## WHOLESALE TRADE

## FEBRUARY 1954

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939 = 100) stood at 312.4 for February 1954 compared with 304.5 for February a year ago and 294.1 for Jamary 1954.

## Salos Trends by Trades

Wholesalers, in the nine trades covered in this survey, reported a $2 \%$ increase in sales in February 1954 compared with February last year. Grocery wholesalers reधistered an increase of $10 \%$ in sales; tobacco and confoctionery sales were $6 \%$ higher while those for footwear rose $3 \%$. Wholesalers of auto parts and eçuinment, clothing and druts all reported sales l\% hicher than in February 1953. Decreased sales of $15 \%$ were recorded by wholesalers of dry goods while sales of hardware and fruits and vegetables declined $7 \%$ and $2 \%$ respectively.

## Inventories

The value of stocks held by wholesalers at the ond of lebruary 1954 showed a $3 \%$ increasc over the same period a year ago. Substantial increases in inventories of $42 \%$ and $26 \%$ were reported by wholesalers of footwear and tobacco respectively. Increases ranging from $9 \%$ to less than $1 \%$ were recorded for groceries, clothing, auto parts and equipment and drugs. Stocks of dry goods dropped $5 \%$, hardware $2 \%$ and fruits and vegetables 1\%。
