

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#### REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

The pattern established in January for travel between Canada and the United States continued into February with declines recorded for both Canadians returning from the United States and United States residents entering Canada. For the two month period compared with the same period in 1970, the declines were 4.6 per cent and 3.1 per cent respectively. Canadian residents returning from overseas visits rose appreciably in the first two months of 1971 over last year, while overseas visitors to Canada were at about the same level as in 1970.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

Cumulative statistics indicate that the number of United States residents who entered Canada by all modes of transportation decreased by 96,700 visits in 1971. This may have been partially attributable to the severe weather conditions experienced in Canada this year and also to the general slackness in the United States economy during 1971.

For the month of February 1971 automobile traffic which fell by 85,000 visits (6.3 per cent) from the same period in 1970, was mainly accounted for by less persons entering and leaving Canada on the same day. Non-automobile traffic decreased by 5,700 visits (2.6 per cent) from February 1970 due to a decrease in plane traffic (8.0 per cent), and other travellers (2.1 per cent). The largest decrease in total United States travellers to Canada occurred in the province of Ontario, which recorded a decline of 101,000 visits from February 1970.

The number of visits by residents of Canada returning from the United States totalled 3,722,000 a decrease of 4.6 per cent from the period January — February 1970. The decline in traffic returning was widely distributed through the provinces of New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and British Columbia, but was particularly pronounced in B.C.

The total number of Canadian residents who returned from trips to the United States in February 1971 amounted to 1,790,500, a decrease of 6.0 per cent from February 1970. Automobile traffic declined 102,400 (6.5 per cent) from February 1970 while non-automobile traffic decreased 12,800 (3.8 per cent). Plane traffic was the only mode of transportation which showed an increase for the month, up 10,600 visits from February 1970 due mainly to an increase in the number of Canadian residents returning from the United States and landing at Toronto International Airport.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Foreign travellers from overseas countries to Canada for the period January — February 1971 total 30,064 persons, while for the same period in 1970 the number totalled 30,242; a minor decline this year. The five leading countries in terms of the numbers of residents visiting Canada in 1971 were the United Kingdom (6,041), France (2,317), Germany (2,054), Japan (1,904) and Italy (1,308). The numbers of foreign travellers are essentially those persons remaining in Canada for a visit lasting longer than 24 hours.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas visits for the first two months of the year 1971 totalled 139,200, up 6.0 per cent from the same period last year. For the month of February 1971 traffic showed increases at Ottawa, Toronto and Vancouver International airports. Canadian residents returning from overseas countries by sea declined substantially from February 1970.
