

Sales of Canadian wholesalers during the month of April are estimated at "865,665,000 as compared with $\$ 809,555,000$ for the samo month of 1962 , an increase of $6.9 \%$. These sales cover "Wholesalers proper" and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.

All but one of the eíchteen specified trades indicated increased volume of business. Increases ranged from $14.8 \%$ for Newsprint, Paper and Faper Iroducta to $1.9 \%$ for Tobacco, Confectionery and Soft Drinks. A decrease of $3.6 \%$ is indicated for lousehold Flectric Appliances. The All Other Trades croup showed an increase of $10.2 \%$.

For the four months ending April, sales are estimated at $33,246,423,000$, an increase of $4.6 \%$ when conpared with the same period of 1962. Fifteen trades showed increases in busilless. These increases ranged from 8.7 for Industrial and Transportation Equipment and Supplies to $0.6 \%$ for Cther Construction Kiaterials and Supplies, includine Lumber. The remaining trades indicated decreases of $3.9 \%$ for Clothing and Furnishings, $2.2 \%$ for Meat and Dairy Froducts and 1.5\% for Tobacco, Confectionery and Soft Drinks. The All Other Trades group showed an increase of $8.7 \%$ for the first four months.
