

# WHOLESALE TRADE

## MARCH 1955

The results shown in this report are based on returns from 400 wholesalers distributed over nine trades. They reflect trends in dollar volume of business and are not adjusted for changes in wholesale prices.

The unadjusted index for the total of the nine trades (on the base of 1935 - 1939 = 100) stood at 366.0 for March 1955 compared with 357.6 for March a year ago and 324.6 for February 1955.

### Sales Trends by Trades

March sales of the nine wholesale trades covered in this report showed a very nominal increase of 2% over March a year ago. Five of the nine trades reported increases over March 1954 while decreases occurred in the clothing, dry goods, footwear and hardware trades. Increases in sales ranged from 7.2% for drug wholesalers to 2.8% for tobacco and confectionery wholesalers. The greatest decrease in sales occurred in the clothing trade (-8.6%).

#### Inventories

The pattern of increased or decreased sales held true for inventories with the same five trades showing increases ranging from 13.8% for fruit and vegetable wholesalers to 0.3% for auto parts and equipment wholesalers. Footwear wholesalers recorded the greatest decrease in inventories with a drop of 12% from the same date in 1954. The total of the nine trades showed an over-all drop in inventories of approximately 2% at the end of March as compared with the same date last year.
