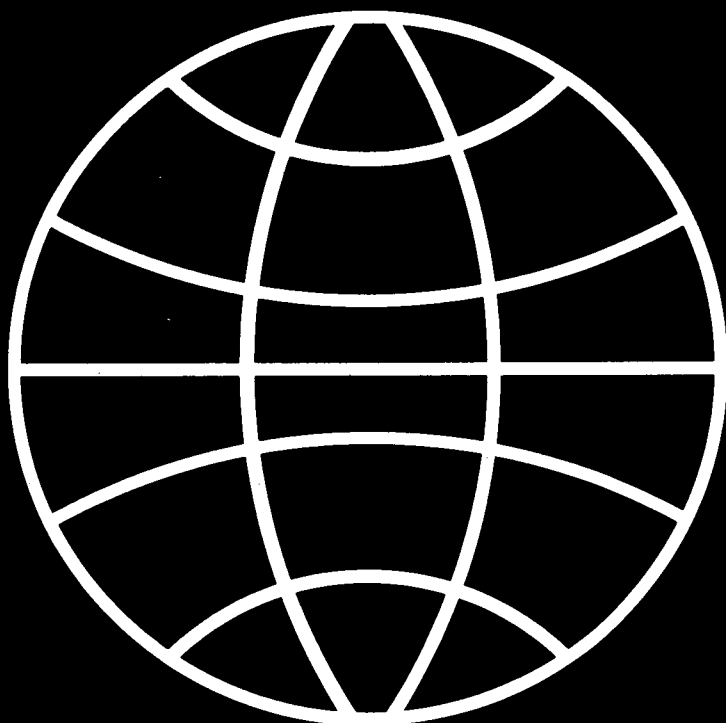
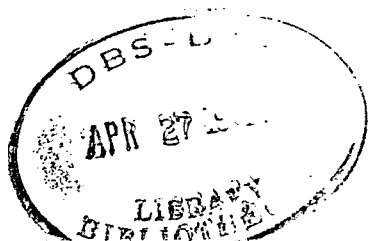

Review of International Travel

During the first month of 1971 there was a downward trend in travel between the United States and Canada compared with January of the previous year. This may have been partially due to the present slackness in the economies of both the United States and Canada, and the severe winter conditions experienced in Canada.

The overseas section of international travel however, remained buoyant as the number of Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries increased in January 1971, while overseas visitors to Canada increased nominally.

Travel Between Canada and the United States

United States residents entering Canada in 1971 number 1,555,700 a decline of 6,000 over the previous year. Of this amount 1,345,800 visitors entered Canada by automobile, and 82.8 per cent of these entered and left Canada on the same day. Non-automobile traffic decreased by 4.5 per cent in relation to 1970. The largest decrease occurred in rail traffic, off 35.3 per cent from January 1970 due mainly to the ceasing of operations of the Penn-Central Railway in Canada.

Canadian residents returning from the United States in January 1971 totalled 1,931,500 a decrease of 63,600 persons in relation to the same period in 1970. All types of transportation used by returning Canadian residents decreased except bus which increased by 5.7 per cent in 1971.

Travel Between Canada and Overseas Countries

Overseas visitors to Canada in 1971 number 15,000 an increase of 1.8 per cent above the same period in 1970. Visitors from Japan accounted for most of the increase, numbering 824, up 214 visitors versus January 1970 (35.1 per cent). The majority of overseas visitors entered Canada through the provinces of Quebec and Ontario; totalling 42.1 per cent and 37.3 per cent respectively of all visitors.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in January 1971 amounted to 83,500 persons, an increase of 4.9 per cent over 1970. Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa International airports all recorded significant increases in the volume of returning residents from overseas.

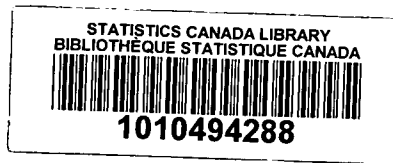
