## WHOLESALE TRADE

## DECEMBER 1954

Ch Denutic rosulis shown in this report are based on returns from Zer wholesulers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and arc not adjusted for changes in wholesule prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939=100) stood at 358.6 for December 1954 comm pared with $3 / 3.3$ for Docember a year ago and 385.8 for November $1054^{\circ}$

## Sales Trends by Trades

In December 1954, wholesale sales for the ninc trades covered by this renort wera 7.I\% below sales for the previous nonth but $4.9 \%$ above December of 1953. While siz: of the nine trades revorted cecroasos comparod with the previous month, efght trades showed increases when compared with the corresponding month of the previous year. Two trades, footwear wholesulers and auto parts and equipment wholesalers, showed increases in excess of $10 \%$ winile tobacco and confectionery wholesalers roported a decrease of $0.7 \%$.

## Inventorfes

Dollar value of inventory holdins for the nine wholesale trades at the end of December 1954 was approxinately the same as for the corresponding month of the previous year and 5. o bolow the provious month of the current year. In the comparison with the previous year, sive of the trades reported increases in dollar value of inventory holding and four rades reported decreases. Increases of $11.8 \%$ and $8.1 \%$ respectively were reported by erocery wholesalers and drug wholesalers while a decrease of $19.7 \%$ was recorded for footwear wholesalers. Decreases of $7.1 \%$ for dry goods wholesalers and $5.5 \%$ for hardware wholesalers were also reported.
