THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1935

The final survey of the Construction Industry in Canada for 1935, is presented herewith, and it will be noted that this report has a different composition from the one for 1934. It is divided into ten geographical sections, the first section embracing Canada as a whole, with the following tables included therein.

- (1) Principal Statistics in 1935 and 1934.
- (2) Description, Classification and Value of Work Performed by General and Trade Contractors (including Subcontractors), Municipalities, Harbour Commissions, Provincial and Dominion Government Departments in 1935 and 1934.
- (3) Description, Classification and Value of Work Performed by General and Trade Contractors (including Subcontractors) in 1935 and 1934.
- (4) Description, Classification and Value of Work Performed by Municipalities, Harbour Commissions, Provincial and Dominion Government Departments in 1935 and 1934.
- (5) Description, Classification and Value of Work Performed by Subcontractors in 1935 and 1934.
- (6) Total Cost of Materials Used by the Construction Industry by Groups and Provinces in 1935 and 1934.
- (7) Itemized Statement of Materials Used by Municipalities, Harbour Commissions, Provincial and Dominion Government Departments in 1935.
- (8) Capital Investment in 1935 and 1934.
- (9) Average Monthly Employment of Wage-earners and their Remuneration by Groups and Provinces in 1935 and 1934.
- (10) Average Monthly Employment of Wage-earners by General and Trade Contractors and Subcontractors and their Remuneration by Provinces in 1935 and 1934.
- (11) Average Monthly Employment of Wage-earners by Municipalities, Harbour Commissions, Provincial and Dominion Government Departments, by Provinces, in 1935 and 1934.
- (12) Principal Statistics of General and Trade Contractors (including Subcontractors) Located in Eight Cities of Canada in 1935 and 1934.

The other sections cover the nine provinces, and each contains tables showing principal statistics; four classifications of work performed; a detailed statement of materials

used by municipalities, harbour commissions. Provincial and Dominion government departments; and capital invested. As labour statistics have been shown in full detail by groups and provinces in the "Canada" section, they have not been repeated in Provincial sections.

In 1935 reports were received from 215 municipalities, compared with the 2,333 which reported in 1934. In explanation, it was decided that the work engaged in by the country municipalities did not really constitute construction in the strict sense of the word. The greater part of their work consisted of grading and scraping clay and dirt roads, cleaning ditches, weed and brush cutting, etc., and in numerous cases this work was performed as statute labour by the local residents in lieu of cash payment of taxes. All such work, reported by over 2,100 of the country municipalities in 1934, was included in that year's report, and its omission in 1935 accounts fully for the decrease shown by this group in its value of work performed. It will be noted that work performed by harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments also showed a decrease of \$9,457,639 in 1935.

In attempting to make a comparison between the total value of work shown in this report, and the value of building permits issued, or contracts awarded, it must be borne in mind that all work shown herein represents construction, building, etc. which was actually completed in 1935. For that reason it is impossible to make any equitable comparison for a given year with other statements or tables such as the ones mentioned above. In compiling a statement of contracts awarded, for instance, all values are included in the compilation as soon as the award is made, while our report will only show the actual amount of work which was completed during the year under review. Similarly, permits are taken out for the erection of, or repairs to a building or dwelling, and it is duly reported by the city under "building or dwelling", while the trade contractor who does the work reports it to us under his particular trade, such as carpentry or plumbing or roofing, etc.

In 1935 reports were received from 7,689 general and trade contractors, subcontractors, municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments. There was reported a total value of work performed amounting to \$215,548,873, an increase of \$29,349,983 or 15.8% over the value reported for 1934. Of this amount \$140,988,228 was classified as new construction, while \$74,560,645 was shown under repairs, alterations, etc. Similar figures for 1934 were \$115,988,781 for new construction and \$70,210,109 for repairs and alterations.

The value of work reported in 1935 by general and trade contractors (including subcontractors) amounted to \$147,530,111, an increase of \$48,148,289 or 48.4% over the 1934 value. New construction in 1935 amounted to \$104,870,241, while repairs, alterations, etc. accounted for \$42,659,870, increases over the 1934 figures of \$38,898,551 and \$9,249,738 respectively. Municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments accounted for \$36,117,987 in new construction and \$31,900,775 for maintenance and repairs in 1935, a total of \$68,018,762. Similar figures for 1934 were \$50,017,091 for new construction and \$36,799,977 for maintenance and repairs, a total of \$86,817,068, representing a decrease of \$18,793,306 in this group in 1935. Subcontract work increased from \$19,625,985 in 1934 to \$31,437,070 in 1935, an increase of \$11,811,085 or 60.2%. In 1935 \$22,813,416 of this was classed as new construction and \$8,623,854 as repairs and alterations. The 1934 values were, new construction \$12,411,195, repairs and alterations \$7,214,790.

In 1935, all the groups - contractors, municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments - reported 144,768 employees engaged (salaried and wage-earning), which represented a decrease of 28,385 persons in comparison with 1934. In this year general and trade contractors and subcontractors furnished employment to 63,349 persons, an increase of 16,870 or 36.3% in comparison with 1934. On the other hand employment by municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments decreased by 45,255 persons, dropping from 126,674 employees in 1934 to 81,419 in 1935. Notwithstanding the reduction in the number of employees, the salary and wage bill for 1935 amounted to \$105,186,623, an increase of \$3,578,395 over 1934. Salaries and wages paid by general, trade and subcontractors amounted to \$58,977,344 in 1935, an increase of \$19,620,902 or 49.5% over 1934. Salaries and wages paid by municipalities, harbour commissions, etc. were \$46,209,279 in 1935 and \$62,251,786 in 1934, a decrease in 1935 of \$16,042,507.

Table 9 shows the average monthly employment of wage-earners (excluding salaried employees) in Canada and their remuneration by groups and provinces for the two years under review. It will be observed that in 1935 the average wage per man per annum for the whole group was \$655. The average wage paid by contractors and builders was \$834, by municipalities \$507, by harbour commissions \$671, by Provincial government departments \$635, and by Dominion government departments \$421. Similar figures for 1934 were: group average \$536, by contractors and builders \$745, by municipalities \$385, by harbour commissions \$382, by Provincial government departments \$545, and by Dominion government departments \$493.

The monthly average of all wage-earners in 1935 was 126,098 compared with an average of 157,859 in 1934. Contractors and builders had a monthly average of 50,725 in 1935 against an average of 37,561 in 1934, an increase in 1935 of 13,164 wage-earners, or 35%. The average for municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments was 75,373 in 1935 as against 120,298 in 1934, a decrease of 44,925 persons. Table 10 shows the average monthly employment of wage-earners by general and trade contractors and subcontractors, by provinces, for 1935 and 1934, while Table 11 furnishes similar information for municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments.

The month of highest employment in the combined industry in 1935 was October with 184,502 wage-earners, while February with 76,634 was the lowest. Corresponding figures in 1934 were, June with 230,953 wage-earners and January with 108,716. Reverting to contractors, builders, etc. we find that in 1935 the month of maximum employment was October with 79,509 wage-earners, while January was the minimum month with only 25,112. In 1934 August was the maximum month, showing 53,134 wage-earners, while January with 19,895 was again the minimum.

The cost of materials used, \$94,733,584, increased by \$23,941,449 or 33.8% in comparison with 1934. Purchases by contractors, builders, etc. were \$24,565,700 greater in 1935 than in 1934, but purchases by municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments decreased by \$624,251. Table 6 shows the total cost of materials used by groups and provinces in the two years, while Table 7 contains an itemized statement of materials used by municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments in 1935.

The amount of capital invested in the construction industry in 1935 increased from \$131,041,651 in 1934 to \$158,471,916 in 1935, an increase of \$27,430,265 or 20.9%. In 1935 the value of buildings, land, etc. was \$39,745,871, an increase of \$6,340,666 over 1934. Equipment, machinery, tools, etc. amounted to \$52,304,349 in 1935, an increase of \$5,727,411. Building and repair materials and supplies on hand, \$15,763,539, was \$2,279,337 greater in 1935, while cash and accounts receivable, etc. showed an increase of \$13,082,851, amounting in 1935 to \$50,658,157. Table 8 contains a classified statement by groups, for 1935 and 1934, and a similar statement will be found in each provincial section.

The principal statistics of eight of the larger cities, from a construction standpoint, are shown in Table 12 for 1935 and 1934. It will be noted that every section shows an increase in 1935. Out of the total value of work performed by all general and trade contractors and subcontractors in Canada, these eight cities accounted for \$80,270,373 or 54% of it in 1935 and \$55,940,464 or 55% in 1934.

The provincial distribution of the 7,689 reports received in 1935 from contractors, builders, municipalities, harbour commissions, Provincial and Dominion government departments was as follows:
