# WHOLESALE TRADE SEPTEMBER 1949 

Small Gain in September Over A Year Ago
Wholesslers' sales in September, 1949 were 2\% higher in dollar volume than in September a year ago and 5\% In excess of the August, 1949 volume according to statementa submitted by 371 wholesslers representing alne ilnes of trade. Cumulative sales for the nine montha of 1949 were $4 \%$ above the dollar aales in the corresponding period of 1948 . The unad justed Index (on the base, average for $1935-1939=100$ ) stond at 333. ? for September, 1949, 327.D for September, 1948, and 318.1 for Auguat, 1949.

The Pralrie Provinces, with an increase of 5\%, showed the largest percentace gain over 1948. Sales of wholesalers in Ontario wer up 3\% and in the Maritime Provinces, 1\%. Decreases of $1 \%$ and $3 \%$ were regietered for Quebec and British Columbia respectively.

Only 2 Trades Show Significant Gains
Drug wholesalers, with an increase of $10 \%$ in sales, and hardware wholesalers, with an increase of $8 \%$, wore the only two trades to rogister any marked improvenent in तुollar volume of business over September, 1948. Sales of \&utomotive equipment wholesalers registered the smallest gain over 1948 of any month this yoar at $1 \%^{4}$.

Tobacco and confectionery wholesalers' sales were up $3 \%$ from September a year ago and grocery wholesalers reported a gain of $1 \%$. The other food trade included in the survey, fruits and vegetablas, registered a decrease of $3 \%$ in dollar volume of sales in September this year compared with last. This is the first month in 1949 that fruit and vegetable dealers' sales have dropped bolow the corresponding-month sales for 1948.

Footwear sales were unchanged from the Soptember, 1948, level. while decreases were recorded in the dry goods and clothing trades. Sales of dry goods wholesalers were down $3 \%$ from September, 1948, while a decrease of $4 \%$ was reported by clothing wholesalers.

Stocks Valued 6\% above September, 1948
Wholesalers' inventories at the end of September, 1949, were valued $6 \%$ higher than stocks on hand at the end of the same month in 1948, and were virtually unchanged in value from August $31,1949$.

Only three of the nine trades recorded inventories lower in dollar value than at September 30,1948. Fruit and vegetable dealers reported a decrease of $11 \%$ in value of stocks on hand, clothing wholesalers' stocks were down $9 \%$, while stocks of grocery wholesalers were valued $4 \%$ lower than at the corresponding date last year.

Increases ranging from $4 \%$ to $13 \%$ were experienced in the remaining six trades, with hardware and automotive equipment whole= salors' stooks shoving the sieatest imotewement at $11 \%$ and $13 \%$ respectively over Soptember $30,1348$.

Stocks-Sales Ratio in the Grocery Trade
Stocks held by wholesal ers at the beginning of September are normally $10 \%$ in excess of sales for that month (based on the average for 1936-1942). Stocks at the beginning of September this year were valued $14 \%$ lower than sales for that month.
