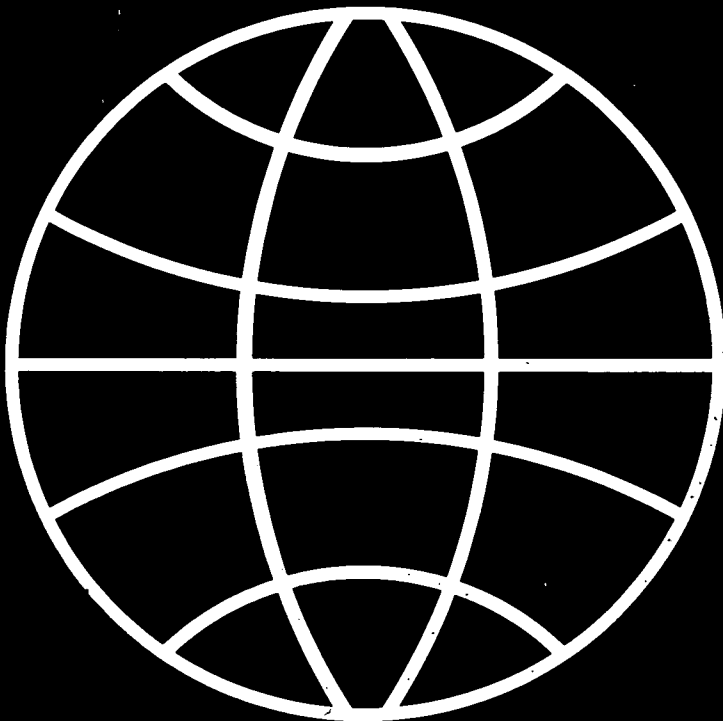

Review of International Travel

During the first two months of 1970 cumulative statistics show that both the number of United States visitors to Canada and Canadian residents returning from trips to the United States were about 8 per cent above the same period in 1969. Overseas visitors entering Canada during January and February 1970 increased by 31 per cent above last year while Canadians returning direct from overseas countries were 60 per cent above the figure registered during the first two months of 1969.

Travel between Canada and the United States

In February, 1970, visitors entering Canada from the United States numbered 1,564,300 while Canadians returning totalled 1,905,700; this represented increases of 5.9 and 2.0 per cent respectively over the same month last year. Because of the decision in the United States to observe certain national holidays on days immediately preceding or following weekends, February contained a long weekend in celebration of "George Washington's birthday". This may have had an impact on the number of travellers remaining one or more nights in Canada during the month of February. Total vehicle crossings between Canada and the United States numbered 1,412,100, an increase of 3.7 per cent above February, 1969. Of this number 645,700 were non-resident vehicles entering Canada and 766,400 were Canadian vehicles returning from trips to the United States, increases of 5.1 and 2.6 per cent respectively.

United States travellers to Canada by automobile, some 1,349,700 travellers, was 6.4 per cent above the same month a year earlier. About 239,600 of these entries remained for one or more nights registering an increase of 14.2 per cent above February, 1969. Short-term travellers numbered 1,110,100, an increase of 4.8 per cent above last year. United States travellers entering Canada by non-automobile transportation totalled 214,600, an increase of 3.2 per cent above February of last year. Plane travellers accounted for about 34 per cent of this total carrying some 72,700 United States travellers to Canada, an increase of 30 per cent above the same month last year.

In February, 1970, about 82 per cent or 1,567,100 of the Canadians returning from the United States re-entered by automobile, 2 per cent above the same month a year earlier. Of these re-entries, 243,500 remained one or more nights in the United States, an increase of 9.8 per cent above the same period last year. Short-term traffic totalled 1,323,600 travellers, an increase of 0.7 per cent above last year. Canadians returning from the United States by non-automobile transportation numbered 338,600, an increase of 1.8 per cent above the same month a year earlier. Plane travel attracted about 24 per cent of this total when some 81,700 Canadians returned by plane, a decrease of 3.7 per cent below February, 1969.

Travel between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors entering Canada during February, 1970, numbered about 15,500, an increase of 38 per cent above the same month last year. The ten leading countries in terms of visitors to Canada during February were the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Japan, Italy, Australia, Greece, The Netherlands, Jamaica, and Switzerland. Commencing this year statistics of overseas visitors entering Canada are published by province of entry. During the month of February 1970, province of entry data shows the following distribution of overseas visitors entering through provincial ports: Atlantic region, 3 per cent; Quebec, 44; Ontario, 37; the Prairie Provinces, 3; and British Columbia, 13 per cent.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in February, 1970, numbered 51,800, an increase of about 38 per cent above the same month last year. The majority of Canadians returned by plane, landing at the major airports of Montreal and Toronto.

Commencing March 1, 1970, Japanese exchange controls will be eased to permit the limit on the automatically approved allowance for tourism to be raised from \$700 to \$1,000 a person for each trip.
