## WHOLeSALE TRADE

May 1966

Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of May 1966 are estimated at $\$ 1,159,694,000$, an increase of $3.9 \%$ over the same month in 1965. These sales are those of wholesalers proper and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations or number of business days in the respective months.
$M_{a}$ sales were greater in sixteen of the etghtoon specified trades. Thereases ranged from $2.7 \%$ in Uther Construction Materials and Supplies, including Lumber to $21.9 \%$ in Fam Machinery. Decreases recorded were $2.9 \%$ in Fresh Fruits and Vegetables and 9.20 in Clothing and Furnishings. The "All Other Trades" group showed a decrease of 4.5.b.

For the first five months of the year, sales are estimated at $\$ 5,359,160,000$, an increase of 7.3 , over the same period in 1965. Seventeen of the specified trades showed increases, ranging from $0.2 \%$ in Fresh Fruits and Vegetables to $25.7 \%$ in Farm Machinery. The remaining trade, Coal and Coke, showed a decrease of $13.3 \%$. Sales of the "All Other Trades" group decreased $0.8 \%$ 。
