

## TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER COUNTRIES

JUNE 1970

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### Review of International Travel

Preliminary estimates of travel expenditures for the first six months of 1970 reveal that the deficit position on travel account with all countries remained at the same level as in the first half of 1969, with both receipts and payments rising substantially. (See table 15, page 23). Foreign visitors spent an estimated \$399 million in Canada made up of \$341 million from United States travellers and \$58 million from overseas visitors to register an almost 19 per cent increase over the comparable period for 1969; Canadians made payments of \$672 million in travel expenditures abroad comprised of \$459 million in the United States and \$213 million in overseas countries for an increase of more than 10 per cent. As noted above the net result of these transactions was to leave the deficit balance of \$273 million on travel account between Canada and all countries unchanged from the comparable period in 1969.

Canadian payments to the United States increased modestly by \$5 million while travel expenditures in Canada by United States travellers advanced by \$47 million, narrowing the deficit on travel account between Canada and the United States to \$118 million from \$160 million in the first six months of 1969. Payments to overseas countries by Canadian residents increased faster than receipts from abroad and the total deficit between Canada and overseas countries widened to \$155 million.

On May 31st the Minister of Finance announced the unpegging of the Canadian dollar from its parity of 92.5 U.S. cents. The subsquent revaluation of the Canadian dollar on the foreign exchange market is however unlikely to have had a significant affect on the patterns of travel and expenditures in the period covered by this report. Further easing of exchange controls on travellers allowances by the United Kingdom, France and Japan were announced during the first half of 1970.

### Travel between Canada and the United States

Cumulative statistics show that during the first six months of 1970 the number of United States visitors to Canada increased by 4.2 per cent, while Canadians returning from trips to the United States were 1.4 per cent above the comparable period in 1969.

In June 1970 the number of visitors entering Canada from the United States totalled 4,130,000 while Canadians returning numbered 3,416,100 representing an increase of 3.7 per cent for United States visitors to Canada and a decrease of 3.3 per cent in the number of Canadian residents returning from the United States.

United States travellers to Canada by automobile, some 3,463,600 persons was 1.9 per cent above June 1969. More than one third of these entries remained for one or more nights, an increase of 4.7 per cent above the same month a year earlier; short-term travellers at 2,166,200 persons were little changed from June 1979. United States travellers entering Canada by non-automobile transportation numbered 666,400 an increase of 14.2 per cent above the same month last year. Plane travel accounted for just under one quarter of the non-automobile group. Bus travel showed the largest gains in June increasing by 25 per cent above the same month in 1969.

In June 1970, some 2,926,500 Canadians returning from the United States re-entered by automobile representing a 2.7 per cent decrease from the figure recorded in June 1969; of these, 610,800 had remained in the United States for one or more nights, a decrease of 5.4 per cent when compared with June 1969, and 2,315,700 travellers returned on the same day, a decrease of 2.0 per cent from the same month last year. Canadians returning from the United States by non-automobile transportation numbered 489,700, a decrease of 6.8 per cent from June 1969. Plane travel accounted for about one fifth of the non-automobile travellers, carrying some 97,000 Canadians returning from trips to the United States, a decrease of 12.9 per cent below June 1969.

### Travel between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors entering Canada during the first six months of 1970 increased by some 23 per cent, while Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries were 39 per cent above the comparable period in 1969.

In June 1970, the number of overseas visitors entering Canada totalled 72,200 an increase of 21.7 per cent above June 1969. Province of entry data for June shows the following distribution of overseas visitors entering through provincial ports: Atlantic Provinces, 2.1 per cent; Quebec, 32.0; Ontario, 44.5; the Prairie Provinces, 6.8; and British Columbia, 14.6 per cent.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in June 1970, numbered 66,600 an increase of 3.1 per cent above the same month last year. The majority of Canadians, 95.9 per cent, returned by plane; Montreal and Toronto together accounted for more than half of the total plane re-entries.
