


TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRIES

Preliminary Estimates of Receipts and Expenditures, 1970

In 1970 Canada recorded a deficit on travel account with all other countries of the world for the third consecutive year. Estimates show that foreign visitors to Canada spent \$1,219 million in 1970, while Canadians spent \$1,454 million abroad. These figures include transportation costs paid to Canadian carriers by non-residents visiting Canada, and fares paid to foreign carriers by Canadians travelling abroad.

United States residents accounted for expenditures in Canada of \$1,078 million, an increase of 12.2 per cent over 1969. Overseas visitors to Canada spent \$141 million, an increase of 24.8 per cent over 1969. Most of this increase is attributable to higher spending by visitors from the United Kingdom and European O.E.C.D. Member Countries.

Canadian expenditures abroad increased by 12.5 per cent over 1969 to reach a record high for payments on travel account at \$1,454 million. Canadians spent \$930 million in the United States, an increase of 4.1 per cent over the year 1969 and, \$524 million overseas in the following areas of the world: United Kingdom \$192 million, Other Sterling Areas \$67 million, O.E.C.D. Member Countries in Europe \$200 million, and \$65 million in other countries of the world. Canadian expenditures overseas in 1970 increased by 31.3 per cent.

On balance the Canadian surplus on travel account with the United States stood at \$148 million, and increase of \$80 million over 1969. The Canadian deficit on travel with overseas countries increased in 1970 by \$97 million to reach \$383 million. As a result, the deficit on travel account in 1970 increased to \$235 million, due to the greater number and higher expenditures of Canadians travelling to overseas countries.

Quarterly estimates of both receipts and payments were higher in 1970 than in the previous year. Due to this rise in expenditures the deficit in the first and fourth quarters rose by \$10 million and \$1 million respectively. The second quarter showed an improvement of \$10 million on balance, while the third quarter, which has traditionally shown a surplus, again showed a positive balance, but down by \$16 million compared with 1969. This was the smallest surplus recorded in the third quarter in eight years, at \$89 million.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

The number of United States residents entering Canada in December 1970 decreased by 36,000 persons due mainly to the smaller number of individuals who entered and left Canada by automobile on the same day. The number of persons from the United States travelling by automobile who remained two or more nights in Canada during December 1970 advanced by 14 per cent over 1969. Rail traffic into Canada again decreased for the nineteenth successive month, off by 4,300 persons or 35.7 per cent compared with the same period last year.

Cumulative statistics show that the number of United States residents who entered Canada during 1970 was 37,152,900, an increase of 3.9 per cent over 1969; this compares with an increase of 2.8 per cent increase in 1969 over 1968. The increase in 1970 was mainly accounted for by persons entering Canada by automobile and remaining two or more nights — up 805,300 persons or 10.2 per cent over 1969. Passengers by all modes of transportation from the United States showed increases during 1970 except rail and other travellers (includes local bus, taxi, motorcycle, and commercial truck traffic) which showed relatively minor declines. Automobile traffic accounted for 86.2 per cent of the total number of residents from the United States, while plane traffic accounted for 3.5 per cent, bus traffic 2.8 per cent, rail traffic 0.4 per cent, boat traffic 1.6 per cent, and other travellers 5.5 per cent.

A quarterly review of the volume of travellers from the United States during 1970 reveals that 13.7 per cent arrived in the first quarter or 5,082,600 persons, 24.5 per cent or 9,106,400 persons arrived in the second quarter, 45.4 per cent or 16,885,200 persons arrived in the third quarter, and 16.4 per cent or 6,078,800 persons arrived in the fourth quarter. The first, second, and third quarters of 1970 showed sizeable increases in visitors over 1969, while in the fourth quarter some decline was registered. Percentages show that United States visitors to Canada in 1970 increase by 9.0, 1.6, and 5.1 for the first three quarters of 1970 and remained unchanged during the fourth quarter.

On a provincial basis Quebec registered the largest increase in visitors from the United States, up 571,200 visits over 1969 to total 5,586,900 visits in 1970. In absolute numbers Ontario registered

the most visitors from the United States at 21,763,800 - 58.6 per cent of all United States visitors.

The number of Canadians returning from the United States in December 1970 decreased by 149,000 persons from the same period last year, to amount to 1,966,600 visits, the third successive month that there has been a decline in Canadian visits to the United States. All types of transportation used by returning residents showed declines in December 1970 except bus travel, which increased by 6.3 per cent over December 1969.

Cumulative statistics indicate that the number of Canadian residents returning from the United States in 1970 increased by less than one per cent over 1969 to reach 35,655,900 visits. Canadians remaining two or more nights in the United States increased by 6.3 per cent in 1970 to account for 6,020,900 visits. Total automobile traffic to the United States this year accounted for 86.1 per cent of all travellers compared with 85.4 per cent last year. The largest decline occurred in rail transportation which was down 25.2 per cent on the year. All other forms of travel transportation declined slightly in 1970.

A quarterly review of returning Canadian travellers indicate that 18.6 per cent re-entered Canada during the first quarter, 25.3 per cent in the second, 36.8 per cent in the third, and 19.3 in the fourth. The first and third quarters showed increases of 491,100 and 227,400 persons respectively over 1969, while the second and fourth quarters declined by 278,600 and 225,700 persons respectively over 1969. The first and third quarters increased by 8.0 and 1.8 per cent respectively, while the second and fourth quarters declined by 3.0 and 3.2 per cent respectively.

British Columbia had the largest increase in the number of Canadians returning through ports in the province — up 9.6 per cent or 495,100 persons over 1969. Ontario registered the largest number of returning residents in 1970, at 13,932,900 persons (39 per cent of the total), but this showed a decline of 4.0 per cent from 1969.


TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

In 1970, the number of overseas visitors to Canada totalled 535,500, an increase of 72,300 visits over 1969 — up 15.6 per cent. The number of visitors to Canada from all continents increased, with Europe accounting for 368,200 visitors, 13.0 per cent above 1969.

The United Kingdom continued to account for more tourists to Canada than any other country with 157,700 persons, followed by Germany (West) with 41,300, France with 36,900, The Netherlands with 28,000, and Japan with 22,000. Only four countries of the world showed declines in the number of residents entering Canada versus 1969: Czechoslovakia declined by 1,000 visitors to total 1,400, Poland declined by 200 visitors to total 7,700, U.S.S.R. declined by 300 visitors to total 1,400, and China declined by 66 visitors to total 150.

A quarterly review indicates that each quarter in 1970 showed increased traffic flows of overseas visitors to Canada. During the first quarter of 1970, 53,000 overseas visitors came to Canada, up 33.7 per cent over 1969, while 151,700 visitors came in the second quarter, up 20.0 per cent. In the third and fourth quarters of 1970 the number of visitors also increased, but not as dramatically as in the first two quarters of the year. Statistics indicate that visitors numbered 243,200 and 87,700 in the third and fourth quarters respectively, up 10.9 and 12.7 per cent over the same periods in 1969.

The number of Canadian residents returning directly to Canada from visits to overseas countries was 957,400 persons, an increase of 30.9 per cent over 1969; most Canadians returning from overseas visits arrived by air (97.2 per cent). Most Canadians re-entered the country from overseas visits through the Province of Ontario (403,600 persons) and the Province of Quebec (339,700 persons).
