## WHOLESALE TRADE AUGUST 1954

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935-1939-100) stood at 378.8 for August 1954 compared with 368.8 for August a year ago and 371.1 for July 1954.

## Sales Trends by Trades

In August, 1954, sales of wholesalers covered by this report were almost $3 \%$ over the same month of 1953 and $2 \%$ above July 1954. In comparison with the previous year six of the nine trades reported increases which ranged from 6.5\% for drue wholesalers and $4.9 \%$ for grocery wholesalers to $1.5 \%$ for tobacco and confectionery wholesalers and $1.3 \%$ for hardware wholesalers. Decreases were shown by three trades, the larcest being a reduction of $11.9 \%$ for clothing wholesalers followed by dry goods wholesalers with $7.2 \%$ and footwear wholesalers with 3.5\%。

## Inventories

There was a decrease of slightly over $1 \%$ in the value of stocks on hand at the end of August 1954 compared with the corresponding month of the previous year. Three wholesale trades reported large decreases in the value of stocks on hand; footwear wholesalers $17.7 \%$, clothing wholesalers $14.2 \%$ and dry coods wholesalers $11.6 \%$. Two small decreases were reported, one of $2.3 \%$ for hardware wholesalers and the other amounting to $1.6 \%$ for auto parts and equipment wholesalers. Of the four trades roporting increases, the largest involved fruft and vegetable wholesalers with $24.3 \%$, followed by tobacco and confectionery wholesalers with $11.3 \%$, grocery wholesalers with $6.5 \%$ and drug wholesalers $4.4 \%$.
