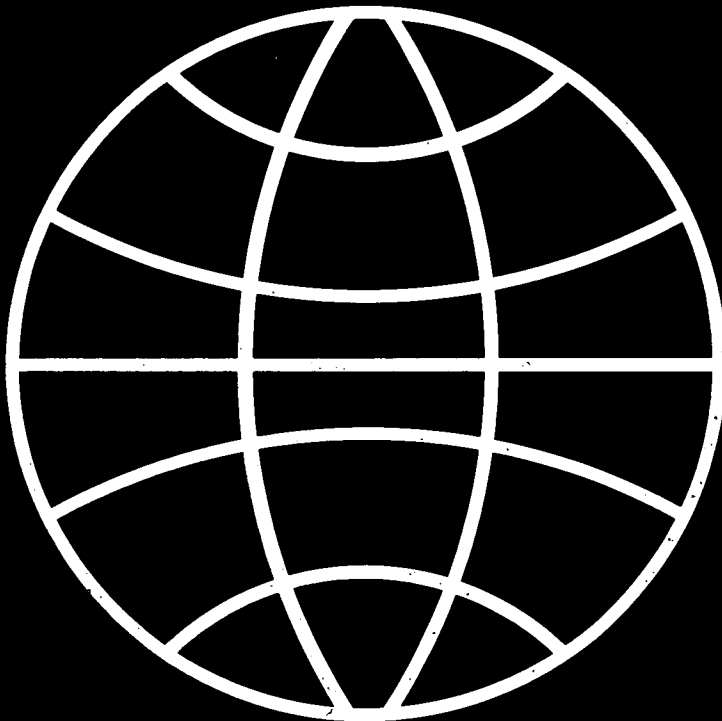

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Review of International Travel

During the first eight months of 1970 cumulative statistics indicate that the number of United States residents who visited Canada increased by 808,900 persons versus 1969 to reach 27,534,000 persons, an increase of 3.0 per cent. Canadian residents returning from the United States increased by 347,900 persons versus 1969 to reach 25,687,700 persons, an increase over 1969 of only 1.4 per cent. A portion of the increase (particularly in U.S. visits to Canada) may be due to the inauguration of "The Prince of Fundy" ferry service between Portland, Maine and Yarmouth, Nova Scotia in June, 1970 as port of entry figures for Nova Scotia show a significant increase during July and August, 1970 over the same months last year.

Overseas residents entering Canada for the period January - August, 1970 increased by 16.9 per cent while Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries increased by 39.4 per cent.

Travel Between Canada and the United States

In the month of August 1970, the number of United States residents entering Canada was 6,765,300; the number of Canadians returning from the United States for the same period totalled 5,024,000. Both figures closely approximated the similar period in 1969.

The number of vehicles entering Canada during the month amounted to 3,798,300, representing a minor decrease of 4,700 vehicles entering the country versus the same period last year. Non-resident vehicles entering Canada accounted for 56.3 per cent (2,138,700 vehicles) of the total, while Canadian vehicles returning to Canada accounted for 43.7 per cent (1,659,600 vehicles) of the total.

United States travellers to Canada by automobile numbering 5,821,000 persons, decreased 1.3 per cent in relationship to August, 1969. Of this total 3,156,900 persons entered and left Canada on the same day, while 2,664,100 persons stayed in Canada for one or more nights. United States travellers entering Canada by transportation other than automobile totalled 944,300 an increase of 5.4 per cent over the same month last year. Plane and bus travellers accounted for 358,300 persons, an increase of 20.4 per cent and 23.7 per cent respectively. Part of the decrease in United States visits to Canada by automobile may be due to the date on which Labour Day was observed. In 1969 Labour Day fell on September 1st, consequently many trips associated with the holiday entered Canada in August, whereas in 1970 with Labour Day falling on September 7th the holiday traffic was recorded in September.

In August 1970, 5,024,000 Canadian residents returned from the United States of which 4,498,800 persons re-entered Canada by automobile. Of those returning by automobile 2,894,200 persons left Canada and returned the same day while 1,604,600 stayed in the United States for one night or more. Canadian residents returning from the United States by non-automobile transportation amounted to 525,200 persons, a decrease of 4.0 per cent for the same period last year.

Travel Between Canada and Overseas Countries

Canadian residents returning directly to Canada from overseas countries in August 1970, numbered 162,502 an increase of 23.5 per cent as compared to the similar month in 1969.

Overseas visitors entering Canada during August 1970, totalled 80,872, an increase of 11.9 per cent as compared to the same period in 1969. Province of entry data for visiting residents of overseas countries show the following distribution: Atlantic Provinces 2.2 per cent, Quebec 34.3 per cent, Ontario 46.4 per cent, Prairie Provinces 4.0 per cent, and British Columbia 13.1 per cent. There has been no significant change in this distribution pattern during 1970. The ten leading nations in terms of overseas visitors to Canada for August 1970, were as follows: The United Kingdom, France, Germany, Japan, The Netherlands, Italy, Australia, Mexico, Jamaica, and Trinidad & Tobago. The Netherlands advanced from seventh to fifth position as the number of visitors from that country to Canada increased by nearly 60 per cent versus the same period last year. Australia, on the other hand, dropped from fifth to seventh position in order of importance as a source of overseas visitors to Canada.
