PREFACE

This publication is designed to present, in condensed and handy form, a precis of Canadian trade statistics as at the close of the fiscal year ended March 31, 1924. The review of the year's trade, and of Canada's present position among the great commercial nations of the world, is followed by historical tables showing the development of Canadian external trade from Confederation down to date. The trade of the last three years is then analysed by main groups and by countries and that of the latest year by both main groups and countries. Finally, there are tables detailing the trade in all principal commodities for the three latest years, together with the trade with the United Kingdom and the United States for the two latest years.

The figures for 1924 are preliminary; those for earlier years are final.

REVIEW OF CANADA'S EXTERNAL TRADE, 1923-24

Canada's external trade, in common with that of every other country of the world, suffered a severe decline in volume and value following the war. The reduction in the value of goods imported and exported was much greater, proportionately, than the decline in the volume, this being due to the general drop in prices. Although the effect of price changes on the value of foreign trade cannot be exactly determined, it is certain that if the same prices had prevailed during the fiscal year 1924 as ruled during 1921 the total value of Canada's external trade would have been greater during the fiscal year just closed than it was three years ago.

The fiscal year ended March 31, 1922, marked the post-war low point in Canadian trade, the total in that year being the lowest since 1916. Production showed the same tendency. Up to 1921 producers kept their industries at a level of high output, partly to build up stocks that had been depleted during the war, and partly in anticipation of increased exporting business.

All these objects were attained in large measure. Canada came through the critical post-war period without suffering that extreme depression which prevailed in most countries. The lack of purchasing power in other countries, however, bore heavily upon Canada's export trade, which declined more seriously than did the import trade, and in 1921 there was an unfavourable trade balance of \$29,730,763. Later, the Dominion's purchasing power being lowered, imports continued to decline, while exports took an upward tendency. These developments soon began to reduce the unfavourable trade balance and, though imports were once more advancing, exports had so far overhauled them that the unfavourable balance of 1921 was converted into a favourable balance in 1922 amounting to \$6,122,677, which was increased to \$165,186,430 for the fiscal year 1924.

This improvement in the trade situation is reflected in the purchasing power of the Canadian dollar. During the calendar year 1920 it took on the average 112 Canadian cents to purchase 100 United States cents, but in 1923 the Canadian dollar was almost on a par with the United States dollar, 102 Canadian cents on the average being equal to 100 United States cents.

The total trade of Canada in the fiscal year ended March 31, 1924, was smaller than for the war years 1917 to 1919 and the post-bellum years 1920 and 1921, but it was greater than for the years 1915 and 1916 and almost double the trade for the fiscal year just prior to the war, viz: year ended March 31, 1914. Insofar as comparison can be made, it would appear that Canada's external trade is in as favourable a position as that of any of the important commercial countries of the world.

The statistics in the following table indicate the trend of Canadian trade from 1914 to 1924, (a) with all countries; (b) with the United Kingdom; and (c) with the United States:

With Canadian exports totalling over a billion dollars for the fiscal year 1924, a new high record has been established in the Dominion's international commerce. While exports reached the billion dollar figure during each year from 1917 to 1921, this was achieved under abnormal war-time demands or the peak prices of the post-bellum boom, and thus cannot be considered a reliable index of the expansion of the country's productive powers. For the fiscal year 1924 Canada's domestic exports reached a total of \$1,045,100,000 and foreign exports \$13,400,000, making a total export of \$1,058,500,000. Inasmuch as during the same period the imports amounted to \$893,400,000, the Dominion's favourable trade balance was more than \$165,000,000. Compared with 1914, the exports of Canadian produce in 1924 shows an increase of \$613,500,000, or 142 per cent, and the imports an increase of \$274,200,000, or 44 per cent, while during the same interval the trade balance shows a betterment of \$328,900,000.

The domestic exports under the headings of "grain and grain products" and "wood and paper" in 1924 comprised about 61 per cent of the total exports. These groups, however, included large proportions of partly and fully manufactured products. The exports under the heading of "grain and grain products", amounting to \$363,608,617, included wheat flour valued at \$62,783,118 and other milled products valued at \$5,283,186, while the exports under "wood and paper," amounting to \$273,354,778, consisted chiefly of paper valued at \$96,957,962, planks and boards valued at \$76,043,496, and wood pulp valued at \$46,173,796. The exports of Canadian products under the heading of "grain and grain products" to the United Kingdom, amounting to \$223,068,453, represented 61.9 per cent of the total domestic exports to the Mother Country, while the exports to the United States under "wood and paper" totalling \$230,177,833, comprised 53 per cent of the Dominion's exports to that country.

With reference to the geographical distribution of Canada's trade, the table below shows that the continents of Europe and North America took 89.6 per cent of the Dominion's exports during the fiscal year 1924, the proportion shipped to each continent being 44.8 per cent, while they furnished Canada with 94.2 per cent of her imports, the proportion received from North America amounting to 71.6 per cent and from Europe to 22.6 per cent.

During the fiscal year 1924 Canada purchased goods from 89 countries and sold her products to 107 countries. Of the countries from which she purchased goods 25 were British and 64 foreign, while 29 of those to which she sold goods were British and 78 foreign.

The United States holds first place in Canada's import trade by a very wide margin. In 1924 the imports from the United States amounted to \$601,295,121, or 67.3 per cent of the total. Next in order of importance were: United Kingdom \$153,613,003 or 17.2 per cent; France \$15,770,145, or 1.8 per cent; British East Indies \$14,374,888, or 1.6 per cent; British West Indies, \$13,819,291, or 1.5 per cent; Cuba \$10,781,047, or 1.2 per cent; San Domingo \$8,800,060, or 1.0 per cent; Switzerland \$8,420,673, or 0.9 per cent; Japan \$6,292,867, or 0.7 per cent; Netherlands \$5,360,344, or 0.6 per cent; Germany \$5,379,737, or 0.6 per cent; Belgium \$5,340,875, or 0.6 per cent; and Argentina \$4,173,562, or 0.5 per cent. Compared with the pre-war year 1914, the imports in 1924 from the United States show an increase of 51.7 per cent; from United Kingdom 16.3 per cent; from France 10.5 per cent; from British East Indies 100.0 per cent; from British West Indies 220.9 per cent; from Cuba 170.0 per cent; from San Domingo 203.4 per cent; from Switzerland 95.3 per cent; from Japan 142.3 per cent; from Netherlands 80.0 per cent; from Belgium 17.7 per cent; and from Argentina 61.5 per cent. The imports from Germany for the same two years show a decrease of 63.0 per cent.

The United States is Canada's best customer notwithstanding the effect of the Fordney-McCumber tariff on the Dominion's exports. The exports of

Canadian products to the United States in 1924 amounted to \$430,715,496 or 41.2 per cent of the Dominion's exports. Next in order of importance were: United Kingdom \$360,094,021, or 34.5 per cent; Japan \$26,931,860, or 2.6 per cent; Australia \$19,923,997, or 1.9 per cent; France \$18,879,097, or 1.8 per cent; Italy \$18,501,578, or 1.8 per cent; Belgium \$17,452,442 or 1.7 per cent; Germany \$16,153,673, or 1.6 per cent; China \$12,973,145, or 1.2 per cent; New Zealand \$12,735,620, or 1.2 per cent; British West Indies \$10,901,712, or 1.0 per cent; Newfoundland \$10,507,868 or 1.0 per cent; Netherlands \$9,488,976, or 0.9 per cent; Argentina \$7,305,866 or 0.7 per cent; and Cuba \$6,776,605, or 0.6 per cent. Comparing 1914 with 1924, Canada's exports to the United States show an increase of 163.6 per cent; to United Kingdom 67.3 per cent; to Japan 1581.2 per cent; to Australia 323.4 per cent; to France 425.0 per cent; to Italy 3600.0 per cent; to Belgium 304.6 per cent; to Germany 299.4 per cent; to China 2642.7 per cent; to New Zealand 568.4 per cent; to British West Indies 142.2 per cent; to Newfoundland 133.3 per cent; to Netherlands 137.5 per cent; to Argentina 247.6 per cent; and to Cuba 277.7 per cent.

The variety and capacity of Canada's manufacturing industries are constantly increasing. Numerous commodities of commerce in Canada that, a few years ago, were wholly imported, are now produced in the country in sufficient volume for the home demand and are also being exported in quantity, while certain very large manufactoryes are chiefly engaged in supplying foreign markets. No statistics are available to show what proportion of Canada's imports and exports for the fiscal year 1924 was raw materials, partly manufactured or fully manufactured goods. Statistics appear in tabulated form below setting forth this information not only for Canada, but also for the United States for certain years from 1900 to 1923. The table indicates that the products of the manufacturing industries of Canada and the United States are gradually displacing in their respective countries partly and fully manufactured goods which were formerly imported. Both countries are importing more raw materials for their industries than formerly. Canada's imports of raw materials in 1923 amounted to 28.4 per cent of her total imports, while the proportion of the raw materials imported into the United States was 48.3 per cent. It is evident, therefore, that Canada is not as dependent on foreign countries for her supply of raw materials as is the United States. While it is true that Canada continues to export large quantities of raw materials, it is a notable fact that the increase in the quantities of raw materials used in her manufacturing industries in recent years is much greater than the increase in the exports of these products. Just prior to the war the proportion of fully manufactured products imported into Canada was 68.9 per cent of her total imports and for the United States 36.6 per cent, but in 1923 the proportion for Canada was 61.9 per cent and for the United States 32.9 per cent. It will also be observed by reference to this table that Canada and the United States are both steadily increasing their exports of partly and fully manufactured products, while the exports of raw materials for the two countries show a downward tendency.

Canada has materially improved her position among the leading commercial countries of the world since 1913. The table below respecting the trade of the principal countries of the world for the calendar years 1913 and 1923 shows that, with respect to imports, Canada occupied eighth place among the principal importing countries in 1913, whereas in 1923 she had advanced to sixth place, being surpassed by the United Kingdom, United States, France, Germany and Japan, in the order given. In percentage of increase in import trade during the decade 1913 to 1923 Canada occupied twelfth place. In imports per capita Canada stood in fifth position in 1913 and sixth position in 1923. Canada occupied tenth place as an exporting country in 1913 while in 1923 she occupied sixth place, being surpassed by the United States, United Kingdom, France, Germany and British India. During the decade Canada's increase in export trade was 132.6%. The only country to surpass this record was the Union of South Africa with an increase of 154.8%. In respect to exports per capita, Canada stood in seventh place in 1913, but in 1923 she occupied second position, conceding first place to the Dominion of New Zealand. Though Canada, in 1923, in both imports and exports, occupied sixth place among the principal trading countries of the world, she held fifth position in respect to aggregate trade.
