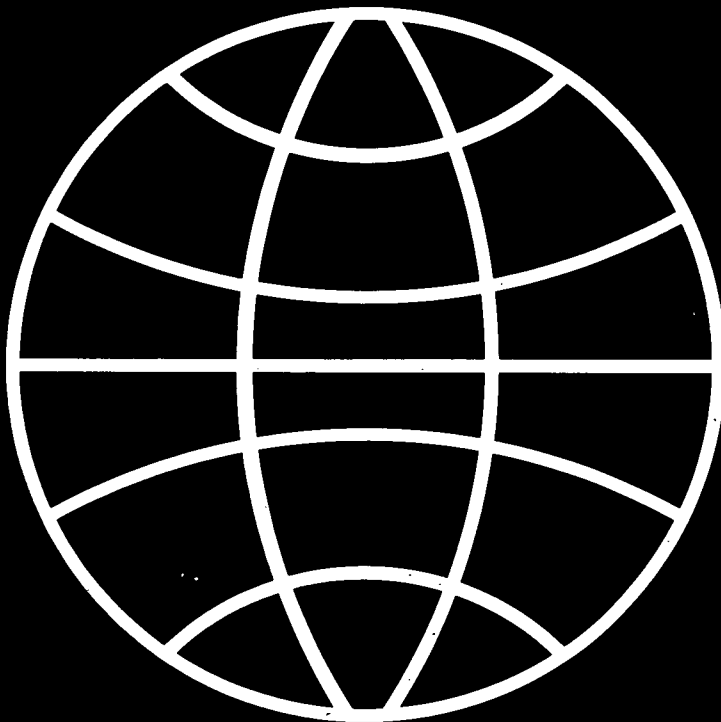
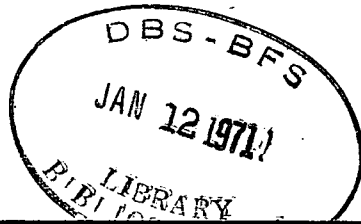

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## Review of International Travel

Estimates of travel expenditures for the first nine months of 1970 indicate Canada continued to record a favourable position on balance with the United States. Canada attained a surplus of \$141 million, up \$84 million over the surplus in the same period in 1969 (+ 147 per cent). Canada's position with overseas countries on travel account has traditionally been unfavourable, and this year is no exception, with a recorded deficit of \$325 million with overseas countries (+ 44 per cent higher than last year). The overall travel account balance with the United States and overseas countries was a deficit of \$184 million.

Canadian payments on travel to the United States during January - September this year at \$783 million show a moderate increase of \$16 million but receipts from United States visitors travelling in Canada have risen by \$100 million to reach \$924 million, up 12 per cent over the similar period of last year. Canadian payments to overseas countries on travel account rose by \$123 million (39 per cent) over the period January - September. Receipts from overseas visitors, on the other hand, advanced at a more moderate rate (25 per cent) to \$116 million as compared with \$93 million in the same period of 1969.

### Travel Between Canada and the United States

Cumulative statistics for the first nine months of 1970 indicate the number of United States visitors to Canada increased by 4.7 per cent, whereas Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States advanced by only 1.6 per cent over the same time period.

In September 1970 the number of United States residents entering Canada totalled 3,540,200, 19.7 per cent higher than the same period last year, while the number of crossings by Canadians returning from the United States reached 3,069,600 or 3.1 per cent higher than last year. A portion of the increase in visitors is attributable to the fact that Labour Day occurred on September 7th, 1970 as compared with September 1st, 1969. The incoming U.S. holiday traffic was largely recorded in September 1970, while in 1969 most of the visitor traffic for the Labour Day holiday was recorded on August 30-31.

United States residents numbering 3,052,500 entered Canada mainly by automobile, and the majority of these returned to the United States on the same day. Visitors entering by non-automobile means of transportation numbered 487,800 or 13.8 per cent of all U.S. visitors to Canada. Bus travel increased by 85.8 per cent in September 1970 to 107,700 visits, accounting for 22 per cent of all U.S. non-automobile traffic to Canada.

During the month some 2,660,500 Canadians returned from the United States by automobile, up 4.8 per cent over September 1969. Those returning by automobile after an absence of two or more nights increased by 85,100 to a total of 605,200 visits. Re-entries by non-automobile transportation amounted to 409,100 a decrease of 30,300 visits or 6.9 per cent compared to the same period of last year. Plane travel accounted for approximately 25 per cent of all non-automobile traffic or 98,800 visits, down 9.2 per cent from September 1969.

### Travel Between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors to Canada for the period January - September 1970 increased by 16.2 per cent, while Canadian residents visiting overseas countries increased by 38.4 per cent over the same time period of 1969.

In the month of September 1970 there were 57,300 entries to Canada by overseas visitors, an increase of 11.6 per cent over last year. Data for September 1970 shows the following percentage distribution of overseas visitors by province of entry: Atlantic Provinces 1.9, Quebec 35.8, Ontario 49.3, Western Provinces 2.9, British Columbia and Yukon Territory 10.1 per cent. A distribution of overseas visitors to Canada for the month of September 1970 by continent of origin discloses the following: Europe 65.9 per cent, Asia 11.8, North America and Caribbean 11.0, Oceania 4.8, South America 4.5, and Africa 2.0 per cent.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in September 1970 numbered 121,800, an increase of 32.8 per cent above September 1969. Re-entries of Canadians returning from overseas was heaviest at Montreal International Airport, accounting for between 44 and 45 per cent of the total for Canada. Cumulative data for the period of January - September show a total of 823,800 re-entries direct from overseas versus 595,400 in 1969, an increase of 228,400 or some 38 per cent.
