

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Review of International Travel

During the period January - April 1970 cumulative statistics show that the number of United States visitors to Canada increased by 5.4 per cent while Canadian residents returning from trips to the United States were 3.1 per cent above the comparable period for 1969. Overseas visitors entering Canada during the first four months of 1970 increased by 28.4 per cent above the previous year while Canadians returning direct from overseas countries were 55 per cent above the similar period for 1969.

Travel between Canada and the United States

In April 1970, visitors entering Canada from the United States numbered 1,979,500 while Canadian residents returning from the United States totalled 2,483,600, this represents decreases of 3.0 and 8.1 per cent respectively when compared to April 1969. A partial explanation of the decrease in the number of persons travelling in April 1970 is due to the fact that Easter fell in March this year, and as such had an impact on travel patterns when compared with last year.

Total vehicle crossings between Canada and the United States numbered 1,741,900, a decrease of 4.4 per cent above the same month last year. Of this number 788,400 were non-resident vehicles entering Canada and 953,500 were Canadian vehicles returning from trips to the United States, decreases of 2.3 and 6.2 per cent respectively.

United States travellers to Canada by automobile some 1,712,800 persons was 4.3 per cent below April 1969. About 358,500 of these entries remained for one or more nights, a decrease of 6.2 per cent from the previous year. Short-term travellers numbered 1,354,300, a decrease of 3.7 per cent below April 1969. United States travellers entering Canada by non-automobile transportation totalled 266,700 an increase of 6.1 per cent above last year. Plane travellers numbered 86,600 registering an increase of 15.2 per cent from the previous year.

In April 1970, some 2,092,400 Canadian residents returning from the United States re-entered by automobile, a decrease of 8.9 per cent below the same month a year earlier. Of these re-entries 407,800 persons remained for one or more nights in the United States, a decrease of 14.2 per cent from the previous year. Short-term travellers numbered 1,684,600, a decrease of 7.4 per cent below April 1969. Canadian residents returning from the United States by non-automobile transportation totalled 391,200 persons, a decrease of 3.8 per cent when compared with April 1969. Plane travellers numbered 114,900 persons, an increase of 2.1 per cent above the same month last year.

Travel between Canada and Overseas Countries

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in April 1970, numbered 74,300 persons an increase of 31,600 compared to the previous year.

Overseas visitors entering Canada during April 1970, numbered 29,900 an increase of 20.0 per cent above the same month a year earlier. The ten leading overseas countries in terms of visitors to Canada during the period January to April 1970 were the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Japan, Italy, Australia, The Netherlands, Greece, Jamaica and Mexico.

During the month of April 1970 province of entry data shows the following distribution of overseas visitors entering through provincial ports: Atlantic Provinces, 2.1 per cent; Quebec, 40.1; Ontario, 40.4; Prairie Provinces 3.3 and British Columbia 14.1 per cent.
