## WHOLESALE TRADE

 trade for May, 1961; also revisions of wholesale trade annual estimates for the years following 1951, the year of the last census of wholesale establishments, and revised monthly estimates from January 1960 to date. For reference purposes, the adjusted data of the 1951 census are also shown. These sales estimates cover the transactions of "wholesalers proper" and do not include those o. "aquacturers" sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of days in the respective months.For May, 1961, sales of wholesalers were estimated at $\$ 852,659,000$ compared with $\$ 829,340,000$ Eu we same month in 1960 , an increase of $2.8 \%$ (see page 7 ). Increases cccurreu in =loren trades ranging from $24.6 \%$ in the case of household alectrical appliances to $2.0 \%$ in the case of fresh fruits and vegetables. Decreases occurred in six trades ranging from $9.6 \%$ in the case of industrial and transportacion equipment and supplies to $0.4 \%$ in the case of other textile and clothing accessories. The residual category showed a small increase. The cumulative figures for January to May, 1961, indicate there has been a decrease in business volume of $3.8 \%$ when a comparison is made with the same period of 1960 .

A special note regarding the revised estimates for 1958 and 1959 (page 3) is necessary. The Daily Bulletin of June 27 th, 1961, in a preliminary release of wholesale trade statistics for 1958 and 1959 , reports sales for 1958 amounting to - $\$ 8,259,463,000$ and for 1959 amounting to $\$ 9,129,460,000$. This report is the result of special comprehensive surveys of wholesale trade proper carried out during 1959 and 1960. To the 1958 figure of $\$ 8,259,463,000$ should be added $\$ 83,700,000$ as an estimate of the business of firms without employees not covered in the comprehensive survey. The amount of $\$ 437,500,000$ should be deducted as an adjustment for businesses covered by the comprehensive survey but not by the regular monthly survey. The trades concerned are included in the "all other trades" category of the monthly survey. To the 1959 figure of $\$ 9,199450,000$ snould be added $\$ 90,100,000$ as an estimate of the business of firms without $=z_{5} 10 y o n s$ and $\$ 24,001$ ), 000 as an estimate of the bisines, of new firms coming into existence during 155\%. The amount of $\$ 491,000,000$ should be deducted as an adjustment for businesses covered by the comprehensive survey but not by the regular monthly survey. As for the 1958 survey the trades concerned are incluiec in the "Ell officer trades" category. When these adjustments are taken account of the results of the 1958 and 1959 comprehensive surveys reconcile with the estimates punished in the present issue of the monthly publication. When comparing the estimates of the three food trades (fresh fruits and vegetables, groceries and food specialties, meat ind defy products) contained in the present issue with the detailed results of tie omprehensive surveys to be released later, the aggregate should be used. The classification procedure followed during the 1951 census survey permitted a bias towards the groceries and food specialties trade. In the comperehensive surveys of 2259 and 1959 this bias has been removed.
