Sales of Canadian wholesalers, valued at $\$ 570,173,000$ for the month of Jamary were $7.1 \%$ lower than the sales of $\$ 13,989,000$ estimated for the same month in 1960. These sales cover wholesalers prover and do not include the business transactions of Thanulactuxers' sales branches or accents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price haters, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.

January sales were larger than a year earlier for 11 of the 17 specified trade roup covered in this report. Increases ranged from $3 . \%$ for household electrical appliances to $1 . \%$ for groceries and food products. Decreases ranged from $16.2 \%$ for coal and coke to 1.3 " for automotive parts and accessories. The "all other trades" group showed a decrease of $2405 \%$.
