## March, 1960

Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of March were estimated at $\$ 765,474,000$, an increase of $8.4 \%$ from sales of $\$ 706,102,000$ reported for the same month in 1959. These sales cover "wholesalers proper" and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.

Thirteen of the 17 specified trade groups recorded increases ranging from $17.7 \%$ for commercial, institutional and service equipment and supplies to $0.6 \%$ for farm machinery. Decreases were largest for construction materials and supplies, including lumber ( $6.1 \%$ ) and smallest for automotive parts and accessories (1.7\%). The "all other trades" group reported an increase of $13.4 \%$. Sales for the first three months of the year increased by $7.4 \%$ to $\$ 2,062,290,000$ with 4 of the specified trades showing declines ranging from $2.9 \%$ for both meat and dairy products and construction materials and supplies, including lumber to $2.1 \%$ for automotive parts and accessories.
