

## MOTION PICTURE THEATRES AND FILM DISTRIBUTORS

### 1966

During 1966 there were 1,394 motion picture theatres operating in Canada of which 1,149 were regular theatres and 245 drive-in theatres These theatres together admitted 98,959,208 persons and had receipts (excluding taxes) of \$94,366,239. Comparable figures for 1965 were 1,418 theatres having receipts of \$85,162,234 and admissions of 99.914.739. Amusement taxes in 1966 amounted to \$6,517,892 versus \$5,586,966 in 1965.

The per capita expenditure on both types of theatres, at an average of \$5.04 in 1966, was \$0.40 higher than the previous year and \$3.26 less than the peak of \$8.30 reached in 1953.

Statistics relating to each of the two types of motion picture exhibitors and to distributors of films will be found in the following sections of this report Information on the activities of the National Film Board of Canada may be found in its Annual Report, copies of which are available from the Queen's Printer.

#### PART I

#### Regular Motion Picture Theatres

Regular theatres had receipts, excluding taxes, of \$83,004,592 in 1966 which, compared with the 1965 total of \$75,371,826, showed an increase of 10.1 per cent, the fourth increase in receipts since 1953. The number of paid admissions decreased to 87,694,046 from 89,134,806 or 1.6 per cent. A decrease of 22 theatres brought the number of regular theatres down to 1,149 from 1,171 in 1965 and the seating capacity to 647,847 from 652,581 in 1965.

The estimate of potential admissions is based on the normal programs shown by theatres throughout the year. Potential admissions may be either overstated or understated depending on whether normal programs are interrupted during the year. For this reason, the measurement of average capacity utilized is not considered entirely satisfactory but is of some value as an indicator of existing conditions.

Receipts from sources other than sales of tickets were valued at \$15,394,343 and included \$13,945,700 from sales of candy, drinks, cigarettes, etc., (\$12,957,347 in 1965), \$170,967 from the rental of concessions and vending machine space (\$246,428), \$34,184 from exhibiting commercial films (\$22,794) and \$1,243,492 from other sources (\$1,374,579).

Receipts from admissions increased in all ten provinces of Canada. Prince Edward Island indicated the largest increase at 22.1 per cent followed by Manitoba 17.6 per cent, British Columbia 13.6 per cent, Alberta 11.2 per cent, etc. The smallest improvement was recorded by Nova Scotia at 5.1 per cent. Number of paid admissions increased in four provinces and decreased in six. The largest increase was recorded by Newfoundland at 6.3 per cent followed by Prince Edward Island at 4.5 per cent, British Columbia 2.4 per cent and Quebec 1.2 per cent. The largest decrease was recorded by New Brunswick at 11.2 per cent followed by Nova Scotia and Manitoba at 7.2 per cent and 3.7 per cent respectively.

The average admission price (excluding taxes) for Canada was \$0.95 in 1966 compared with \$0.85 in 1965. The average price increased in nine provinces and remained constant in Newfoundland, The increases ranged from \$0.06 in Saskatchewan to \$0.15 in Manitoba. The average admission prices for a number of the principal cities in Canada are shown in Table 5. The table immediately following shows average prices based on total receipts including taxes.

Regular theatres employed 9,753 persons in 1966 and salaries and wages totalled \$18.245.314 compared with \$16,924,030 received by 9,541 persons in 1965. These employment figures include executives of incorporated firms but do not include proprietors of unincorporated businesses who were actively engaged in the business. In 1966, the number of working proprietors of unincorporated firms who were actively engaged in the business totalled 482. Added to this were 535 members of proprietors' families employed in the business but not receiving a stated salary, bringing the total work force of proprietors and unpaid family members to 1,917 in 1966.

#### PART II

#### **Drive-in Theatres**

The number of drive-in theatres operating in Canada in 1966 totalled 245 with a capacity for 95,683 cars, a decrease of 2 in the number of theatres and an increase of 1,201 in car capacity. Receipts from admissions (excluding taxes) increased to \$11,361,647 from \$9,790,408 in 1965, or 16.0 per cent. Total receipts from other sources amounted to \$5,224,373 compared with \$4,547,597 in 1965, of which \$4,901,289 was derived from the sale of candy, drinks, cigarettes, etc., \$150,493 from the rental of concessions and vending machine space, \$84,895 from exhibiting commercial advertising films and \$87,696 from other unidentified

sources. These theatres employed 2,383 persons and paid \$2,817,582 in salaries and wages. There were 80 working proprietors compared with 70 the previous year and 70 unpaid family members as against 76 in 1965. Amusement taxes amounted to \$666,275 compared with \$504,822 in 1965, a substantial increase of almost 32 per cent.

Nine of the 245 drive-in theatres operating in 1966 were equipped with 16 mm. projectors and reported receipts (excluding taxes) of \$76,918 and a total attendance of 97,506.

#### PART III

#### Film Exchanges

During 1966 films were distributed by 62 companies through 126 offices located across Canada. These exchanges had receipts of \$53,389,163 compared with receipts of \$47,137,047 obtained by 63 companies operating through 128 offices in 1965. A total of \$4,425,247 was distributed in salaries and wages to 813 persons.

Total receipts from the rental of films increased by \$6,832,382 to \$53,039,160 of which \$32,660,870 was from the rental of 35 mm. films and \$20,378,290 from 16 mm. films. The revenue from 35 mm. films came entirely from rentals for theatrical use while revenue from 16 mm. films was derived from rental for television use (\$18,136,463), for theatrical use (\$1,305,659) and for non-theatrical use (\$936,168).

New films released for theatrical bookings numbered 984 of which 637 were features, 164 cartoons, 110 newsreels and 73 other short subjects. These new releases were also classified by size of film and language and the data are presented in Table 13. The 637 features were further subdivided according to the country of origin as follows:
