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## wholesale trade

## MARCH 1954

The results shown in this report are besed on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of $1935-1939=100$ ) stood at 352.5 for March 1954 com pared with 349.0 for March a year ago and 312.8 for rebruary 1954 .

## Sales Trends by Trades

Although 6 of the 9 trades covered in this survey showed decreased sales in March 1954 compared with the same month a year ago, the overall sales in the nine trades were up $2 \%$. This gain was due in great part to an $8 \%$ increase in sales of groceries. Wholesalers of smuits and vegetables and drugs reported sales slightly over $1 \%$ higher. Sales of dry goods dropped $9 \%$ in Merch while sales of tobacco and confectionery declined 5\%. Wholesalers of both auto parts and equipment and footwear reported a $4 \%$ drop in sales; clothing and hardware Wholesalers reported sales 1\% lower than in March last year.

## Inventories

The value of stocks held by wholesalers at the end of March 1954 showed a very slight decline from the same period a year ago. While stocks of dry goods, hardware and iruits and vegetables declined $12 \%, 4 \%$ and $2 \%$ respectively, all other trades covered in this survey reported increased inventories ranging from $1 \%$ to 33\%.
