Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of February are estimated at $\$ 922,611,000$, an increase of $5.4 \%$ over the same month of 1964. These sales are those of wholesalers proper and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.

February sales were larger in thirteen of the eighteen specified trade groups. Increases ranged from $13.8 \%$ in Meat and Dairy Products to $2.4 \%$ in Clothing and Furnishings. Decreases in the five remaining trades ranged from $9.2 \%$ in Hardware to $1.5 \%$ in Other Textile and Clothing Accessories. The "All Cther Trades" group showed an increase of 7.6\%.

For the first two months of the year, sales are estimated at $\$ 1,792,947,000$, an increase of $3.8 \%$ over the same period in 1964. Twelve of the specified trades reported increases ranging from $10.9 \%$ for Meat and Dairy Products to 3.48 for Coal and Coke; while the other six showed decreases ranging from $9.5 \%$ for Hardware to $0.7 \%$ for Clothing and Fumishings. The "All Other Trades" group showed an increase of $4.8 \%$.
