

Review of International Travel

During the period January — October of the year, 33.6 million United States residents visited Canada while 31.5 million Canadian residents returned from visits to the United States. This represents increases of 4.7 per cent for the former group and 1.4 per cent for the latter.

The strike by employees of General Motors Corporation beginning in September and continuing into October may have some effect on same day traffic flows between border communities. Lower numbers can also be expected in rail traffic as Penn — Central Railway ceased discharging and boarding passengers in Canada.

The number of overseas visitors entering Canada continues to show increases with entries totalling 484,800 during January — October 1970. Although the rate of increase in Canadian travel overseas diminished in October, direct re-entries for the ten month period advanced by 36 per cent compared with the same interval in 1969.

Travel between Canada and the United States

In October 1970, United States residents entering Canada numbered 2,499,600, between 4 to 5 per cent higher than the same month in 1969. Visits by Canadian residents to the United States amounted to 2,778,500 slightly less than October 1969.

The automobile as usual carried the great majority of travellers 2,193,000 United States visitors and 2,390,300 returning residents. The number of trips by United States residents entering and leaving the same day by automobile increased by about 2 per cent (28,600) while on the other hand the return flow of Canadians in this category declined by 2 per cent or 35,500 persons.

Continued increases in plane, bus and boat traffic offset declines in rail and "other travellers" and brought non-automobile entries to 306,600 in October 1970, about 5 per cent higher than the same month in 1969. The lower number of "other travellers" which includes local bus traffic led to a 6 per cent decline in Canadians returning by non-automobile transportation.

Travel between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors entering Canada during October 1970 totalled 37,000, an increase of 18.3 per cent over the same month in 1969. As the winter months approach travel to Canada gradually deteriorates; August recorded 81,000 entries and September 57,000 arrivals from overseas countries. Seven countries showed numbers more than 1,000 in October 1970. Of these the United Kingdom led with 8,492 followed by Germany, France and Japan with 2,798, 2,395 and 2,174 arrivals, respectively. The remaining three countries were Australia, Italy and The Netherlands.

Canadian residents returning directly to Canada in October 1970 numbered 64,300, some 5,200 or 8.8 per cent more than October the previous year. Improved statistical reporting at Trenton, Ontario has enabled the exclusion of a larger number of military personnel and dependents; therefore, lower figures can be expected in the months to come.
