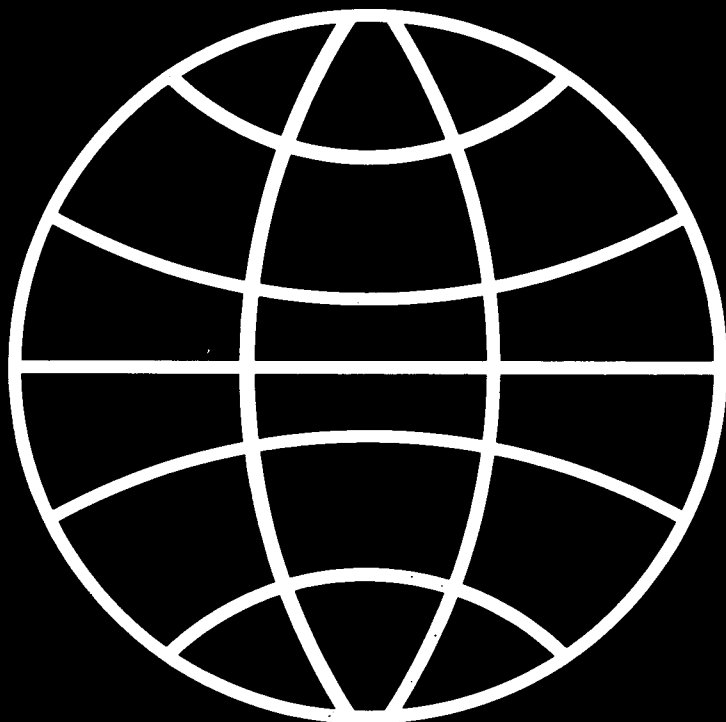
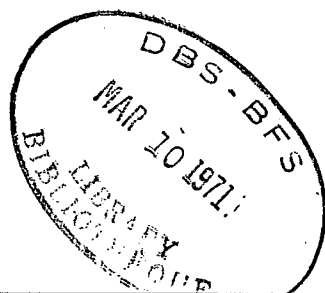

Review of International Travel

For the first eleven months of 1970 there has been 24,936,300 vehicle crossings and 69,154,100 person crossings at the various ports on the Canadian - U.S. border, compared with 24,343,800 vehicle crossings and 67,367,600 person crossings in 1969. Most of the increase over 1969 is due to an increase of United States visitors to Canada. The number of Canadians re-entering Canada from the United States increased by only 1.1 per cent over 1969.

Travel Between Canada and the United States

Cumulative statistics for the first eleven months of 1970 indicate that the number of United States visitors to Canada increased by 4.2 per cent to reach 35,465,000 visits. Canadian residents returning from the United States to date number 33,689,000.

In November 1970 the number of United States visitors entering Canada decreased by 75,400 over the same period in 1969 due mainly to a decrease in visitors entering and leaving the same day by automobile. The number of Canadian residents returning from the United States during November 1970 decreased by 69,000, off 3.1 per cent versus 1969. This decrease in both cases may be partially attributable to the continuation of the strike at all General Motor plants in Canada and the United States during November 1970. The number of visits from U.S. residents by non-automobile means totalled 236,300 or 12.5 per cent of all visits to Canada, up 0.7 per cent over 1969. Plane travel by U.S. residents increased 10.4 per cent versus 1969 to reach 81,400 visits. Rail travel again decreased in November in a year-to-year comparison due to the ceasing of operations by the Penn-Central Railway in Canada.

Visits by Canadians to the United States by non-automobile means decreased 6.2 per cent to total 328,500. The largest decrease occurred in "other non-automobile" category (local bus, taxi, motorcycle, commercial truck, etc.) off by 20,500 visits.

The number of vehicles entering Canada during November 1970 totalled 1,606,500, a decrease of 55,200 vehicles from the same period last year. Of the total, 53 per cent or 853,700 vehicles were registered as Canadian, while 47 per cent were non-resident vehicles entering Canada. Approximately 58 per cent of all vehicles entered or re-entered Canada through the Province of Ontario.

Travel Between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors to Canada during January - November 1970 numbered 507,600, an increase of 15.9 per cent over 1969. Approximately seventy per cent of all overseas visitors to Canada during 1970 resided in European countries.

In the month of November 1970 there were 22,800 visitors to Canada from overseas countries, up 6.8 per cent versus 1969. A breakdown of overseas visitors by province of entry for November 1970 reveals the following percentage distribution: Atlantic Provinces 2.5, Quebec 43.9, Ontario 39.1, Western Provinces 2.9, British Columbia and the Yukon 11.6. The leading nations in terms of overseas visitors for the month in order of rank were: the United Kingdom, Germany, France, Japan and Poland.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries during November 1970 numbered 30,400, down 25.4 per cent versus the same period in 1969. More complete data reported by Trenton airport permitted the exclusion of Canadian Armed Forces personnel and dependents returning from overseas in November 1970; the non-comparability of data between November 1969 and November 1970 accounted for just over 5 per cent of the above decrease. Cumulative statistics indicate that 918,500 Canadian residents returned direct from overseas countries, up 32.1 per cent over 1969. The majority of the increase in Canadians travelling overseas returned via the Province of Quebec.
