DYEING, CLEANING AND LAUNDRY WORK

Ottawa, December 1931.- A report on laundry and dyeing industries in Canada for the calendar year 1930 is herewith presented. To permit of a closer analysis of the processes involved, the report has been divided into 3 sections comprising (1) Laundries (2) Dyeing and cleaning of garments and (3) Dyeing and finishing of textiles. A comparative summary of the industry as a whole is given by provinces for the five year period 1926 to 1930. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of 13 in the number of establishments, an expansion in the capitalization amounting to \$1,511,460, the total employees showed an increase of 26, whilst an additional \$193,211 was expended on account of salaries and wages. On the other hand the cost of materials declined to the extent of \$595,756. There was also a corresponding decrease of \$1,086,621 in the total revenue.

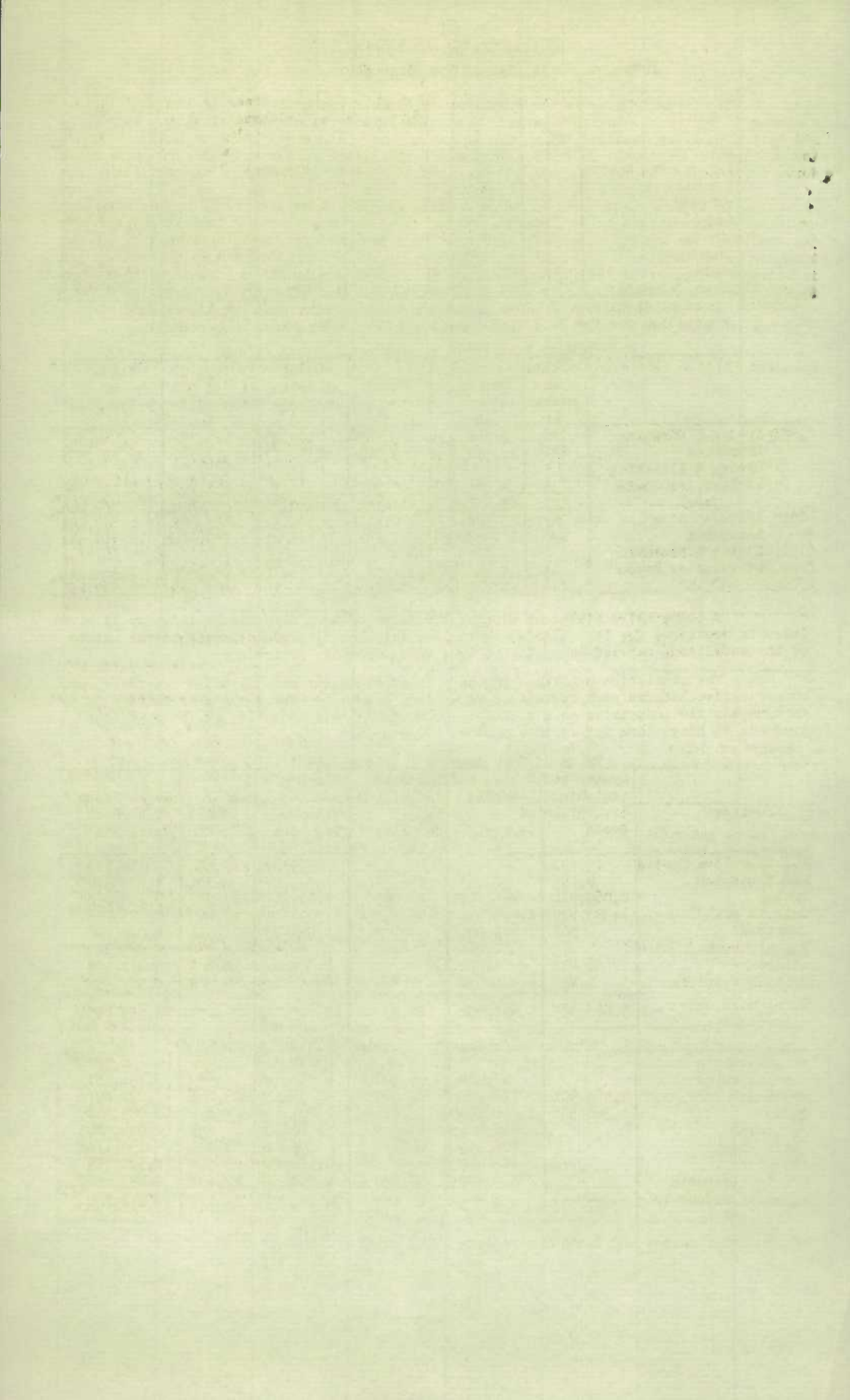

Size of Establishment.

The tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises is exemplified in a series of tables showing in a threefold way the size of establishments in the Laundry and Dyeing Industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) the number of persons employed. The tables when compared for a number of years, also serve to indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1930 the total number of establishments reporting rose to 387, the total capital investment rose to \$28,351,092, the gross value of production fell to \$25,472,664 and the total employment rose to 12,732. Of the total number of establishments 29 had a total invested capital of \$14,015,474 or 49.4 per cent of the total and an average investment per plant of \$483,292. Twenty-seven establishments had a combined output of \$9,890,650 or more than 38.7 per cent of the total and an average output of \$366,320 per establishment. In employment 27 establishments had a payroll of 4,660 individuals or 36.6 per cent of the total with an average employment of 173 per establishment.

DYEING, CLEANING AND LAUNDRY WORK IN CANADA, 1930

Section 1. LAUNDRIES

That portion of the industry of which laundry work provides the largest part of the total value of production is dealt with in this section. For the years 1921 to 1924 hand operated laundries were included but since that date these have been eliminated and only information concerning steam laundries are included in this report. The revenue derived from this source is shown by provinces in Table 1. for the calendar year 1930. Although there was an increase of 12 over the number of establishments reporting in the year 1929 the total value of work done declined from \$16,352,581 in 1929 to \$16,283,555 in 1930 a decrease of \$69,026.

Materials used

The cost of the principal materials used in this section of the industry is shown by kind, quantity and cost value at the laundry, by provinces for the calendar year 1930 in Table 2. The total cost of materials used declined from \$1,716,460 in 1929 to \$1,571,747 in 1930 a decrease of \$144,713 over the two year period.

Capital

The amount of capital employed in this section of the industry is shown by provinces in Table 3 for the calendar year 1930. Fixed capital which comprises the present value of land, buildings plant and equipment amounted, to \$16,188,950.- whilst working capital which includes inventory value of materials on hand, stocks in process, cash, trading and operating accounts and bills receivable was reported at \$2,349,284. The total capital showed an increase of \$1,485,175.

Employment Statistics

The number of persons employed, according to sex together with the amounts paid for salaries and wages during the calendar year 1930 is given by provinces in Table 4. The total number of persons employed rose from 8,928 in 1929 to 9,100 in 1930 an increase of 172 and the payroll also expanded from \$7,925,274 in 1929 to \$8,140,177 in 1930 an increase of \$214,903 over the amount reported for the previous year.

Table 5 shows the number of wage earners employed, classified by sex for each month of the calendar year 1930. It will be seen that employment reached its maximum in the month of August with a total of 8,568 employees of whom 2,670 were male and 5,898 were female. The minimum point recorded was in December with a total of 8,026 of whom 2,549 were male and 5,477 were female. The monthly average for the year shows 2,660 male and 5,726 females or a total of 8,386.

Power equipment

The classes of power installed in this section of the industry are shown by provinces in Table 6 according to (a) number of units in each class and (b) horse power according to manufacturers rating. Electric motors provide the principal motive power with a total of 1,137 and a total horse power rating of 5,820. Of these, 1,095 motors providing 5,700 H.P. were operated by purchased power whilst 42 motors with 120 H.P. capacity were operated by power generated by the establishments reporting. The boiler installation for all purposes was 271 giving 32,000 boiler horse power.
