REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

The volume of international travel between the United States and Canada has declined in the first quarter of 1971. This reduction in traffic may partially result from the Easter holiday period which shall be celebrated during the month of April this year, while this same holiday period occurred during the month of March last year. Also the severe winter weather conditions experienced in Canada this year forced the closing of roads for extended periods of time, especially in the Province of Quebec. Finally the adjustment of the Canadian dollar on the foreign exchange markets to approach parity in terms of United States currency during the first quarter of 1971 may have altered travelling patterns to some extent.

The volume of international travel between Canada and overseas countries continued to increase in the first quarter of 1971. Canadian residents returning direct from overseas increased by 24,300 this quarter, up 12.1 per cent this year versus an increase of 49.1 per cent in 1970 over the first quarter 1969. Overseas visitors to Canada increased in January 1971, but declined in the months of February and March 1971.

Consequently preliminary estimates of travel expenditures between Canada and other countries (see Table 15) indicate that Canada reduced its deficit on travel account by \$3 million. Foreign visitors spent an estimated \$113 million in Canada in the first quarter of 1971, an increase of \$4 million over 1970. Receipts from United States residents increased by \$8 million to total \$100 million, even though the number of United States residents visiting Canada in the first quarter of 1971 decreased from last year. Receipts from residents of overseas countries totalled \$13 million, a decrease of 23.5 per cent from 1970 due mainly to less overseas visitors entering Canada in 1971. Canadians made payments of \$213 million in the United States this year, a decrease of \$4 million from 1970, and an estimated \$101 million in overseas countries, an increase of \$5 million over 1970.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

The number of Canadian residents returning from the United States has declined by 9.9 per cent from the period January-March 1970, to total 5,961,700 visits. The number of United States residents entering Canada totalled 4,780,300, a reduction of 5.9 per cent compared with statistics for the first quarter of 1970. All Canadian provinces shared in this decrease of traffic.

For the month of March 1971 residents of the United States entering Canada numbered 1,751,000 a decrease of 10.5 per cent from March 1970. United States residents using bus transportation to enter Canada increased by 22.4 per cent over March 1970 to total 54,900. <u>Most</u> other forms of transportation recorded declines in the number of persons entering Canada compared with the same period last year.

The number of Canadian residents returning from the United States in March 1971 totalled 2,239,700, a decrease of 474,400 persons (17.5 per cent) from March 1970. All forms of automobile traffic decreased in March 1971. Plane and bus traffic recorded increased volumes of traffic, up 6.3 and 3.3 per cent respectively for the month. All provinces in Canada recorded smaller numbers of Canadians returning from the United States in March 1971.

The total volume of vehicles crossing at the Canadian border in March numbered 1,571,300, a decrease of 12.7 per cent from March 1970. Both Canadian and American vehicles showed declines for the month.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas visitors to Canada during the first quarter of 1971 numbered 50,100, a decrease of 5.5 per cent from the same period in 1970. Visiting residents of all continents of the world, except Asia shared in the decrease this quarter over last year. Europe accounted for 84.0 per cent of the decrease. The Azores, France, Greece, Italy, Spain, Switzerland and the United Kingdom all recorded less persons visiting our country. In Asia, Japan recorded 3,200 visitors to Canada, an increase of 12.6 per cent from the first quarter of 1970. The month of March 1971 accounted for 93.9 per cent of the decrease in the quarter, down by 2,700 visitors. Province of entry data for overseas visitors for the month of March 1971 shows the following percentage distribution: Atlantic Province 3.1, Quebec 39.8, Ontario 38.5, Manitoba and Saskatchewan 1.3, Alberta 2.3 and British Columbia 15.0

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries numbered 226,000 in the first quarter of 1971, an increase of 12.1 per cent above the same period in 1970. The provinces of Ontario and Manitoba accounted for the increase in Canadian residents returning direct from overseas. Ottawa, Toronto and Winnipeg International Airports all recorded increases in the numbers of returning residents.
