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PRELIMINARY ESTIMATES OF RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES, 1971

Preliminary estimates for the year 1971, reveal that Canada recorded a deficit in its travel account with all countries. Estimates show that in 1971 Canada earned \$1,296 million from international travel while at the same time spending \$1,497 million abroad. These figures include transportation costs paid to Canadian carriers by non-residents visiting Canada, as well as fares paid to foreign carriers by residents of Canada.

United States resident spending in Canada was estimated at \$1,147 million as compared to \$1,082 million last year. Overseas visitor spending in Canada was recorded at \$149 million, no significant change in relative terms from a year earlier.

Canadian resident spending in all countries totalled \$1,497 million, an increase of 2.5 per cent from a year earlier. Of this total, Canadian residents spent \$930 million in the United States, a slight decrease from last year. Canadian resident spending in overseas countries was recorded at \$567 million, an 8.2 per cent increase from last year. An area disaggregation of expenditures shows that Canadians spent \$173 million in the United Kingdom, other Sterling areas \$72 million, other OECD Europe \$244 million, and other countries \$78 million.

Canada recorded an overall deficit of \$201 million in its travel account balance with all countries. This compares to a \$226 million deficit recorded last year. Canada which traditionally records a surplus in its travel account with the U.S. recorded a surplus of \$217 million this year as compared to \$146 million last year. In its travel account balance with overseas countries Canada recorded a deficit of \$418 million, a 12.4 per cent increase from a year earlier. This year's deficit in Canada's overseas travel account is no exception as travel payments, especially since 1967 have been accelerating at a faster rate than receipts.

Reviewing Canada's receipts and payments on a proportional basis, in 1968 the United States accounted for 90 per cent of our receipts while the overseas countries accounted for the remainder. In 1971 this relationship did not change significantly, the proportions being 88 per cent and 12 per cent respectively. Total payments, however, have changed noticably. In 1968, total payments to the United States accounted for 70 per cent of aggregate payments while overseas spending constituted the remainder. In 1971 these proportions had changed significantly to 62 per cent, and 38 per cent respectively. This latter proportion further revealing Canada's deteriorating travel balance with overseas countries.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

In December 1971, 1,839,300 United States residents entered Canada, a 9.0 per cent increase from last year. This year's increase is primarily attributable to a 134,000 absolute increase in the automobile category and more specifically in same day entries where 92,000 more visitors were recorded.

In the non-automobile category United States visitors by plane and bus increased 15.1 per cent and 19.8 per cent respectively. Rail traffic continued to decline as only 2,300 rail entries were recorded during the month.

Cumulative statistics for the year 1971 reveal that 38,449,000 United States residents entered Canada, a 3.5 per cent increase from the previous year.

United States visitors by automobile increased by 1,223,000 this year and constituted 94.4 per cent of the years aggregate increase. Further disaggregation shows that 650,000 of this increase was attributable to United States visitors remaining two or more nights in Canada.

In the non-automobile category the most notable increase occurred in the bus category as 148,000 more visitors were recorded, a 13.9 per cent increase from last year. Rail traffic decreased absolutely by 76,000 (55.0 per cent) entries from last year. The aggregate changes in the bus and rail categories are the consequence of two factors. First, an administrative change in the method of data collection at the ports occurred in May 1971 and secondly, a closure of rail services through the ports of Lacolle, Quebec, Sarnia, Ontario, Emerson, Manitoba and White Rock, B.C. due to lack of demand for such service.

Disaggregation by province of entry reveals that the majority of United States visitors to Canada entered in Ontario, followed by Quebec, New Brunswick and British Columbia and accounting for 59.0, 14.6, 11.3 and 9.6 per cent of aggregate entries respectively. Ontario recorded the largest increase in absolute terms, 933,300 entries. British Columbia recorded 147,600 more visitors this year

than last year. In both cases an added emphasis on travel to the respective province was stressed, especially in British Columbia where that province celebrated its centennial.

Canadian residents returning from the United States in December numbered 1,975,200, no significant change from last year. Residents returning by automobile and remaining one or more nights increased by 32,000 re-entries from the previous year. This increase, however, was offset by a decrease of 37,000 re-entries in short-term automobile traffic. In the non-automobile category the most notable change occurred in plane traffic as 12,500 more re-entries were recorded.

Aggregate statistics for 1971 show that 34,259,000 Canadians returned from visits to the United States, a 3.9 per cent decrease from last year. This deceleration in aggregate Canada reentries from the United States results entirely from a decrease in same day automobile traffic to the United States. The decrease in this particular flow of traffic results partly from adverse weather conditions which prevailed during the earlier part of 1971.

Canadian residents returning by automobile accounted for 85.6 per cent of all re-entries, a proportion not significantly changed from last year.

In the non-automobile categories, plane recorded 67,000 (5.6 per cent) more re-entries this year, bus re-entries increased 7.6 per cent, whereas Canadian residents re-entering by rail decreased 68.3 per cent.

A provincial breakdown of returning residents reveals that 13,610,000 Canadians re-entered in Ontario, 8,122,000 in Quebec, 5,685,000 in New Brunswick and 4,959,000 in British Columbia and represent 39.7, 23.7, 16.6 and 14.5 per cent respectively.

Further examination reveals that in each of the mentioned provinces automobile accounted for approximately 90.0 per cent of total province re-entries, with the exception of Ontario which accounted for 80.0 per cent of that provinces aggregate re-entries.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Cumulative statistics for 1971 show that 543,200 overseas residents visited Canada, a 1.4 per cent increase from the previous year.


An area breakdown shows that the United Kingdom accounted for 150,300 visitors, followed by Germany 45,800, France 37,200, The Netherlands 29,100 and Japan 25,900 in that order. These relationships are similar to those in 1970.

Increases were recorded in the number of overseas visitors from Germany, Japan, Taiwan, Poland and Hong Kong in that order. The most pronounced decrease occurred in overseas visitors from the United Kingdom as 7,500 fewer entries were recorded this year.

In general it appears that the lowering of currency restrictions and expansion of travel allowances by many countries have not significantly altered the pattern of overseas resident visits to Canada.

Canadian residents returning directly from visits to overseas countries numbered 1,039,200, an 8.5 per cent increase from last year. The largest number of returning residents re-entered in Ontario and accounted for 46.9 per cent of total re-entries followed by Quebec, 342,000 (32.9 per cent) re-entries. The majority of Canadians re-entered by air and accounted for 98.7 per cent of aggregate re-entries.

In summation, lower air passenger charter rates and attractive tour packages continue to lure Canadian residents overseas. As well, the expansion in Canadian resident travel overseas continued despite world currency re-alignments earlier in the summer.
