

Highlights

Balance of Payments Basis

Values (Tables 1,2,3 and 6)

- Canada's merchandise trade balance improved from \$147 million recorded in October to \$294 million in November 1991. This was substantially lower than the monthly average of \$689 million recorded for the first ten months of 1991 and resulted from imports falling even faster than exports.
- Exports fell by \$178 million to \$11.6 billion, more than offsetting the month-to-month increase recorded in October and marking the lowest level posted since March 1991.
- Exports of agricultural products and energy products remained practically at the same level as in October (with increases of \$3 million and \$5 million respectively).
- Decreases were registered for exports of aircraft (-\$61 million), automotive products (-\$162 million), industrial goods and materials (-\$34 million), and machinery and equipment other than aircraft (-\$84 million).
- In contrast, exports of forestry products went up by \$63 million, and exports of consumer goods showed a modest increase.
- Imports dropped for the second consecutive time, falling by \$325 million in November to \$11.3 billion.
- Increases were observed for imports of forestry products (\$6 million), agricultural goods (\$12 million), aircraft (\$55 million), and imports on account of special transactions (\$48 million).
- These changes were more than offset by declines in the import of energy products (-\$74 million), automotive products (-\$102 million), industrial goods and materials (-\$139 million), machinery and equipment other than aircraft (-\$108 million) and consumer goods (-\$30 million).

Faits saillants

Base de la balance des paiements

Valeurs (Tableaux 1,2,3 et 6)

- Le solde du commerce de marchandises du Canada s'améliore, passant de \$147 millions en octobre à \$294 millions en novembre 1991. Ce chiffre est sensiblement inférieur à la moyenne mensuelle de \$689 millions enregistré pour les premiers dix mois de 1991, et il est le résultat d'une baisse plus rapide des importations que des exportations.
- Les exportations diminuent de \$178 millions pour tomber à \$11.6 milliards, ce qui neutralise l'augmentation d'un mois à l'autre observée en octobre et représente le niveau le plus bas observé depuis mars 1991.
- Les exportations de produits de l'agriculture et énergétiques restent essentiellement au même niveau qu'en octobre (en hausse de \$3 millions et de \$5 millions respectivement).
- On enregistre des diminutions pour les exportations d'avions (-\$61 millions), de produits de l'automobile (-\$162 millions), de biens industriels (-\$34 millions), et de machines et équipement autres que les avions (-\$84 million).
- Par contre, les exportations de produits forestiers s'accroissent de \$63 millions, et les exportations de biens de consommation augmentent très légèrement.
- Les importations diminuent pour la deuxième fois d'affilée, soit de \$325 millions en novembre pour atteindre \$11.3 milliards.
- On observe des augmentations pour les importations de produits forestiers (\$6 millions), de produits de l'agriculture (\$12 millions), d'avions (\$55 millions) et celles au titre des transactions spéciales (\$48 millions).
- Ces variations sont neutralisées par la baisse des importations de produits énergétiques (-\$74 millions), de produits de l'automobile (-\$102 millions), de biens industriels (-\$139 millions), de machines et équipement autres que les avions (-\$108 millions), et de biens de consommation (-\$30 millions).

Balance of Payment Basis

Price and Volume Indexes

Imports (Tables 4 and 5)

- The current-weighted price index for total imports increased by 0.7% to 94.1 in November. This increase is primarily attributable to an increase in the index for End products, inedible (+1.2% to 93.3). Within this main grouping, higher prices are recorded for Passenger autos and chassis (+9.8% to 116.9), and for Other communication and related equipment (+3.6% to 101.6). These increases were mitigated by a decrease in the index for Office machines and equipment (-1.9% to 51.1) and in the index for Trucks and other vehicles (-1.2% to 95.1). The index for Fabricated materials, inedible remained unchanged at 95.2. Price movements for the components of this grouping were varied: Petroleum and coal products (-4.9% to 85.5), Other fabricated materials (+4.1% to 99.1), Precious metals and alloys (+10.6% to 73.8). The index for Crude materials, inedible fell by 1.9% to 101.2 primarily because of lower prices for Crude Petroleum (-4.9% to 105.9). The Paasche index for Food, feed, beverages and tobacco moved down slightly by 0.1% to 93.7.
- The fixed-weighted volume index for total imports decreased by 3.4% to 131.1 in November for a second consecutive monthly decline. All major commodity groupings recorded lower volumes, except for Food, feed, beverages and tobacco, which increased by 1.1% to 134.8. The index for End products, inedible fell by 3.5% to 129.6. The components of this grouping mostly responsible for the decline are: Motor vehicle parts (-8.5% to 90.6), Other communication and related equipment (-13.3% to 188.0), Passenger autos and chassis (-9.9% to 90.5). However, some components of the end products grouping recorded higher volume, most noteworthy were increases for Office machines and equipment (+6.6% to 318.7) and Aircrafts, engines and parts (+25.4% to 123.7). The index for Fabricated materials, inedible fell by 6.1% to 129.1. The decline is mostly attributable to lower volumes of Metal fabricated basic products (-13.5% to 194.7), Other fabricated materials (-17.0% to 145.5) and Precious metals and alloys (-32.5% to 49.6). Finally, the index for Crude materials, inedible dropped by 8.3% to 114.5 mostly

Indices de prix et volumes

Importation (Tableaux 4 et 5)

- L'indice à pondération courante pour le total des importations augmente de 0.7% à 94.1 en novembre. Cette augmentation est principalement attribuable à une hausse de l'indice des Produits finis, non comestibles (+1.2% à 93.3). A l'intérieur de ce grand regroupement, des prix en hausse sont enregistrés pour les Voitures particulières et châssis (+9.8% à 116.9), et pour les Autres équipements et matériels de télécommunication (+3.6% à 101.6). Ces augmentations sont atténées par une diminution de l'indice des Machines et matériel de bureau (-1.9% à 51.1), et de l'indice des Camions et autres véhicules moteurs (-1.2% à 95.1). L'indice pour les Matières travaillées, non comestibles demeure inchangé à 95.2. Les mouvements de prix pour les composantes de ce regroupement sont variés: les Dérivés du pétrole et du charbon (-4.9% à 85.5), les Autres matières travaillées (+4.1% à 99.1), les Métaux précieux et alliages (+10.6% à 73.8). L'indice des Matières brutes, non comestibles chute de 1.9% à 101.2, surtout en raison de prix en baisse pour le Pétrole brut (-4.9% à 105.9). L'indice Paasche pour les Aliments, provendes, boissons et tabacs diminue de 0.1% à 93.7.
- L'indice de volume à pondération fixe pour le total de importations diminue de 3.4% à 131.1 en novembre pour une deuxième diminution mensuelle consécutive. Tous les grands groupes de marchandises enregistrent des volumes en baisse avec l'exception de celui pour les Aliments, provendes, boissons et tabacs, qui augmente de 1.1% à 134.8. L'indice pour les Produits finis, non comestibles chute de 3.5% à 129.6. Les composantes de ce regroupement surtout responsable de cette diminution sont: les Pièces de véhicules automobiles (-8.5% à 90.6), les Autres équipements et matériels de télécommunication (-13.3% à 188.0), les Voitures particulières et châssis (-9.9% à 90.5). Cependant, quelques composantes du regroupement des produits finis enregistrent des volumes en hausse, notamment, l'augmentation de 6.6% à 318.7 de l'indice pour les Machines et matériel de bureau, et celle de 25.4% à 123.7 de l'indice pour les Avions, moteurs et leurs pièces. L'indice pour les Matières travaillées, non comestibles diminue de 6.1% à 129.1. Cette diminution est surtout attribuable aux volumes en baisse pour les Demi-produits de base en métal (-13.5% à 194.7), pour les Autres matières travaillées

as a result of lower volumes for Crude petroleum (11.9% to 151.3) and Metals in ores, concentrates and scrap (-11.0% to 75.2).

Exports (Tables 7 and 8)

- The Paasche index for total exports increased by 0.4% to 96.6. This was the second consecutive monthly increase and a reversal of the downward trend established since December 1990. Most major commodity groupings recorded increases this month, with the exception of End products, inedible (-0.5% to 99.5). This decline is mostly a result of lower prices for Office machines and equipment (-2.2% to 58.2), and Trucks and other motor vehicles (-0.6% to 98.6), however these decreases were mitigated by higher prices for Passenger autos and chassis (+0.8% to 99.3) and Aircraft, engines and parts (+1.3% to 118.5). At the major commodity grouping level, the largest increase was recorded in the index for Crude materials, inedible (+5.0% to 95.7). This increase is mainly a result of higher prices for Natural gas (+8.9% to 68.3) and Other ores, concentrates and scrap (+21.4% to 85.6). In addition, the index for Fabricated materials, inedible increased by 0.2% to 92.8. The price movements for the components of this grouping were varied: Lumber (+3.6% to 92.4), Newsprint paper (+2.6% to 99.0), Organic chemicals (+10.1% to 120.8), Aluminum including alloys (-7.4% to 76.4), Synthetic rubber and plastics (-2.4% to 82.7), and Wood pulp and similar pulp (-1.4% to 87.0). Finally, the index for Food, feed, beverages and tobacco remained unchanged at 96.0.

(-17.0% à 145.5), et pour les Métaux précieux et alliages (-32.5% à 49.6). Enfin, l'indice pour les Matières brutes, non comestibles chute de 8.3% à 114.5 surtout en raison de volume en baisse pour le Pétrole brut (-11.9% à 151.3) et pour le Minerais, concentrés et déchets métallifères (-11.0% à 75.2).

Exportations (Tableaux 7 et 8)

- L'indice Paasche pour le total des exportations augmente de 0.4% à 96.6. Cette deuxième hausse mensuelle consécutive constitue un renversement d'une tendance à la baisse amorcée en décembre 1990. La plupart des grands groupes de marchandises enregistrent des hausses ce mois-ci, avec l'exception des Produits finis, non comestibles (-0.5% à 99.5). Ce fléchissement s'explique principalement par la baisse des prix des Machines et matériel de bureau (-2.2% à 58.2), et des Camions et autres véhicules moteurs (-0.6% à 98.6), ces diminutions sont toutefois atténues par des hausses de prix pour les Voitures particulières et châssis (+0.8% à 99.3), et pour les Avions, moteurs et leurs pièces (+1.3% à 118.5). Au niveau des grands groupes de marchandises, la plus importante augmentation est enregistrée dans l'indice des Matières brutes, non comestibles (+5.0% à 95.7). Cette hausse est surtout le résultat de prix en hausse pour le Gaz naturel (+8.9% à 68.3), et pour les Autres minerais, concentrés et déchets métallifères (+21.4% à 85.6). De plus, l'indice des Matières travaillées, non comestibles augmente de 0.2% à 92.8. Les mouvements de prix des composantes de ce regroupement sont variés: le Bois d'œuvre (+3.6% à 92.4), le Papier journal (+2.6% à 99.0), les Produits chimiques organiques (+10.1% à 120.8), l'Aluminium et alliages (-7.4% à 76.4), le Caoutchouc synthétique et matières plastiques (-2.4% à 82.7), et la Pâte de bois et pâte similaire (-1.4% à 87.0). Enfin, l'indice des Aliments, provendes, boissons et tabacs demeure inchangé à 96.0.

Balance of Payments Basis

Exports - cont'd

- The volume index for total exports decreased by 1.9% to 120.2. This decline follows a slight increase of 0.2% in October and a decline of 4.2% in September. Nevertheless, the index prevails at a level which is 5.0% higher than in November 1990. At the major commodity grouping level, lower volumes were recorded for End products, inedible (-4.8% to 117.2) and Crude materials, inedible (-9.4% to 123.8). The components of the end products grouping mostly responsible for the decline are: Passenger autos and chassis (-15.7% to 89.2), Television, telecommunication and related equipment (-17.2% to 169.4) and Aircraft, engines, parts (-16.0% to 107.2). However, higher volume exports are recorded for Trucks and other motor vehicles (+11.0% to 168.6) and Office machines and equipment (+8.1% to 363.4). Most components of the Crude materials grouping registered lower volume exports, of greatest significance: Natural gas (-13.0% to 197.3), Other ores, concentrates and scrap (-21.1% to 70.3), Other crude non-metallic minerals (-27.8% to 54.8); while the volume index for Crude petroleum rose by 8.8% to 135.8. The volume index for Fabricated materials, inedible increased by 1.9% to 121.9 primarily as a result of higher export volumes of Precious metals (+40.9% to 175.0), Woodpulp and similar pulp (+14.8% to 122.8), Lumber (+8.7% to 110.1), and Aluminum including alloys (+10.5% to 136.0). Finally, the index for Food, feed, beverages and tobacco rose by 3.8% to 113.8 primarily as a result of higher volume exports of Wheat (+28.4% to 134.0).

Laspeyres price and trade-weighted exchange rate indexes (Tables 9 and 10)

- The fixed weighted Laspeyres price index for total imports increased by 0.3% to 97.7 in November. However, the trade-weighted exchange rate index for imports fell by 0.7% to 117.2. The combined effect of these two variations result in a decrease of 0.3% to 114.5 in the foreign currencies price index for total imports.

Exportations - suite

- L'indice de volume pour le total des exportations diminue de 1.9% à 120.2. Cette baisse fait suite à une augmentation peu considérable de 0.2% en octobre et à une baisse de 4.2% en septembre. Néanmoins, l'indice s'élève à un niveau qui est 5.0% au dessus de celui atteint en novembre 1990. Au niveau des grands groupes de marchandises, des volumes en baisse sont enregistrés pour les Produits finis, non comestibles (-4.8% à 117.2) et pour les Matières brutes, non comestibles (-9.4% à 123.8). Les composantes du regroupement des produits finis qui sont responsable de la diminution sont: les Voitures particulières et châssis (-15.7% à 89.2), les Téléviseurs, et équipements de télécommunication (-17.2% à 169.4), et les Avions, moteurs d'avions et leurs pièces (-16.0% à 107.2). Cependant, des exportations en volume à la hausse sont enregistrés pour les Camions et autres véhicules moteurs (+11.0% à 168.6) et pour les Machines et matériel de bureau (+8.1% à 363.4). La plupart des composantes du regroupement des matières brutes enregistrent des exportations en volume à la baisse: le Gaz naturel (-13.0% à 197.3), les Autres minéraux, concentrés et déchets métallifères (-21.1% à 70.3), les Autres minéraux non métalliques bruts (-27.8% à 54.8); tandis que l'indice de volume du Pétrole brut augmente de 8.8% à 135.8. L'indice de volume des Matières travaillées, non comestibles s'accroît de 1.9% à 121.9 surtout en raison d'une hausse des exportations en volume des Métaux précieux (+40.9% à 175.0), de la Pâte de bois et pâte similaire (+14.8% à 122.8), le Bois d'œuvre (+8.7% à 110.1) et de l'Aluminium et alliages (+10.5% à 136.0). Enfin, l'indice des Aliments, provendes, boissons et tabacs augmente de 3.8% à 113.8 principalement en raison de volume en hausse pour le Blé (+28.4% à 134.0)

Indices de prix Laspeyres et taux de change pondéré (Tableaux 9 et 10)

- L'indice de prix Laspeyres pour le total des importations augmente de 0.3% à 97.7 en novembre. Cependant, l'indice de taux de change pondéré des importations diminue de 0.7% à 117.2. L'effet combiné de ces changements entraîne une diminution de 0.3% à 114.5 de l'indice de prix à l'importation exprimé en monnaies étrangères.

Balance of Payments Basis

- The Laspeyres price index for total exports rose by 0.1% to 99.4 this month, rising for the second consecutive month after trending down all year. However, the trade-weighted exchange rate index for total exports decreased by 0.5% to 119.5. The combined effect of these differing fluctuations result in a decline of 0.4% to 118.7 in the total exports price index expressed in foreign currencies.

Base de la balance des paiements

- L'indice de prix Laspeyres pour les total des exportations s'accroît de 0.1% à 99.4 ce mois-ci, en hausse pour un deuxième mois consécutif après avoir maintenu une tendance à la baisse depuis novembre 1990. Cependant, l'indice de taux de change pondéré pour les exportations diminue de 0.5% à 119.5. L'effet combiné des deux changements entraîne donc une baisse de 0.4% à 118.7 de l'indice de prix en monnaies étrangères pour les exportations.

Customs basis

Imports (Table M-1 to M-4)

- November 1991 imports were valued at \$11.7 billion, rising 1.3% (\$153.3 million) over the same period last year, and down a substantial 9.2% (\$1.2 billion) from October 1991. The small year-over-year increase was largely attributable to jumps in the auto sector, which saw increases from Passenger autos and chassis (up \$342.0 million) and Truck, truck tractors and chassis (up \$93.7 million) as well as Electronic computers (up \$86.5 million).
- Notable declines were recorded in Motor vehicle parts, except engines, down 13.6% (\$164.6 million); Plate, sheet and strip, steel, down 47.7% (\$76.5 million); and Fuel oil, down 58.4% (\$75.2 million), over November 1990.
- Shipments exceeding \$1.0 million represented 27.6% (\$3.2 billion) of total imports. The following commodity groupings showed the largest percentage of shipments in excess of \$1.0 million: Crude petroleum (99.9%), Raw sugar (99.9%), and Aircraft, complete with engines (97.5%).
- Imports from Other Countries and Japan posted the largest gains this month, up 23.6% (\$294.1 million) and 13.3% (\$103.4 million) over last year. On the other hand, the EEC noted a decline of 16.7% (\$259.5 million), followed by the Other OECD, down 6.7% (\$47.1 million).

Base douanière

Importations (Tableaux M-1 à M-4)

- Le total des importations en novembre 1991, évalué à \$11.7 milliards, représente une augmentation de 1.3% (\$153.3 millions) par rapport à l'an dernier, mais une diminution de 9.2% (\$1.2 milliards) par rapport à octobre 1991. L'augmentation annuelle légère est fondée sur des hausses provenant du secteur automobile, en particulier de Voitures particulières et châssis (\$342.0 millions) et de Camions, tract. routiers et châssis (\$93.7 millions); les Ordinateurs électroniques (\$86.5 millions) ont aussi contribué à la hausse.
- Par rapport à l'an dernier, les diminutions les plus importantes ont été enregistrées dans les secteurs suivants: Pièces de véhicule auto, qui ont chuté de 13.6% ou \$164.6 millions; Tôles, feuilles, feuillard d'acier, 47.7% ou \$76.5 millions et; Mazout, 58.4% ou \$75.2 millions.
- Les envois excédant \$1.0 million représentaient 27.6% ou \$3.2 milliards du total des importations. Les catégories de biens pour lesquels le pourcentage des envois excédant \$1.0 million était le plus important étaient les suivantes: Pétrole brut (99.9%), Sucre brut (99.9%), Avions complets, y compris moteurs (97.5%).
- Par rapport à l'an dernier, les Autres Pays et le Japon ont enregistré les plus importantes augmentations d'importation, soit 23.6% ou \$294.1 millions et 13.3% ou \$103.4 millions, respectivement alors que la CEE et les Autres Pays de l'OCDÉ ont connu des baisses de 16.7% ou \$259.5 millions et de 6.7% ou \$47.1 millions respectivement.

Customs Basis

Imports - cont'd

- Compared to October 1991, the total value of Crude petroleum imports increased considerably by 36.7% (\$134.4 million), as the quantity imported went up by 31.9% to 21.2 million barrels (3.4 million cubic meters) and the price per barrel inched up from \$22.80 (\$143.39 per cubic meter) to \$23.63 (\$148.60 per cubic meter).
- Compared to November 1990, Crude petroleum shipments dropped by 16.7% (down \$100.7 million). This drop is mainly attributable to lower imports from the EEC (down \$139.5 million), followed by the Other OECD (down \$62.3 million) and the United States (down \$16.8 million).
- On a cumulative basis, imports cleared in Quebec and Ontario dropped by \$935.2 million and \$526.0 million respectively over 1990. For Quebec, the main contributor to the decrease was lower shipments of End Products, Inedible, while for Ontario, it was Fabricated Materials, Inedible.

Exports (Tables X-1 to X-4)

- Measuring \$12,303.2 million in November 1991, total exports (domestic and re-exports) were down \$373.1 million or 2.9% from the same month of 1990. Year-to-date foreign sales amounted to \$133,522.0 million, down 2.7% from the January-to-November period of the previous year. Transactions valued at \$1.0 million or more comprised 44.8% of all foreign sales in the month, up slightly from November 1990's 44.1%.
- Domestic exports of Crude petroleum; Woodpulp and similar pulp; Organic chemicals; and Aluminum including alloys slipped \$206.7 million, \$98.4 million, \$71.6 million and \$70.4 million from their November 1990 levels, accounting for much of the overall shortfall. On the plus side, gains were posted for Trucks, truck tractors and chassis; Wheat; Office machines and equipment; and Precious metals including alloys, up \$209.0 million, \$154.7 million, \$110.8 million, and \$98.5 million respectively.

Base douanière

Importations - suite

- Par rapport à octobre 1991, la valeur totale des importations de Pétrole brut a considérablement augmenté, soit 36.7% ou \$134.4 millions. Il en va de même pour les quantités qui ont augmenté de 31.9% à 21.2 millions de barils (3.4 millions de mètres cubes) ainsi que du prix du baril qui est passé de \$22.80 (\$143.39 le mètre cube) à \$23.63 (\$148.60 le mètre cube) durant la même période.
- Par rapport à la même période de l'année dernière, les importations de Pétrole brut ont baissé de 16.7% ou \$100.7 millions. Cette baisse est surtout attribuable à la CEE (\$139.5 millions), mais aussi aux Autres OCDÉ (\$62.3 millions) et aux États-Unis (\$16.8 millions).
- Sur une base cumulative, les importations dédouanées au Québec et en Ontario ont baissé de \$935.2 millions et de \$526.0 millions, respectivement, par rapport à 1990. Pour le Québec, les importations des Produits finis, non comestibles ont le plus contribué à la baisse, alors que pour l'Ontario, il s'agissait surtout de Matières travaillées, non comestibles.

Exportations (Tableaux X-1 à X-4)

- En novembre, les exportations totales (nationales et réexportations) évaluées à \$12,303.2 millions, ont baissé de \$373.1 millions ou 2.9% par rapport au même mois de 1990. Sur une base cumulative, les ventes à l'étranger ont totalisé \$133,522.0 millions, une baisse de 2.7% par rapport à la période de janvier-à-novembre 1990. Les transactions ayant une valeur de \$1.0 million et plus comprennent 44.8% du total des ventes à l'étranger pour le mois, une légère hausse comparativement à 44.1% pour novembre 1990.
- Les exportations nationales de pétrole brut; de pâte de bois et pâte similaire; de produits chimiques organiques; et de l'aluminium, y compris alliages sont en baisse de \$206.7 millions, \$98.4 millions, \$71.6 millions et \$70.4 millions respectivement par rapport à novembre 1990, et sont en grande partie responsables de la chute totale des exportations. Par contre, des gains ont été affichés par les groupes de camions, tracteurs routiers et châssis; de blé; de machines et matériel de bureau; et de métaux précieux y compris alliages, en hausse de \$209.0 millions, \$154.7 millions, \$110.8 millions et \$98.5 millions respectivement.

Customs Basis

Exports - cont'd

- Sales of Canadian domestically produced goods to the United States in November 1991 deteriorated \$243.3 million or 2.7% year-over-year, mostly because shipments of Crude petroleum to that country decreased \$216.5 million or 31.5%. Domestic exports of Passenger automobiles and chassis; Wood-pulp and similar pulp; and Newsprint paper, to our largest trading partner, also slowed in the month, falling \$70.9 million, \$63.2 million and \$59.8 million respectively.
- Shipments to Japan eased \$82.0 million or 13.3% compared to November 1990 due mainly to poor results for Rapeseed; Other fishery foods and feeds; Woodpulp and similar pulp, which posted respective decreases of \$17.8 million, \$16.3 million and \$14.7 million.
- Domestic exports to the EEC registered a large year-to-year slide in November, down \$239.8 million or 21.1%. Lumber, softwood; Aluminum including alloys; Precious metals including alloys topped the list with losses of \$38.2 million, \$25.6 million and \$24.0 million respectively. Shipments to the Other OECD countries dwindled as well, falling \$29.6 million or 11.4% due to respective decreases for Nickel in ores, concentrates and scrap; Aluminum including alloys; and Other inorganic chemicals of \$15.3 million, \$9.3 million and \$5.6 million.
- Only Other countries bought more Canadian goods in November. Sales to this principal trading group expanded \$172.4 million or 18.9%, with shipments of Wheat alone showing an increase of \$172.8 million. Precious metals including alloys; and Other cereals, unmilled were also in greater demand by this area, rising in turn \$35.4 million and \$31.8 million.
- Newfoundland's domestic exports showed the greatest year-over-year percentage drop in November 1991, plunging \$91.7 million or 56.2%. Of this total decrease, \$76.0 million stemmed from fewer shipments of Petroleum and coal products. At the same time, reduced sales to the United States accounted for \$79.6 million or 69.4%.

Base douanière

Exportations - suite

- En novembre 1991, les ventes de produits canadiens vers les États-Unis se sont détériorées de \$243.3 millions ou 2.7% par rapport à la même période de 1990, principalement à cause des transactions du pétrole brut vers ce pays qui a diminué de \$216.5 millions ou 31.5%. Les exportations nationales de voitures particulières et châssis; de pâte de bois et pâte similaires; et de papier journal, vers notre plus important partenaire commerciale, ont aussi ralenti diminuant de \$70.9 millions, \$63.2 millions et \$59.8 millions respectivement.
- Les expéditions vers le Japon ont diminué de \$82.0 millions ou 13.3% comparativement à novembre 1990. Cette baisse est principalement attribuable à la piètre performance des groupes de la graine de colza; des autres produits de la pêche; de la pâte de bois et pâte similaire, qui ont affiché des baisses respectives de \$17.8 millions, \$16.3 millions et \$14.7 millions.
- Les exportations nationales vers les pays de la CEE ont enregistré une forte diminution en novembre, une baisse de \$239.8 millions ou 21.1%. Le bois d'œuvre, résineux; l'aluminium, y compris alliages; et les métaux précieux, y compris alliages sont en tête avec des pertes de \$38.2 millions, \$25.6 millions et \$24.0 millions respectivement. Les expéditions vers les Autres pays de l'OCDE ont aussi décliné, diminuant de \$29.6 millions ou 11.4% due au baisses respectives pour les minéraux, concentrés et déchets de nickel; l'aluminium, y compris alliages; et les autres produits chimiques inorganiques de \$15.3 millions, \$9.3 millions et \$5.6 millions.
- En novembre, seulement les Autres pays ont acheté plus de produits canadiens. Les ventes vers ce marché principal ont augmenté de \$172.4 millions ou 18.9%, avec les expéditions de blé démontrant une hausse de \$172.8 millions. Les métaux précieux, y compris alliages; et les autres céréales, non moulues étaient aussi plus en demande pour cette région, augmentant tour à tour de \$35.4 millions et \$31.8 millions.
- Les exportations nationales pour Terre-Neuve en novembre 1991, démontre la plus grande baisse en pourcentage, faisant une chute de \$91.7 millions ou 56.2%. De cette diminution totale, \$76.0 millions sont attribuables aux expéditions réduites des dérivés du pétrole et du charbon. En même temps, les ventes réduites vers les États-Unis comptent pour \$79.6 millions ou 69.4%.

Customs Basis

Exports - cont'd

- Losses for Other fishery foods and feeds; and Fish, preserved, except canned, contributed to Nova Scotia's \$62.1 million or 28.1% shortfall. That province's sales to EEC countries and Japan were down \$24.4 million and \$14.2 million respectively compared to the same month of 1990.
- Shipments originating in New Brunswick enjoyed the most vigorous growth in the month under review, rising \$26.1 million or 11.5%. Domestic exports of Newsprint paper, and Petroleum and coal products, grew \$20.9 million and \$16.1 million respectively. New Brunswick's sales to the EEC countries climbed \$24.8 million or 77.5% from their year-ago level.

Base douanière

Exportations - suite

- Des pertes pour les autres produits de la pêche; et le poisson en conserve, sauf en boîtes ont contribué à une baisse de \$62.1 millions ou 28.1% pour la Nouvelle Écosse. Les ventes pour cette province vers les pays de la CEE et le Japon ont baissé de \$24.4 millions et \$14.2 millions respectivement par rapport au même mois de 1990.
- Les expéditions provenant du Nouveau-Brunswick ont profité de la plus grande hausse pour le mois en révision, une hausse de \$26.1 millions ou 11.5%. Les exportations nationales de papier journal; et des dérivés du pétrole et du charbon, ont augmenté de \$20.9 millions et \$16.1 millions respectivement. Les ventes du Nouveau-Brunswick vers les pays de la CEE ont fait un bond de \$24.8 millions ou 77.5% comparativement au niveau de l'année précédente.


















Chart VI**Imports and Exports by Principal Trading Areas**










1986=100**





Technical Notes

The Canadian International Merchandise Trade Statistical Program

I Introduction

The objective of this text is to provide a general overview of the Canadian International Merchandise Trade Statistical Program with special reference to concepts and definitions. The text is intended for the general user and simplicity is emphasized. More technical details can be obtained from the International Trade Division upon request.

II Conceptual Framework

1. Objectives and Coverage: The primary objective of the Canadian International Merchandise Trade Statistical Program is to measure the change in the stock of material resources of the country resulting from the movement of merchandise into or out of Canada. Information on imports and exports are inputs into the System of National Accounts, particularly in the Balance of Payments and Gross Domestic Product, and are used in the formulation of trade and budgetary policies. Governments, importers, exporters, manufacturers and shipping companies use trade statistics to:

- monitor import penetration and export performance;
- monitor commodity price and volume changes;
- examine transport implications.

2. Trade Statistics - Customs Basis/Balance of Payments Basis: Merchandise trade statistics are reported and presented on two different basis: Customs basis and Balance of Payment basis. (B.O.P.)

When goods are imported into or exported from Canada, declarations must be filed with Customs giving such information as description and value of the goods, origin and port of clearance of commodities and the mode of transport. Most of this information is required for the purposes of Customs Administration. Statistics developed from

I Introduction

Le présent document contient un aperçu général du Programme de statistiques sur le commerce international de marchandises du Canada, notamment des concepts et des définitions. Il est destiné au grand public, aussi a-t-on essayé d'en faciliter la lecture. Pour plus de précisions techniques, s'adresser à la Division du commerce international.

II Cadre conceptuel

1. Objectifs et champ d'observation: Le but principal du Programme de statistiques sur le commerce international de marchandises du Canada est de mesurer les fluctuations du stock de ressources matérielles du pays qu'entraîne le mouvement des marchandises au Canada. 2. Statistiques sur le commerce établies sur une base douanière et en fonction de la balance des paiements: Les statistiques sur le commerce des marchandises sont établies et présentées sur deux bases différentes: la base douanière et la balance des paiements (B.D.P.).

administrative records of Customs are commonly referred to as Customs based trade statistics.

On January 1, 1990, Canada entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the United States concerning the exchange of import data. As a consequence, each administration is using the other's import data to replace its own export data. Canada's international merchandise trade statistics are, therefore, no longer derived exclusively from the administrative records of Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, but from United States Customs records as well.

Customs based information is adjusted to conform with the National Accounts concepts and definitions. The adjustments to derive Balance of Payments based trade data include trade definition, valuation and timing related adjustments. The principal difference between the two trade concepts is that Customs based merchandise trade statistics cover the physical movement of goods as they are reflected on customs documents, while Balance of Payments adjusted data are intended to cover all economic transactions between residents and non-residents which involve merchandise trade. This section describes the concepts and processes pertaining to the Customs based trade statistics only.

3. System of Trade: Canadian trade statistics are compiled according to the "General" system of trade as defined by the United Nations Statistical Office. Under this system, imports include all goods which have crossed Canada's territorial boundary, whether for immediate consumption in Canada or stored in bonded Customs warehouses. Domestic exports include goods grown, extracted or manufactured in Canada, including goods of foreign origin which have been materially transformed in Canada. Re-exports are exports of goods of foreign origin which have not been materially transformed in Canada, including foreign goods withdrawn for export from bonded customs warehouses. Total exports are the sum of Domestic exports and Re-exports. Thus the general trade system, in principle, presents all goods entering the country (imports) and all goods leaving the country (exports). It differs from the "Special" system of trade in the treatment of imported goods into Customs bonded warehouses. Under the "Special" system, these goods are counted only if and when they are withdrawn from Customs warehouses for home consumption. They are not

counted in export statistics unless they have first cleared Customs.

Conceptually, under the "General" system, the statistical frontier coincides with the geographical boundary, while under the "Special" system, it coincides with the Customs boundary.

4. Valuation: For Customs purposes, imports are recorded at values established according to the provisions of the Customs Act, which, since January 1, 1985, reflects valuation methods based on the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) Valuation Code System. It generally requires the value for duty of imported goods be equivalent to the transaction value or the price actually paid or payable provided that a number of conditions are met. One of the important conditions is that the buyer and seller must be independent of each other. If the conditions are not met, practical rules are used to determine the Customs value. In order of precedence, these are:

- valuation by reference to the transaction value of identical goods;
- valuation by reference to the transaction value of similar goods;
- the deductive method of valuation;
- the computed method of valuation; and
- the residual method of valuation.

To determine the transaction value of imported goods, all transportation and associated costs arising in respect of the goods being appraised prior to and at the place of direct shipment to Canada, are to be added to the price of the goods. Therefore, Canadian imports are valued F.O.B., place of direct shipment to Canada. It excludes freight and insurance costs in bringing the goods to Canada from the point of direct shipment.

To countries other than the United States, exports are, in principle, valued or recorded at the values declared on export documents which usually reflect the transaction value, i.e. actual selling price, or in the case of a non-arm's length transaction, the transfer price used for company accounting purposes. Canadian exports to overseas countries are valued at F.O.B. (Free on Board) port of exit, including domestic freight charges to that point

but net of discounts and allowances. As of January, 1990, Canadian exports to the U.S. are valued F.O.B. point of exit from Canada. Prior to 1990, they were valued F.O.B. place of lading net of freight charges, discounts and allowances.

5. Commodity Classification: Both export and import statistics are classified and published according to the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (Harmonized System or H.S.).

The Harmonized System used in this publication is an international commodity classification (six digit) developed under the auspices of the Customs Cooperation Council. It was extended to ten digits for imports to serve as the basis for Customs tariffs and international trade statistics. For export purposes, the international six digit "root" was extended to eight digits. Canada adopted this system to replace the "Customs Tariff Schedule", as well as the "Canadian International Trade Classification" (CITC) and the "Export Commodity Classification" (XCC).

The Harmonized System is based on a fundamental principle that goods are classified by what they are and not according to their stage of fabrication, use, made in Canada status, or any other such criteria.

The Harmonized System nomenclature is logically structured by economic activity or component material. For example, animals and animal products are found in one section; machinery and mechanical appliances which are grouped by function are found in another.

The nomenclature is divided into 21 Sections, which, in general, group goods produced in the same sector of the economy. For example, Section IV, "Prepared Foodstuffs; Beverages, Spirits and Vinegar; Tobacco and Manufactured Tobacco Substitutes" (i.e. agricultural products) and Section VI, "Products of the Chemical or Allied Industries" etc. (i.e. chemical products, etc.).

Each Section is comprised of one or more Chapters, with the entire nomenclature being composed of 97 Chapters (Chapter 77 is reserved for possible future use). The Chapters of Sections I to XV (except Section XII) are grouped by Biological Genus (Section I, Chapters 1-5 Live Animals, Animal products, fish, Dairy products etc.) or by

5. Classification des marchandises: Les statistiques sur les exportations et les importations sont classées et publiées d'après le Système harmonisé de désignation et de codification des marchandises (Système harmonisé ou SH).

Le Système harmonisé utilisé dans la présente publication s'inspire de la classification internationale de marchandises (code numérique à six chiffres) mise au point sous les auspices du Conseil de coopération douanière. Le nombre des chiffres a été porté à dix pour les importations afin que cette classification puisse servir de base aux tarifs douaniers et aux statistiques internationales. Pour ce qui est des exportations, la "racine" internationale de six chiffres a été portée à huit chiffres. Le Canada a adopté ce système pour remplacer les listes du Tarif des douanes, de même que la Nomenclature canadienne pour le commerce international des marchandises (NCCI) et la Classification des marchandises d'exportation (CME).

Le Système harmonisé repose sur le principe fondamental selon lequel les produits sont classés d'après leur nature et non d'après l'étape de leur fabrication, leur utilisation, leur qualité de produits faits au Canada, ou tout autre critère analogue.

La nomenclature du Système harmonisé est logiquement structurée selon l'activité économique où la matière composante. Ainsi, les animaux et les produits d'origine animale se trouvent dans une section; les machines et les appareils mécaniques, qui sont groupés par fonction, se trouvent dans une autre.

La nomenclature est divisée en 21 sections qui regroupent, en général, les marchandises produites dans le même secteur de l'économie. Par exemple: la section IV, "Produits des industries alimentaires; boissons, liquides alcooliques et vinaigre; tabac et succédanés du tabac fabriqués" (c.-à-d. les produits agricoles) et la section VI, "Produits des industries chimiques ou des industries connexes", etc. (c.-à-d. les produits chimiques, etc.).

the Component Material from which articles are wholly or mainly made (e.g. Section VIII contains Chapter 41 - Raw Hides and Skins; Chapters 42 - Articles of Leather, etc.).

In Sections I to XV (except Section XII), the groups of products formed according to their basic material are structured or divided in two ways:

Horizontal - For the groups of products formed according to their basic material, there is no apparent hierachial order (e.g. Chapter 39 - "Plastics and Articles Thereof"; Chapter 44 - "Wood and Articles of Wood"); i.e. there is no discernable reason that plastic should precede wood.

Vertical - For those chapters in which goods are grouped by raw material, there is, however, a vertical structure in which articles are often classified according to their degree of processing. For example, Chapter 44 contains items such as rough wood, wood roughly squared and some wooden finished products such as wooden tableware.

Articles may also be classified according to the **use or function**. This classification (i.e. by function), mainly occurs in Section XII and Sections XVI - XXI. For example, Section XVII contains:

Chapter 86 - Railway Locomotives, etc.

Chapter 87 - Vehicles other than Railway, etc.

Chapter 88 - Aircraft, etc.

Chapter 89 - Ships, etc.

In order to illustrate the hierachial structure of the H.S., the following example is given:

06 - Chapter

Live trees and other plants; bulbs, roots and the like; cut flowers and ornamental foliage;

06.01 - Heading

Bulbs, tubers, tuberous roots, corms, crowns and rhizomes, dormant, in growth or in flower; chicory plants and roots other than roots of heading no. 12.12;

0601.10 - Subheading

Bulbs, tubers, tuberous roots, corms, crowns and rhizomes, dormant;

0601.10.11 - Tariff Item

Bulbs of the genus narcissus;

ou selon la matière composante à partir de laquelle l'ensemble ou une grande partie des articles sont fabriqués (p. ex.: la section VIII renferme le chapitre 41 Peaux et cuirs, et le chapitre 42 Ouvrages en cuir, etc.).

Aux sections I à XV (sauf à la section XII), les groupes de produits formés selon la matière principale sont structurés ou subdivisés de deux façons:

Horizontalement - Pour les groupes de produits formés selon la matière principale, il ne semble y avoir aucun ordre hiérarchique (p. ex.: chapitre 39 - "Matières plastiques et ouvrages en ces matières; chapitre 44 - "Bois, charbon de bois et ouvrages en bois"). Et il n'y a aucune raison évidente justifiant le fait que les matières plastiques précèdent le bois.

Verticalement - Pour les chapitres où les produits sont groupés selon la matière brute, il y a, toutefois, une structure verticale suivant laquelle les articles sont souvent classifiés en fonction de leur niveau de transformation. Par exemple, le chapitre 44 comprend des produits comme le bois brut, le bois écorcé, et certains ouvrages en bois tels que les articles en bois pour la table.

Les articles peuvent aussi être classifiés selon leur **usage ou fonction**, comme c'est le cas surtout à la section XII et aux sections XVI à XXI. Par exemple, la section XVII contient:

- 6. Statistical Period:** The reference period is the calendar month and the calendar year. The closing of the statistical month for imports and Canadian exports to the United States is defined according to the last calendar day of the month, based as closely as practicable on the date of clearance from Customs.

The closing of the statistical month for exports, to countries other than the United States, is also defined according to the last calendar day of the month. Those export documents which are received too late for incorporation in the current month are assigned to the month the transaction took place. If a monthly summary report from a high volume exporter is not received on time, the data are imputed for the current month and revised with the trade value in the following statistical month.

- 7. Country Classification:** As of January, 1990, trade data with the United States includes those imports and exports associated with Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The country classification employed by the International Trade Division of Statistics Canada is designed for purposes of economic geography and does not necessarily reflect the views or intentions of the Government of Canada on international issues of recognition, sovereignty or jurisdiction. The country classifications used and their associated codes resemble those developed by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and are adopted by most of the trading countries for Customs purposes.

A classification of countries with a statement of territorial limits used for statistical purposes is shown in the January and December issues of the publications "Exports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-004) and "Imports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-007) and in the annual publications "Exports, Merchandise trade" (catalogue 65-202) and "Imports, Merchandise Trade" (catalogue 65-203).

- 8. Trading Partner Attribution (Country of origin/destination):** Exports are attributed to the country which is the last known destination of the goods at the time of export. Exports to the United States are attributed to the state of destination.

Imports are attributed to their country of origin, that is, the country in which the goods were grown,

- 6. Période statistique:** La période de référence est le mois et l'année civils. La fin du mois statistique des importations et des exportations canadiennes aux États-Unis correspond au dernier jour du mois civil pour lequel il est possible d'obtenir des données sur le dédouanement.

Pour les exportations, la fin du mois statistique, vers les pays autres que les États-Unis correspond aussi au dernier jour du mois civil. Les documents d'exportation qui parviennent trop tard pour que l'on puisse les intégrer au mois en cours sont affectés au mois où la transaction a eu lieu. Si le rapport sommaire mensuel d'un gros exportateur ne parvient pas à temps, ces données sont imputées au mois en cours, puis rajustées au cours du mois statistique suivant en fonction des valeurs observées.

- 7. Classification des pays:** À compter de janvier 1990, les données du commerce avec les États-Unis comprennent les importations et les exportations se rapportant à Porto Rico et aux îles Vierges américaines.

La classification des pays utilisée par la Division du commerce international de Statistique Canada a été conçue à des fins de géographie économique et ne reflète pas nécessairement l'opinion du gouvernement du Canada sur les questions de reconnaissance, de souveraineté ou de compétence en matière internationale. La classification des pays utilisée et les codes connexes ressemblent à ceux qui ont été mis au point par l'Organisation internationale de standardisation (OIS) et adoptés par la plupart des pays commerçants, à des fins douanières.

Une classification des pays ainsi qu'une description des limites territoriales servant à des fins statistiques paraissent dans les numéros de janvier et de décembre des publications "Exportations par marchandise" (n° 65-004 au catalogue) et "Importations par marchandise" (n° 65-007 au catalogue), ainsi que dans les publications annuelles "Exportations, Commerce de marchandises" (n° 65-202 au catalogue) et "Importations, Commerce de marchandises" (n° 65-203 au catalogue).

- 8. Désignation des partenaires commerciaux (pays d'origine/pays de destination):** Les exportations sont attribuées au pays désigné comme la dernière destination connue des marchandises au moment de l'exportation. Les exportations vers les États-Unis sont attribuées à l'état de destination.

Les importations sont attribuées au pays d'origine, c'est-à-dire au pays où les produits ont été cultivés,

extracted or manufactured in accordance to the rules of origin specified by Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise. Imports from the United States are attributed to the state of origin. Prior to 1988, most imports were attributed to the country of export/consignment with the exception of imports from Central and South America.

9. Principal Trading Areas: The "principal trading areas" are country groupings defined as follows:

United States: (includes trade with Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands as of January, 1990).

Japan:

E.E.C.'86: Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain and the United Kingdom.

Other O.E.C.D.'86: Austria, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Australia, New Zealand. (The E.E.C. countries, United States, Japan and Canada are also members of O.E.C.D. - the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development).

Other Countries: This group includes all countries and territories other than the United States, Japan, E.E.C. '86 and other O.E.C.D. '86.

10. Province of Origin/Clearance: Prior to April, 1984, export statistics were presented by province of lading, indicating the province in which the goods were last laden aboard a carrier for export. Since April, 1984, for most commodities, trade data are presented by province of origin which represents the province in which the goods were grown, extracted or manufactured.

Import statistics by province of clearance indicate the province in which goods were cleared by Customs either for immediate consumption or for entry into a bonded Customs warehouse. This may not always coincide with the province in which the goods are consumed.

11. Mode of Transport: This information, not always provided on the exports documents, is sometimes imputed/estimated on the basis of other information such as the name of the exporting carrier. For exports, mode of transport information represents the mode of transport by which the international boundary is crossed. This may be different from the mode of transport within Canada.

10. Province d'origine/dédouanement: Avant avril 1984, les statistiques sur les exportations étaient présentées selon la province de chargement; elles indiquaient la province où les marchandises étaient finalement confiées à un transporteur pour être exportées. Depuis avril 1984, pour la plupart des marchandises, les données commerciales sont présentées selon la province d'origine, c'est-à-dire celle où les produits ont été cultivés, extraits ou fabriqués.

Les statistiques sur les importations selon la province de dédouanement indiquent la province où les marchandises ont passé à la douane pour être ensuite consommées immédiatement, ou être mises dans un entrepôt de douane. La province de dédouanement ne correspond pas toujours à la province où sont consommés les produits en question.

11. Mode de transport: Les documents d'exportation ne donnent pas toujours de renseignements sur le mode de transport qui est parfois imputé ou estimé d'après d'autres renseignements tels que le nom du transporteur qui achemine les marchandises. Dans le cas des exportations, les renseignements sur le mode de transport correspondent au mode de transport utilisé pour franchir la frontière internationale. Il peut être différent de celui utilisé au Canada.

For imports, the mode of transport information represents the last mode of transport by which the cargo was transported to the port of clearance in Canada and is derived from the cargo control documents of customs. This may not be the mode of transport by which the cargo arrived at the Canadian port of entry in the case of inland clearance. This may, therefore, lead to some underestimation of Canadian imports by the marine and air transport modes.

12. Legal Framework: Import and export statistics with countries other than the United States are derived from information contained on administrative records collected by Revenue Canada, Customs and Excise, under the Customs Act. Copies of these documents (or information therefrom) are sent to Statistics Canada in accordance with Section 25 of the Statistics Act. It follows that the disclosure of trade statistics is governed by both the Customs Act and the Statistics Act and is subject to the provisions of Section 17.(2)(a) of the latter. Disclosure of export statistics to the United States is now governed by a Memorandum of Understanding which provides for an exchange of detailed import statistics between Canada and the United States.

III Other Subjects

1. Abbreviations: Names of countries, descriptions of units of measure and H.S. class descriptors used in trade publications are often abbreviated or shortened for publication purposes. A key to these abbreviations appears in the publications "Exports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-004), "Imports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-007), "Exports by Country" (catalogue 65-003), "Imports by Country" (catalogue 65-006), "Exports, Merchandise Trade" (catalogue 65-202) and "Imports, Merchandise Trade" (catalogue 65-203).

In order to ascertain the exact content of a particular H.S. number, reference must be made to either the "Customs Tariff" (catalogue RV55-2/1990E, available from the Canadian Government Publishing Centre) or the "Canadian Export Classification" (catalogue 12-578E, Statistics Canada).

2. Quantities: Units of measure are available from the "Canadian Export Classification" (catalogue 12-578E), the "Customs Tariff" (catalogue RV55-2/1990E) and from the publications "Exports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-004), "Imports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-007), "Exports, Merchandise Trade" (catalogue 65-202) and "Imports,

Dans le cas des importations, les renseignements sur le mode de transport correspondent au dernier mode de transport au moyen duquel le fret a été transporté jusqu'au bureau de dédouanement au Canada et sont tirées des documents douaniers de contrôle du fret. 12. Cadre juridique: Les statistiques des importations et celle des exportations pour les pays autres que les États-Unis sont tirées d'éléments qui figurent dans les dossiers administratifs de Revenue Canada, Douanes et Accise, et qui ont été obtenus en vertu de la Loi sur les douanes. Des copies de ces documents (ou des renseignements qu'ils contiennent) sont envoyées à Statistique Canada, conformément à l'article 25 de la Loi sur la statistique. En conséquence, la divulgation de statistiques commerciales est régie à la fois par la Loi sur les douanes et par la Loi sur la statistique. Elle est assujettie aux dispositions de l'article 17.(2)(a) de cette dernière. La divulgation de la statistique des exportations vers les États-Unis est maintenant régie par un Protocole d'entente qui prévoit l'échange de statistiques détaillées sur les importations entre le Canada et les États-Unis.

III Autres questions

1. Abréviations: Les noms des pays, les désignations des unités de mesure et les définitions du SH utilisés dans les publications sur le commerce sont souvent abrégés pour les besoins de la publication. Un tableau explicatif des abréviations figure dans les publications "Exportations par marchandise" (n° 65-004 au catalogue), "Importations par marchandise" (n° 65-007 au catalogue), "Exportations par pays" (n° 65-003 au catalogue), "Importations par pays" (n° 65-006 au catalogue), "Exportations, Commerce de marchandises" (n° 65-202 au catalogue) et "Importations, Commerce de marchandises" (n° 65-203 au catalogue).

Pour vérifier le contenu exact d'une position du SH, il faut se reporter soit au "Tarif des douanes" (n° de catalogue RV55-2/1990F disponible au Centre d'édition du gouvernement du Canada) ou à la "Nomenclature canadienne des exportations" (n° de catalogue 12-578F Statistique Canada).

2. Quantités: Les unités de mesure sont indiquées dans la "Nomenclature canadienne des exportations" (n° 12-578F au catalogue), dans "Tarif des douanes" (n° RV55-2/1990F au catalogue) et dans les publications "Exportations par marchandise" (n° 65-004 au catalogue), "Importations par marchandise" (n° 65-007 au catalogue), "Exportations, commerce de marchandises

"Merchandise Trade" (catalogue 65-203). A definition of each unit is provided at the beginning of these publications. The unit "numbers" refer to complete (or substantially complete) units exported or imported, excluding parts. Measures of weight and volume generally exclude any packaging required for shipment. Units of measures used are represented by three character, alphabetic abbreviations which were developed by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

- 3. Values:** Import data from all countries and export data to all countries other than the United States, are collected in Canadian dollars. Export data to the United States is collected by the United States as import data from Canada, converted to Canadian dollars using an average monthly rate provided by the Bank of Canada and sent to Canada for dissemination as Canadian exports. This monthly rate is shown in the table below (for data comparison purposes, the average monthly rate provided by the Federal Reserve Bank for conversion of Canadian import data from the U.S. which is used for dissemination as U.S. exports is also shown).

Trade statistics are generally presented in thousands of dollars. However, all totals and their components (e.g. countries) are calculated from full dollar figures and "truncated" independently in order to obtain the highest degree of accuracy for each cell. Consequently, the "truncated" totals may not equal the sum of their components.

- 4. Aggregation of Small Value Countries:** The concept of aggregating small value countries at the

Toutefois les totaux et leurs composantes (p. ex. les pays) sont calculés à partir de chiffres complets en dollars et "désagrégés" indépendamment dans le but d'obtenir, pour chaque cellule, la plus grande exactitude. Par conséquent, les totaux "désagrégés" peuvent ne pas être égaux à la somme de leurs composantes.

- 4. Agrégation des pays dont les échanges commerciaux sont de faible valeur:** L'agrégation, au niveau des

commodity/country level has been adopted for the monthly publications "Exports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-004 - table 3) and "Imports by Commodity" (catalogue 65-007 - table 3). All countries averaging less than \$25,000 (Exports) and \$25,000 (Imports) per month on a cumulative year-to-year basis are grouped together and shown as "Other Countries" at the end of the list of countries for each commodity. Therefore, the omission of a country name does not necessarily mean there is no trade for that country. Complete commodity/country data, regardless of size, is available on TIERS or microfiche from the International Trade Division.

5. Revisions:

- a. **Data for the previous months of the current year:** Figures for previous months of the current year remain subject to revision until the December and annual reports have been published.
- b. **Data for the previous year:** Figures for the previous year remain subject to revision until the December issue of the following year has been published.
- c. **Cumulative Totals:** Cumulative totals in all reports reflect the revisions applied up to the date of printing.

6. Indexes of Price and Volume: Price and volume indexes are published in the "Preliminary Statement of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001P) and in the Summary of Canadian International Trade (catalogue 65-001). Paasche price indexes which are current-weighted are calculated from price relatives based on $1986 = 100$. The weights reflect trade values for the month, quarter or year to which the index refers and hence change from period to period. The Laspeyres volume index is derived by dividing a value index by the corresponding Paasche price index and is, therefore, weighted with fixed 1986 price weights.

The price indicators selected are either commodity unit values calculated directly from the trade statistics or, insofar as "end products" are concerned, price indexes obtained from other Canadian or foreign sources.

Current and fixed weighted export and import price and volume indexes on a Balance of Payments Basis presented in Part 1 of the "Summary

- a. **Données des mois précédents de l'année courante:** Les données des mois précédents de l'année courante sont sujettes à révision jusqu'à la parution du rapport mensuel de décembre et du rapport annuel.
- b. **Données de l'année précédente:** Les données de l'année précédente sont sujettes à révision jusqu'à la parution du rapport de décembre de l'année suivante.
- c. **Des totaux cumulatifs:** figurant dans toutes les publications tiennent compte des rectifications qui ont été apportées jusqu'à la date de l'impression.
- 6. **Indices des prix et de volume:** Les indices des prix et de volume sont publiés dans le "Communiqué préliminaire sur le commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001P au catalogue) et le "Sommaire du commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001 au catalogue). Les indices des prix Paasche, à pondération courante, sont calculés à l'aide de rapports de prix de base $1986 = 100$. Les poids sont des valeurs marchandes pour le mois, le trimestre ou l'année auxquels se rapporte l'indice et, de ce fait, ils varient d'une période à une autre. L'indice de volume Laspeyres s'obtient en divisant un indice de valeur par l'indice des prix Paasche correspondant et il est pondéré par conséquent au moyen de prix fixes de 1986.

Les indices des prix choisis sont soit des valeurs unitaires de produits, calculées directement à partir des statistiques sur le commerce, ou, surtout en ce qui concerne les "produits finals", des indices des prix obtenus d'autres sources canadiennes ou de sources étrangères.

of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001) are also available on CANSIM in matrices 3620 to 3625. Comparable Customs based and fixed weighted price indexes for the United States are available on CANSIM in matrices 3626 to 3629. In addition, these matrices contain "All Country" group and United States indexes in terms of the 10 Sections of the "Standard International Trade Classification" (SITC).

An explanation of the methodology used to construct the indexes is contained in a reference paper entitled "The 1971-based Price and Volume Indexes of Canada's External Trade", published in December 1976 as a supplement to the publication (catalogue 65-001).

7. Sources of Further Information: Monthly, quarterly and annual trade statistics are published in the 65-xxx series of Statistics Canada publications. Detailed descriptions and reference manuals of the commodity classification are also available. See the Statistics Canada publications catalogue for descriptions of the contents of the various publications. As a result of continuous research on trade statistics, additional reference materials, and articles, are published in the "Preliminary Statement of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001P), the "Summary of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001) and the occasional publication entitled "Canadian International Trading Patterns" (catalogue 65-503).

In addition, merchandise trade statistics are also available from the International Trade Division (in the form of computer printouts, magnetic tapes, diskettes and microfiche); from the CANSIM network (in matrices: 3620 to 3629, 3651, 3685 to 3713, 3718, 3719, 3887 to 3913) as well as from Statistics Canada Regional Offices.

On peut également obtenir une description détaillée des catégories de marchandises et connaître leurs classifications qui s'y rapportent. Veuillez consulter le catalogue des publications de Statistique Canada pour connaître le contenu des diverses publications. Grâce à une recherche soutenue en statistique du commerce, d'autres renseignements, articles, paraissent dans le "Communiqué préliminaire sur le commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001P au catalogue), dans le "Sommaire du commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001 au catalogue) et dans la publication hors séries "Profil du commerce international canadien" (n° 65-503 au catalogue).

Balance of Payments Basis

The statistics presented in Part I of this publication are adjusted to conform with the National Accounts concepts and definitions. Balance of Payments adjustments to Customs Basis data are incorporated at an aggregated level in order to make them compatible with the system of National Accounts.

1. Balance of Payments BOP Adjustments to Merchandise Trade:

Within the framework of the System of National Accounts, balance of payments concepts call for trade to be measured when ownership of goods changes between residents and non-residents of Canada. Ordinarily, a change of ownership takes place when goods flow across the Canadian border as measured in the Customs series published by the International Trade Division. However, adjustments need to be made to the Customs series in cases where resident to non-resident trade occurs with no flows across the Canadian border, or when goods cross the Canadian border without ownership change.

Also, the BOP allocation of imports is on a country of shipment basis, as it is seen to represent a better reflection of ownership change than the country of origin currently used for Customs compilations. Other BOP adjustments include: those to ensure goods are valued on a transaction basis at plant (rather than at the border) and adjustments to permit the incorporation of coverage differences, revisions or more timely data.

The exchange of merchandise import statistics with the United States in January 1990 resulted in a number of changes to BOP adjustments. Beginning with 1990 data, certain adjustments are no longer needed, especially those arising from the former reconciliation of trade statistics conducted with the United States since 1971. Other adjustments have been modified or introduced.

2. Elimination of selected adjustments

Reconciliation adjustments (applying only to trade with the United States)

- a. The under-reporting of Canadian exports, by far the largest adjustment, is eliminated now that U.S. imports are used directly to compile Customs exports.

Base de la balance des paiements

Les statistiques présentées à la partie I de cette publication sont ajustées conformément aux concepts et aux définitions des comptes nationaux. Les corrections apportées aux chiffres douaniers aux fins de la balance des paiements sont incorporées au niveau des groupes afin de les rendre compatibles avec le système de comptabilité nationale.

1. Ajustements de la balance des paiements (BDP) au commerce de marchandises:

Dans le cadre du système de comptabilité nationale, le commerce, selon les concepts de la balance des paiements, doit être mesuré au point de changement de propriété des biens entre les résidents et les non-résidents du Canada. Habituellement, le changement de propriété a lieu lorsque les biens traversent la frontière canadienne, selon les mesures des séries douanières publiées par la division du commerce international. Cependant, il faut apporter des corrections aux séries douanières lorsque le commerce de résidents à non-résidents a lieu sans qu'il n'y ait aucun passage de la frontière canadienne ou lorsque les biens traversent la frontière canadienne sans que la propriété change.

Par ailleurs, l'affectation BDP des importations se fait sur la base du pays d'expédition, puisqu'on estime que cela représente mieux le changement de propriété que le pays d'origine, que est retenu actuellement pour les totalisations douanières. Les autres corrections BDP comprennent celles destinées à garantir que les biens sont valués sur la base de la transaction à l'usine (plutôt que selon l'évaluation à la frontière) et celles destinées à incorporer les différences de couverture, les révisions ou des données à jour.

L'échange de la statistique des importations de marchandises avec les États-Unis en janvier 1990 s'est traduit par un certain nombre de changements dans les corrections BDP. Certaines corrections n'étaient plus nécessaires, en particulier celles résultant de l'ancien rapprochement de la statistique du commerce effectué avec les États-Unis depuis 1971. D'autres corrections ont été modifiées ou ajoutées.

2. Élimination de certaines corrections

Corrections de rapprochement (s'appliquant au commerce avec les États-Unis seulement)

- a. La sous-déclaration des exportations canadiennes, de loin la correction la plus importante, est éliminée, puisque les importations américaines servent directement à l'établissement des exportations douanières.

- b. Adjustment to include Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands with the United States are no longer required. These areas are already a part of the United States in its reporting of trade.
- c. The adjustment to deduct automotive tooling and other charges from Canadian Customs data, is no longer needed since such charges are not part of the U.S. Customs data.
- d. Prior to 1990 most exports to the United States were in practice valued at plant. For certain commodities where border valuation occurred, a deduction was made to arrive at a plant valuation for BOP reporting purposes. From 1990, this was no longer needed since U.S. import data separately identifies the value of good sat the plant as well as the inland freight component to the border.

Other adjustments

- e. Adjustments for timing, discounts and handling charges which applied to exports of grain and certain mineral and forest products to the United States, are discontinued.
- f. Certain smaller adjustments for advertising, tourist exports and sales of crown property have also been discontinued for all geographical areas.

3. Present BOP adjustments

- a. Progress payments, often made for large capital items, are maintained for large military goods. Otherwise, except for deliveries on which progress payments were already made before 1990, these adjustments are discontinued as current account transactions, since they are not large on a net basis and are technically difficult to track. The change will affect all geographical areas.
- b. Adjustments to Customs data continue to be made for selected commodities (gold, uranium) to reflect change of ownership between residents of Canada and all other countries. Gold loans to residents within Canada from official Canadian reserves and repayments within Canada are included from 1986.
- c. Beginning in 1990 the method of valuing Canadian exports to the United States has been changed from a plant to a border basis. However, the Balance of Payments continues to

Autres ajustements

- e. Les corrections de périodes, de rabais et des frais de manutention pour diverses exportations de céréales et de certains produits minéraux et forestiers vers les États-Unis sont abandonnées.
- f. Certaines corrections moins importantes pour la publicité, les exportations des touristes et les ventes de propriétés de l'État ont également été abandonnées pour toutes les régions.

3. Corrections BDP actuelles

- a. Les paiements échelonnés, souvent faits pour d'importants biens d'équipement, seront conservés pour les importations de produits militaires importants. Sinon, à l'exception des livraisons pour lesquelles des paiements échelonnés ont déjà été faits avant 1990, on supprime ces corrections comme opérations du compte courant, puisqu'elles ne sont pas importantes sur base nette et sont difficiles à retracer sur le plan technique. Ce changement touchera toutes les régions.
- b. On continuera de corriger les données douanières dans le cas de certains produits (or, uranium) afin de retracer le changement de propriété entre les résidents du Canada et de tous les autres pays. Les prêts d'or consentis à des résidents canadiens à l'intérieur du Canada à partir des réserves canadiennes et les remboursement effectués à l'intérieur du Canada sont inclus à compter de 1986.
- c. À partir de janvier 1990 la méthode d'évaluer les exportations canadiennes vers les États-Unis a été changée de l'usine à la frontière. Cependant la BDP continue à évaluer les exportations canadiennes à

- d. Merchandise imports are allocated according to the last country of shipment in BOP series rather than to country of origin in the Custom data.
- e. Adjustments for timing and discount/handling charges are continued for certain exported resources destined to countries other than the United States.
- f. A category of miscellaneous BOP adjustments applying to all countries is retained so as to incorporate coverage, timing and valuation differences, as required.
- g. Exports of natural gas and crude petroleum collected by Statistics Canada are used, for the time being, instead of the United States import statistics of these two products from Canada. Therefore, the difference between the value of Canadian exports and U.S. imports for these two commodities is shown as a BOP adjustment.

For detailed description of sources and methods please refer to Cat. 67-506E Occasional "The Canadian Balance of International Payments and International Investment Position".

4. Seasonal Adjustments:

Both export and import statistics show large monthly fluctuations. In order to isolate turning points or trends in the basic data, it is necessary to eliminate this effect of seasonal movement. Seasonally adjusted data are published on a balance of payment basis in the "Preliminary Statement of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001P) and the "Summary of Canadian International Trade" (catalogue 65-001).

5. Price Indexes

- a. **Timing:** From 1971 to 1983, the export price indexes for electricity, natural gas and crude petroleum on a customs basis which were lagged one month have been adjusted to represent the true calendar month. Similarly, the import price index for crude petroleum from the United States on a customs basis has been adjusted and recombined with the "Other country" import price index in order to arrive at an "All country" import price index. From January 1984, onward, the one month lag is now corrected on a customs basis.

4. Chiffres corrigés des variations saisonnières:

Les statistiques sur les importations et sur les exportations présentent d'importantes fluctuations mensuelles. Afin d'isoler les points de retournement ou les tendances dans les données de base, il est nécessaire d'éliminer cet effet de mouvement saisonnier. Les données corrigées des variations saisonnières établies en fonction de la balance des paiements sont publiées dans le "Communiqué préliminaire sur le commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001P au catalogue) et dans le "Sommaire du commerce international du Canada" (n° 65-001 au catalogue).

5. Indices des prix

- a. **Période:** Les indices des prix à l'exportation, exprimés en chiffres douaniers, de l'électricité, du gaz naturel et du pétrole brut pour 1971 à 1983, qui étaient décalés d'un mois, ont été corrigés et correspondent actuellement au mois civil réel. De même, l'indice des prix à l'importation du pétrole brut des États-Unis, exprimé en chiffres douaniers, a été corrigé et combiné à l'indice des prix à l'importation des "Autres pays" de façon à produire un indice des prix à l'importation pour "Tous les pays". Le décalage d'un mois est corrigé dans les chiffres douaniers depuis janvier 1984.

b. Aggregate Levels: Indexes at an aggregate level (section and total levels) are calculated by using value weights on a balance of payments basis with price indexes derived from customs data.

6. Data Availability

Data on a balance of payments basis are available on CANSIM.


