This report covers the 1964 operations of 71 private firms and 9 government agencies principally engaged in the production and printing of motion picture films and film strips for industry, government, education, entertainment, etc. It does not cover production by television stations. Twelve other firms coming to our attention which did not meet the classification requirements produced 44 entertainment and documentary films for television use, 9 non-theatrical films, 62 commercial advertising films for television, I commercial advertising film for theatre use, I silent motion picture film and 69 other films for unspecified use. These firms derived \$120,999 of their total revenue of \$769,091 from the production of motion pictures. Figures relating to these 12 firms are not included in any of the tables shown in this report. The report also covers 5 firms primarily engaged in video tape production and statistics on these are shown in a separate section (Table 3). The statistics shown in the following table pertain only to the private sector (do not include government agencies or religious institutions). The employment figures do not include proprietors of unincorporated firms.

SUMMARY STATISTICS

Table 1 of this report gives detail by region of entertainment, documentary, instructional, publicity, news and other films. Table 2 contains a technical and language classification of entertainment, documentary and instructional films.

Private industry and government agencies printed 65,619,923 feet of 16 mm film and 18,408,173 feet of 35 mm in black and white; 12,532,685 feet of 16 mm film and 1,593,686 feet of 35 mm film were in colour.

There were 135 sound motion pictures of 5 minutes or longer made for other than Canadian sponsors.
