Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of February 1968 are estimated at $\$ 1,020,426,000$, an increase of $2.7 \%$ over the same month in 1967. These sales are those of wholesalers proper and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations, or number of business days in the respective months.

February sales were greater in fifteen of the eighteen specified trades. Incieases ranged fron $0.7 \%$ in Hardware to $18.0 \%$ in Commercial, institutional and service equipment and supplies. Decreases in the remaining three trades ranged from 2.18 in Automotive parts and accessories to $8.9 \%$ in Coal and coke. Sales in the "All other trades" group declined by $9.2 \%$.

For the first two months of 1968 , sales are estimated at $\$ 2,116,407,000$, an increase of $7.4 \%$ over the same period in 1967. There were increases in sixteen of the eighteen specified trades, ranging from $1.3 \%$ in Electrical wiring supplies, construction materials, apparatus and equipment to $17.7 \%$ in Fresh fruits and vegetables. Sales of the other two trades, Farm machinery and coal and coke, declined by 2.28 and $3.2 \%$ respectively. Sales of the "All other trades" group increased by 6.1\%.
