WHOLESALE TRADE

Apri1, 1960
Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of April were estimated at $\$ 695,954,000$, a decrease of $2.5 \%$ from sales of $\$ 713,849,000$ for the same month ia 1959. These sales cover wholesalers proper and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.

Six of the 17 specified trade groups recorded increases ranging from 8.9\% for household electrical appliances to $1.6 \%$ for groceries and food specialcies. Twice as many (11) of the trades reported reduced sales ranging from $15.2 \%$ for construction materials and suppliesincluding lumber to $0.1 \%$ for other textile a.ad clothing accessories. The "all other trades" group also registered a decrease of 2. $0 \%$. However, sales for the first four months of the year increased by $4.7 \%$ to $\$ 2,758,244,000$ with six of the specified trades showing declines ranging from 6. $5 \%$ for construction materials and supplies including lumber to $0.9 \%$ for coal and coke.
