago. Lesser gains of 5%, 4%, and 3% were reported by hardware, drug, and automotive equipment wholesalers respectively.

Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers' sales were 2% lower than in July, 1948, while wholesalers of groceries showed a decline of 4% in dollar sales. The dry goods and clothing trades again reported sales considerably below the July, 1948 level. Footwear wholesalers' sales were down 15%; clothing wholesalers', 16%; while wholesalers of dry goods recorded a drop of 1.9%.

Stocks on hand up 8%

The value of stocks on hand reported by the nine lines of trade at the end of July, 1949 was 8% above the value at the corresponding date in 1948. Automotive equipment and hardware wholesalers reported the largest increases in value of stocks on hand at 13% and 12% respectively. Tobacco and confectionery, dry goods, drug, and grocery wholesalers reported increases of between 7% and 4%, while the value of stocks held by clothing and fruit and vegetable dealers was practically unchanged from the value at July 31, 1948. Footwear wholesalers showed inventories valued 5% lower than last year.

Stock-Sales Ratio in the Wholesale Grocery Trade

Stocks held by wholesale grocers at the beginning of July are normally 7% in excess of the sales for that month (based on the average for the years 1936-1942). Stocks in the hands of wholesale grocers at the beginning of July, 1949 were valued 9% lower than the sales for that month, whereas at the same date last year, stocks on hand were 20% lower than the sales volume for July.
