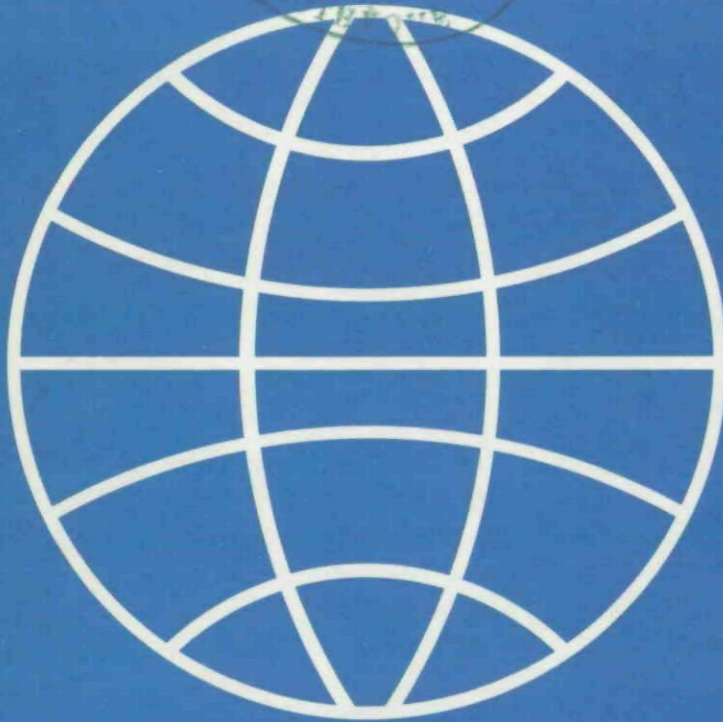

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## REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Cumulative totals for the January-April 1971 period, show that close to 7 million United States visitors entered Canada. This total represents a decrease of 76 thousand (1.1 %), when compared to January-April 1970.

Canadian visitors returning from the United States in April 1971 show an increase of 10.9 % over last year. The increase this year is in part explained by the Easter holiday falling in April as opposed to March in 1970. However, cumulative totals, for the period January-April, show a 4.2 % decrease from the same interval last year. In absolute numbers this decline represents over 381 thousand re-entries. This decline in the first four months of the year was primarily due to a reduction in Canadian resident vehicles crossing the border, the consequence of adverse weather conditions, that prevailed at the time. This loss was especially evident in the month of March, when 93,000 fewer same-day Canadian vehicles returned to Canada, than for the same time period in 1970.

Aggregate totals for overseas residents visiting Canada for the January-April 1971 period, show a decrease of 6.8 % as compared to 1970 data. Statistics for Canadian residents returning from overseas show an increase of 7.4 % over last year.

### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

In April 1971, visitors entering Canada from the United States numbered 2,205,900. This total represents an increase of 11.4 % over the 1970 figure. Canadian residents returning from the United States numbered 2,755,300 persons, resulting in an increase of 10.9 % over last year.

During the month of April United States automobile traffic increased 208,000 (12.2 %). This increase was mainly the result of United States travellers staying in Canada two or more nights. This alone accounted for an increase of 101,900 (40.2 %) over the April 1970 total. Most significant in non-automobile traffic was bus travel. In April 1971 an increase of 19,900 (39.6 %) resulted when compared to April 1970.

The number of Canadian residents returning from the United States also increased considerably. April showed an increase of 271,700 (10.9 %) over last year. Of this total, automobile traffic, where the resident spent two or more nights in the United States, resulted in the biggest gain in both relative and absolute terms.

Canadian non-automobile traffic increased by 27,300 (7.0 %) as compared to April 1970. This increase was primarily the result of an increase in plane traffic (15.1 %), and bus traffic (33.1 %). A portion of this gain however, was offset by a 36.6 % decrease in boat traffic, which was basically the result of adverse weather conditions affecting port openings.

### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas visitors to Canada for the period January-April 1971 numbered 77,260. This represents a decrease of 6.8 % when compared with 1970 statistics. Visiting residents from all regions, except Asia, shared in this decrease. The most pronounced decrease occurred in visitors from Europe, which alone accounted for 96 % of the total decrease.

When disaggregated it was found, that the greatest decreases occurred in visitors from the Azores, United Kingdom, The Netherlands, Greece and Italy in that order. Of the total visitors from Asia, 4,785 visitors from Japan were recorded. This resulted in an increase of 8.4 % over last year; and 34.8 % of that region's increase in cumulative totals for 1971.

The month of April accounted for 48.4 % of the decrease in overseas visitors to date in 1971. Province of entry data show the majority of overseas visitors entered Canada in either Ontario or Quebec. The two provinces accounted for 79.7 % of overseas visitors for April.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries numbered 296,300 for the period January-April 1971. This represented a 7.4 % increase above the same interval in 1970. In absolute numbers, Ontario and British Columbia accounted for the majority of this increase.

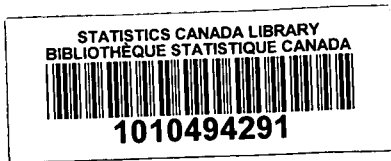
