Denertne The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 2935-1939-100) stood at 385.3 for November 1954 compared with 361.7 for November a year ago and 387.7 for October 1954.

## Sales Irends by Trades

Wholesale sales in November for the nine trades covered by this report were $0.6 \%$ below sales for the previous month but $6.9 \%$ above November of 1953. Of the nine trades, only two showed decreases in comparison with the corresponding perioc of the previous year, footwear wholesslers reported a sales declino of $2.6 \%$ and hardware wholesalers a drop of $1.1 \%$. Increases for the other groups ranged from $1.6 \%$ for dry goods wholesalers to 10.8\% for grocery wholesalers.

## Inventories

Dollar value of inventory holdings for the nine wholesale trades at the end of November 1954 was approximately the same as in the corresponding month of the previous year and $1.4 \%$ below the level of the previous month. Only three of the nine trades reported increased in comparison with the previous year; the dollar value of inventories of grocery wholesalers was up by $13.0 \%$, of trbacco and confectionery wholesalers $3.9 \%$ and drug wholesalers $1.2 \%$. Decreases in the value of inventories for the remaining six trades ranged from 1. $7 \%$ for auto parts and equipment wholesalers to $17.1 \%$ for footwear wholesalers.
