

POWER LAUNDRIES AND CLEANING AND DYEING ESTABLISHMENTS IN
CANADA, 1937

Section I - General Review

The following report on Laundries and Dry Cleaning Establishments for the year 1937 is published by the Internal Trade Branch and in future will be included in the Census of Service Establishments rather than the Census of Manufacturing Industries in which it has appeared since 1927. The tables in the present report follow closely along the lines of previous publications and the figures given are, therefore, comparable.

Laundries and Dry Cleaning establishments are closely related inasmuch as they are selling a public service in the cleaning and renovating of textiles. Laundries and Cleaners differ in the manner in which this cleaning is accomplished. Water is the principal medium with which dirt and other substances are removed by laundries while a solvent generally related to the benzine compounds is used by dry cleaners. Laundry work consists largely of the washing of cotton and linen fabrics while dry cleaners treat the more delicate silks, woollens and synthetic fabrics with hydrocarbon solvents.

In Tables 1 to 5 of this report combined figures are given for both groups for which a total of 418 plants reported their 1937 operations. Capital invested amounted to \$22,119,578, a slight increase over 1936, while the gross value of work performed was \$20,343,152. Ontario reported 183 establishments with a total value of work performed amounting to \$8,448,049. Quebec was second in the Laundry and Cleaning field with annual receipts of \$5,446,583. The combined tables show the employment of 12,551 persons and an annual payroll of \$10,171,710. This was the greatest number of persons to be employed in any one of the eleven years for which figures are available and the payroll was the largest since 1931.

Materials and supplies used in these plants cost over 2-1/4 million dollars, an increase of 13.8 per cent over 1936, while payments for fuel and electric power totalled \$1,078,970.

Of the total receipts for work performed, \$11,135,335, or nearly 53 per cent, was for Laundry work alone. The balance was for cleaning and dyeing of garments and fabrics and other work such as the cleaning of carpets and upholstery.

Section 2.--Power Laundries in Canada, 1937.

In this section statistics are given for establishments classified as power or steam laundries. Hand laundries, or Chinese laundries operating on a small scale with no power equipment, are not included. Laundries whose operations include dry cleaning are classified as "laundries" unless such cleaning amounts to over 50 per cent of their total receipts. Such a close division is, however, seldom necessary as most plants are definitely either laundry or cleaning establishments.

There were 225 establishments with an invested capital of over 15 million dollars operating as laundries in Canada in 1937. Of this number, Ontario reported 95, Quebec, 48; British Columbia, 31; Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, 16; New Brunswick, 12; Manitoba, 9; Alberta, 9; and Saskatchewan, 5. The gross value of work performed was \$13,163,778, while \$6,678,998 was paid in salaries and wages to 8,576 employees.

Although laundries are engaged primarily in the laundering of household goods, there has been a tendency in the past few years for them to install dry cleaning units which, combined with the laundry machinery already in use, enables them to do a certain amount of dry cleaning work.

Table 8 gives a summary of the work performed by power laundries from 1931 to 1937 inclusive showing total receipts and percentages of laundry, cleaning and dyeing and other work performed in these plants. In 1931, 91.7 per cent of the total work done in power laundries was laundry work, the remainder being dyeing, cleaning and "other" work. By 1937 the percentage of laundering dropped to 84.6, and 15.4 per cent of the total receipts of power laundries was for dry cleaning, dyeing and "other" work.

Table 12 classifies laundries according to value of work performed, amount of capital invested and number of employees. Approximately one-third of the power laundries reported annual receipts for 1937 of less than \$20,000 or an average of \$10,181 per establishment. An equal number reported a capital investment of less than \$20,000 per establishment. Only 18 per cent of the reporting establishments performed work in excess of \$100,000, while 21 per cent had a capital investment over the same amount. Slightly over 58 per cent of the plants reported less than 30 employees, only 14 laundries employing more than 100 persons each.

Section 3.—Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments
in Canada, 1937

The Cleaning and Dyeing establishments in this report are distinct from the laundries reported in the previous section and on the whole have not invaded the laundry field to any extent. Laundry work reported by dry cleaners was negligible and is included in the following tables under "Other Work".

Cleaning and Dyeing establishments are classified as those dealing primarily with fabrics which cannot be cleaned with water and, therefore, do not come within the laundry field. Value of work performed, as given in this section, also includes dyeing of garments and household furnishings, the removal of stains and spots where chemicals are required and the cleaning of carpets and upholstered furniture.

For the year 1937, 193 cleaning and dyeing firms reported compared with 235, in the laundry section. Gross value of work performed was \$7,179,374, or slightly more than one-half the total for laundries. Capital invested was reported at \$6,902,031, a decline of 2.5 per cent from the amount of invested capital reported for the preceding year. There were 3,975 employees with salaries and wages amounting to \$3,492,712.

The value of work performed by cleaners and dyers in 1937 exceeded 1936 by 13.9 per cent and was the highest total reported for any of the years covered in this report. Ontario had the greatest amount of cleaning done, the total amounting to \$3,364,558; Quebec was second with nearly 2 million dollars; Manitoba third with slightly over 3/4 of a million, followed by British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick in that order.

The value of chemicals and supplies used in dry cleaning establishments amounted to over \$850,000, and the expenditures for fuel and electricity increased by \$12,903 over 1936 to a total of \$287,932.

Cleaning and Dyeing establishments are generally smaller than power laundries. 68 per cent of the cleaners reported value of work performed under \$30,000 each for the year, an equal percentage had an individual capital investment of less than \$30,000 and 141 out of a total of 193 plants employed on an average less than 30 persons per plant during the year.
