


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

WHOLESALE TRADE
JUNE 1954

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935 - 1939 = 100) stood at 391.3 for June 1954 compared with 379.8 for June a year ago and 370.9 for May 1954.

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Sales Trends by Trades

June sales of wholesalers covered by this report registered a gain of almost 4% over the same month of 1953. This follows a decline in sales of May 1954 over last year. Sales of five of the nine trades showed declines ranging from 7% for footwear wholesalers to 1% for automotive parts and equipment wholesalers. Groceries reported the largest increase, at 9%, while fruits and vegetables and drugs showed a 6% gain.

Inventories

The value of stocks on hand decreased nominally at the end of June compared with the same date of 1953. The apparel trades recorded the sharpest declines, footwear 16%, dry goods 13% and clothing 10%. Wholesalers of groceries and tobacco and confectionery reported inventory gains of 9% and 10% respectively. Other trades showed lesser inventory changes, ranging between a decline of 2% to a gain of 4%.
