## WHOLEUALL TRADE

June 1968

Sales of Canadian wholesalers for the month of June 1968 are estimated at $\$ 1,255,317,000$, an increase of $1.5 \%$ over the same month in 1967. These sales are those of wholesalers proper and do not include the business transactions of manufacturers' sales branches or agents and brokers. They are not adjusted for price changes, seasonal variations, or number of business days in the respective months.

June sales were greater in nine of the eighteen specified trades. Increases rarged from $1.1 \%$ in Fresh fruits and vegetables to $10.0 \%$ in Automotive parts and accessories. Decreases in the remaining nine trades ranged from 2. $7_{\%}^{\%}$ in Industrial and transportation equipment and supplies to 28.18 in Farm machinery. Sales in the "All other trades" group increased by $4.4 \%$.

For the first six months of 1968 , sales are estimated at $\$ 7,088,882,000$, an increase of $3.9 \%$ over the same period in 1967. There were increases in eleven of the eighteen specified trades, ranging from 0.46 in Electrical wiring supplies, construction materials, apparatus and equipment to 13.1\% in Fresh fruits and vegetables. Decreases in six trades ranged from $0.1,3$ in Clothing and furnishings to $22.0 \%$ in Farm machinery. The remaining specified trade, Other textile and clothing accessories, was virtually unchanged from last year. Sales of the "All other trades" group increased by 3.3 启.
