



POWER LAUNDRIES AND CLEANING AND DYEING ESTABLISHMENTS IN  
CANADA, 1939

Section I - General Review

A total of 502 Power Laundries and Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments in Canada engaged in either laundering or cleaning and dyeing of garments and textiles returned schedules showing receipts of \$22,926,474 for work performed in 1939. Nearly \$11,750,000 or 51 per cent of this amount was paid out in salaries and wages; materials and supplies used in washing and cleaning processes cost \$2,652,329; fuel and electricity cost \$1,217,779 while the collection and delivery of goods (exclusive of salaries paid to drivers) added another \$1,553,000 to the cost of operations.

The greater number of plants reporting in this industry are situated in concentrated centres of population, the 12 largest cities in Canada with 29 per cent of the total population accounting for 77 per cent of the total receipts for the industry. Ontario reported 234 laundries or cleaning plants with annual receipts of \$9,571,360. Quebec with 82 plants was second with total annual receipts of \$5,912,756. British Columbia and the Yukon had 63 plants and \$2,590,822 receipts. Manitoba had 26 plants and \$1,765,032 receipts; 28 plants in Alberta did business to the extent of \$1,169,785; 27 plants in Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia had receipts of \$808,296; Saskatchewan had 22 plants and \$642,042 receipts while New Brunswick had 20 plants and \$466,381 receipts.

Although the greater number of plants included in this report are engaged in cleaning and dyeing, 52 per cent of the total receipts for the year was for laundry work. Cleaning and dyeing of garments accounted for 41 per cent of the total receipts and work on all other articles made up the remaining 7 per cent.

An average of 14,212 employees, male and female, were required to operate the laundries and cleaning plants during the year. The annual payroll amounted to nearly \$11,750,000 or 51 per cent of the total receipts and providing average annual earnings of \$827 per employee.

Next to labour costs, collection and delivery of goods is a major item in the current operating expenses of these plants. Nearly 2,000 delivery trucks, having an estimated present value of \$1,353,000, were required to serve the customers of power laundries and cleaning establishments. The cost of operation of these units was \$3,770,000, of which \$2,217,000 covered drivers' salaries and wages and \$1,453,000 represented other expenses such as depreciation, repair, gas, oil, etc.

Materials and supplies used in laundering and cleaning cost plant operators approximately \$2,652,000. The principal items included 3,968,000 pounds of soaps costing \$340,831, over 5,000,000 pounds of salt valued at \$38,000, 2,212,000 pounds of washing sodas worth \$76,756, 589,000 pounds of starch at \$53,000 and more than 2,000,000 gallons of gasoline and other solvents costing \$408,000. Wash nets, pads and coverings for ironers and presses cost \$199,111, while \$492,903 was spent for paper, twine, bags, and other wrapping materials.

Coal and other fuel used in providing heat, steam and power cost Laundry and Cleaning plant owners \$921,087. More than 112,000 tons of coal and 4,300 tons of coke were used in the industry. Electricity for lighting and additional power cost \$296,692. The total consumption of fuel and electricity was slightly more than that reported for 1938.

Only a slight increase from year to year is shown in the number of power or "steam" laundries in Canada reporting to this Census. Due to the larger amount of equipment required and consequent capital investment, expansion in the laundering section of the industry is much slower than the increase in the number of cleaning and dyeing establishments. Hand Laundries are established in many places but are generally doing only a small volume of business and are limited mostly to the ironing and finishing of wearing apparel. Washing and finishing of the larger "household" and "flatwork" pieces is done for these "hand" laundries by power plants at wholesale rates.

The number of "power" laundry plants in Canada reported for 1939 was 234. The value of work performed reached a total of \$14,267,745, an increase of 1 per cent over 1938, and the highest revenues reported since 1931. Ontario's urban centres support 99 plants and customers paid over 5-1/2 millions of dollars for laundry service during the year. The annual revenue of 49 plants in Quebec was \$3,896,033; 32 plants in British Columbia and the Yukon received \$1,951,169 for their work; Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia had 17 plants with receipts of \$507,402; New Brunswick had 12 plants with \$395,377; Alberta reported 10 plants with receipts of \$818,116; Manitoba, 9 plants and \$847,492; and Saskatchewan, 6 plants and \$323,586 in annual receipts.

The total number of salaried employees combined with the monthly average number of wage-earners employed in power laundries amounted to 9,217 persons. The annual payroll including salaried workers and wage-earners, full-time and part-time was \$7,465,732. Salaried employees earned an average of \$1,393 and wage-earners \$694 per person. Male wage-earners averaged 48 hours per week with average weekly earnings of \$16.77; female workers averaged 45 hours per week with average weekly earnings of \$11.84. The highest average earnings for male employees was \$20.35 in Alberta for an average week of 48 hours. The highest for female employees was in British Columbia at \$14.03 for a 42-hour week.

The cost of collection and delivery of customers' goods was reported for the first time in 1939. This service cost Laundry operators 17.4 per cent of the total receipts for all laundry work. More than 1,200 trucks were required for the collection and delivery of Laundry bundles. The average operating expense including depreciation of equipment was \$726 per unit while drivers' and salesmen's wages amounted to \$1,223 per unit. The cost of this service was highest in British Columbia where it averaged almost 20 per cent of the total receipts.

Washing materials and supplies form another important item of expense. Laundry owners paid \$1,617,367 to manufacturers or dealers of soaps, sodas and other laundry supplies during 1939. Soaps cost plant operators \$288,262; washing sodas, \$86,000; starch, \$51,800; wash nets, \$70,342; and wrapping materials nearly \$270,500. The total cost of supplies averaged \$6,912 per plant or 11.3 per cent of the annual receipts.

In spite of an increased installation of dry cleaning units reported by laundry owners, the proportion of dry cleaning to total work performed showed little change over 1938. Of the total receipts reported for work done in power laundries during 1939, 82.6 per cent was for laundering and only the remaining 17.4 per cent for work done by the various other cleaning processes. Laundry work done for other finishers and distributors amounted to \$283,518.

The average amount of capital employed by owners of power laundries was \$70,477 per plant, slightly more than the average reported for 1938. Out of the 234 plants reported in Canada only 42 are operated with an investment of less than \$10,000; 93 have an investment of over \$50,000 each and 17 reported employed capital of over \$200,000 per plant.

The total horse-power capacity of steam boilers installed for heating and power purposes was 25,891. The annual bill for fuel was more than \$676,000 and electricity required for lighting and additional power cost \$189,849.

A slight increase in the installation of machinery and equipment was shown in the year's reports. Dry Cleaning units increased from 87 to 107, water softeners from 97 to 115, while 8 roll flat-work ironers (reported for the first time) numbered 86. The larger portion of the remaining equipment contained 1,657 wash-wheels, 973 extractors and 2,034 presses of various kinds.

Section 3.—Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments  
in Canada, 1939

The Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments in this section are those engaged in the cleaning of unwashable fabrics by solvents other than water. While a certain amount of washing of goods is done in some plants, receipts reported for laundry work were very small and are included under the heading, "Other work" in tables showing work performed in Cleaning plants.

The minimum of equipment and machinery necessary for the operation of cleaning and dyeing plants, particularly those engaged in cleaning only, is considerably less than that required for steam laundries. Cleaning Plants, though generally situated in the larger centres, are often found in smaller towns where power laundries do not exist. These plants operate with a much smaller average annual income and a smaller average capital investment.

There were 268 Cleaning and Dyeing plants operating in Canada in 1939 and annual receipts for this service totalled \$8,658,729. Reports were received from 135 plants in Ontario whose receipts of \$4,042,790 formed 47 per cent of the Dominion total. Quebec had 33 plants with \$2,016,723 receipts; British Columbia had 31 plants with \$639,653 receipts; Alberta, 18 plants with \$351,669; Manitoba, 17 plants with \$917,540; Saskatchewan, 16 plants with \$318,456; Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia, 10 plants with \$300,894; and 8 plants in New Brunswick had receipts amounting to \$71,004 for the year.

The annual revenues of 43 plants operating in Toronto was \$2,387,006 or about 59 per cent of the Ontario total. Plants operating in Montreal numbered 22 with receipts of \$1,694,524. There were 20 plants in Vancouver with receipts of \$495,118; 15 plants in Winnipeg with receipts of \$905,000 and an equal number in Hamilton had receipts of \$357,-842 for 1939. Other cities having 5 or more cleaning plants were Windsor with 9, Calgary and Edmonton each 8; Ottawa, Saskatoon, Regina and London with 7 plants reporting in each city; 6 reported from Victoria and 5 in Brantford and Quebec city.

The annual fuel bill for Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments was \$244,903 in 1939 while \$106,843 was paid out for lighting and electric power. Boiler installation totalled 8,569 horse-power and 1,146 engines and electric motors developed 3,968 horse-power for plant operation.

Although the number of Cleaning and Dyeing Plants exceed the number of power laundries in Canada, only about one-half the number of persons are employed in the operation of these plants. The total annual payroll amounted to \$4,284,126 for 1,072 salaried employees and 3,923 wage-earners. The average salary per employee was \$1,221 while the average wage-earner received \$758 for his work. The monthly average of wage-earners showed employment of 2,234 males and 1,689 females. The average earnings per male employee was \$16.09 for a 48-hour week, while the average earnings per female employee was \$12.59 for a 47-hour week. Male wage-earners in Alberta received the highest average weekly earnings with \$18.19 per week. Female wage-earners in British Columbia averaged \$14.86 per week. The total wage cost for Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments was 41.9 per cent of the total receipts as compared with 41.4 per cent for power laundries.

Cost of collection and delivery averaged 14.4 per cent of the total receipts compared with 17.4 per cent reported for collection of laundry work. The number of delivery trucks in operation was 720 with an average operating cost of \$812 per unit. Salaries paid to drivers and salesmen averaged \$916 per unit.

Most Cleaning and Dyeing Establishments operate on a smaller scale than do power laundries. Of the 268 plants reporting, 48 had annual receipts of less than \$7,500 each, 44 reported receipts between \$7,500 and \$10,000, 104 between \$10,000 and \$30,000, 60 were over \$30,000 but less than \$100,000, and 12 establishments reported total revenues in excess of \$100,000 each for 1939.

Materials and supplies used by cleaners and dyers cost \$1,034,962; 63,365 pounds of colours and dyes valued at \$70,657 were used along with 83,778 pounds of acids, 1,406,590 gallons of solvents and 497,000 pounds of soaps. Paper, bags and wrapping materials cost over \$222,000.

Dry Cleaning units in operation increased from 115 to 194 during the year and suit presses increased from 902 to 1,027. Other equipment included 547 wash-wheels, 427 extractors, 561 dyeing vats, 422 sewing machines and 43 other presses of various kinds.
