# TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER COUNTRIES

OCTOBER 1971

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#### REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

For the period January — October, 1971 visitors to Canada from all countries of the world increased by 3.2 per cent, resulting in an increase in total tourism receipts over last year for Canada.

Also for the same period, the number of Canadians travelling to other countries decreased from last year — down 3.9 per cent. This decline occurred as less Canadians travelled by automobile to the United States and returned the same day. This has resulted in a small decline in tourism expenditures by Canadians from last year. This is the first year since 1967 that Canada has recorded a decline in the number of residents returning from visits to other countries (in 1967 the World Exposition, held in Montreal, kept many Canadians from planning trips to other countries).

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

The number of United States visitors entering Canada in October totalled 2,751,832 an increase of 10.1 per cent from 1970. All modes of transportation used by these visitors recorded large increases, except rail transportation. The province of Ontario recorded the largest increase in absolute number of visitors for the month from the United States (up 186,206 persons), while the province of Manitoba obtained the largest percentage increase (up 17.6 per cent).

The number of Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States declined marginally in October, as the same day automobile traffic category accounted for 90.6 per cent of the decline. The number of Canadians now returning by rail from visits to the United States is extremely small, as most railway companies have discontinued international passenger service to Canada.

For the period January — October 1971 the number of United States visitors to Canada was 34,651,260, an improvement of 3.2 per cent from the same time period in 1970. United States residents who entered Canada by automobile and remained here for one or more nights showed the largest increase — up 645,262 visitors from 1970. Canadian visitors for the same period numbered 30,215,940 a decrease of 4.2 per cent from 1970.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Visitors from overseas countries to Canada in October 1971 increased by 8.3 per cent from the same period in 1970. Italy, the United Kingdom, and Japan all recorded increased visitors coming to Canada during the month of October.

Canada received 488,068 visitors from overseas countries, an increase of 3,228 visitors for the ten month period to date. West Germany accounted for 42,278 visitors, an increase of 11.2 per cent from last year. Japan and Poland also showed increases in the number of visitors to Canada, up 3,383 and 1,109 respectively.

The statistics on Canadians returning from visits to overseas countries in 1971 reveal a trend for more Canadians to take trips overseas. A record 945,245 Canadian residents returned direct from overseas visits so far this year. Most of these Canadians returned to Canada through Toronto and Montreal International airports.
