## WHOLESALE TRADE

The results shown in this report are based on returns from De 400 hfolesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends "ncollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadfusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the bese of 1935-1939 = 100) stood at 322.9 for February 1955 compared with 312.8 for Pebruary a year ago and 305.3 for Jamary 1955.

In February 1955 wholesale sales for the nine trades covered by this report showed an increase of $3 \%$ over the corresponding month of 1954 and an increase of $5.8 \%$ over January 1955. All of the nine trades reported an increase in comparison with the corresponding month of the previous year with the exception of dry goods wholesalers who reported a decrease of $3.7 \%$. The increases ranged from more than $7 \%$ for footwear wholesalers to less than $2 \%$ for clothing wholesalers.

## Inventories

For the nine wholesale trades as a whole in February 1955 there was a drop of 3.46 in the dollar value of inventory holdings in camparison with the corresponding month of the previous year. Large declines were reported for footwear wholesalers with a reduction of $15.4 \%$, hardware wholesalers $11.7 \%$ and dry goods wholesalers 6.2\%. Increases in the value of inventory holdings were reported by six trades ranging from clothing wholesalers with less than 2\% to tobacco and confectionery wholesalers with an increase of nearly $10 \%$.
